PUBLIC HEARINGS:

- A) Continuation of the public hearing **for decision only** to consider adopting a **Resolution** ordering certain sewer improvements and creating **Utility Local Improvement District #9** in the Manchester area of South Kitsap, Commissioner Dist #2. **Fiscal Impact:** \$1,180,222 – ULID Assessments. **Staff Contact:** Stella Vakarc, 337-3660.

Chair Garrido states at the public hearing on held June 22, 2009, the Board heard from individuals who lived within the Manchester area where the limited improvement district #9 was proposed. She said the Board also heard from neighbors outside of the area, some were supportive of extending the sewer and others had some serious concerns. After the public hearing, she said the Board requested additional information from staff to better understand what property owners had been told during the signature gathering, how the specific boundaries had been determined and specifically who in the ULID area had signed the petition. The public record was left open for additional written comments through the close of business on June 29, 2009 in which 24 comments were received via letter or email. She said most residents were troubled about the cost, about the logical boundaries and about individuals who had made improvements to their septic systems in which the county could not afford to offset their cost. Chair Garrido noted that there was support from the Kitsap County Health District stating it believed that public sewer is the best long-term option for sewage disposal in the Manchester community, based on their experiences protecting the public from pathogens. She said they specifically cited soils and topographical features in this area as well as the location and the age of most of the septic systems. She said the Manchester Community Council Sewer Committee listed some support on recommendations in the Manchester Community Plan that encouraged expansion of sewer within the Manchester

Village boundary. After reviewing the file and hearing the concerns of citizens, she noted several technical issues with the process, in particular state law requiring a minimum of 51% of citizens in the affected area must agree to participate. She also noticed there seemed to be confused communications about whether each owner would pay per parcel or per lot and whether both spouses needed to sign as opposed to only one. She believes the Board should rescind Resolution 243-2008 adopted in December and the Certification of Sufficiency therein.

A **motion** is made by Chair Garrido and seconded by Commissioner Brown that the Board **rescinds** Resolution No. 243-2008 and the Certification of Sufficiency as adopted in December of 2008 and **denies** the proposed resolution ordering certain sewer improvements and creating Utility Local Improvement District #9 in the Manchester area of South Kitsap, Commissioner Dist #2. Motion carries.

- B)** Public hearing to consider the **Ordinance** extending the moratorium imposing a 180-day moratorium on the acceptance of new applications for certain permits in rural zones for buildings connected to onsite sewage systems designed to serve more than six dwelling units. **Staff Contact:** Katrina Knutson, 337-7181.

Discussion is held, comments called for and hearing no objection, a **motion** is made by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Chair Garrido that the Board enacts **Ordinance No. 429-2009**** extending the moratorium imposing a 180-day moratorium on the acceptance of new applications for certain permits in rural zones for buildings connected to onsite sewage systems designed to serve more than six dwelling units. Motion carries.

- C)** Public hearing to consider the **Ordinance** extending the Moratorium on the Rural Wooded Incentive Program. **Staff Contact:** Katrina Knutson, 337-7181.

Discussion is held, comments called for and hearing no objection, a **motion** is made by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Chair Garrido that the Board enacts **Ordinance No. 430-2009*** extending the Moratorium on the Rural Wooded Incentive Program. Motion carries.

- D)** Closed Record hearing to consider an **Appeal** filed by **Ron Templeton/Bill Broughton** on behalf of **Annette and Terry Weaver** of the Hearing Examiner's decision to deny the Conditional Use Permit application (**Montessori Farmhouse School**) to operate a Montessori school and day-care center. The proposed project is located in South Kitsap Commissioner District #2. **Staff Contact:** Meg Sands, 337-3375.

Meg Sands, Department of Community Development, gave a brief overview of the project stating the applicants applied for a Conditional Use Permit to legalize an existing school and later amended the application to include a day care center for a maximum of 40 children. She said the project is located on the east side of

Bethel/Burley Road, west of State Hwy 16, south of Oak Street and north of Pine. She said the application was before the Hearing Examiner in February of 2009 where staff recommended approval subject to 25 conditions. She said the Hearing Examiner issued a decision denying the project based on issues of compatibility. She said the applicants, Weavers, appealed the decision. Sands said as she understands, the attorneys representing the applicants submitted a brief but neither Community Development nor the Commissioners staff had received it. She said there was an effort on behalf of the applicants to mediate but parties did not want to move forward in that direction.

Chair Garrido explains the guidelines for the closed record appeal process.

Ron Templeton, Attorney representing the applicants, said they have invested their life savings on this project and have put a lot of effort into this amazing program. He said he could not believe that the county has come to the stage in its zoning ordinance that it would deny a Conditional Use Permit for a school based in part on the impact of the sound and noise generated by the laughter and screaming of children at play. He believes the Hearing Examiner based the decision on his own personal opinions and the decision is clearly erroneous and in large part arbitrary and capricious.

Bill Broughton, Attorney also representing the applicants, said on a visit to the site, he noticed there were only two other residences that could be seen from the school and one of those the neighbors garage faces the school. He said this is a very heavily wooded area and the back half of the property is in its natural state with substantial screening. Broughton said there was no expert testimony regarding decibel levels of children laughter, there was no evidence about significant traffic impacts and there was no evidence in the SEPA Determination about any problems with the environmentally sensitive areas. He said the SEPA Determination was not appealed. Relative to disturbance of the wetlands, Broughton said the Examiner's finding that children would stray off the wetland trail during interpretative outings to the wetland features on the property was factually untenable. He said Kitsap County's environmental regulations specifically permit trails such as the one located on the property. As noted in the staff report, Broughton said the existing trail is developed and meets the criteria for approval per Kitsap County Code (see Exhibit 80 page 7). Relative to the Hearing Examiner's finding that the sound of children at play will have a material adverse impact on neighboring property was untenable, not supported by the record, clearly erroneous and was arbitrary and capricious. Broughton said aside from the fact that most humans find the sound of children laughing and playing enjoyable rather than detrimental, the children are inside the school the majority of the time they are on site and it was only during recess periods that children were outside playing. Relative to traffic impacts, Broughton said they were either not supported by evidence in the record or were contrary to the record and clearly erroneous. He said the Hearing Examiner totally ignored the evidence submitted by both the appellant's traffic engineer and Kitsap County Public

Works engineer regarding traffic, the road approach and road activity. He said the record reflected that the school has staggered arrival and departure times for drop off and pick up the children. He said this procedure avoids congestion and traffic back up when children were being dropped off or picked up. In conclusion, Broughton said because of concerns expressed by the neighbors, the appellant has agreed to spend considerable sums of money to alleviate neighborhood concerns. He said improvements include construction of a 5-foot chain link fence erected between the school property and the neighbor to the west, as well as the planting of a tree buffer around the play yard. He said the appellant is willing to agree to reduce the number of students from the original proposed maximum of 40 to 34 to further lessen any potential impact on the neighbors.

Discussion is held regarding moderate traffic increase to the area and the number of Montessori Schools in unincorporated Kitsap County.

A **motion** is made by Chair Garrido and seconded by Commissioner Brown that the Board continues this matter to July 27, 2009; for decision only. Motion carries.

3. Randy Peterson said he lives next door to the Montessori School. (Nancy Grennan explained to Mr. Peterson that the Board could not receive comments at this time due to this being a closed record appeal and the decision had not yet been rendered.)
4. Vivian Henderson thanks the Board for approving Agenda item 9.A.
5. Bart Lovely said he supports ULID #9 moving forward and questions the difference between ULID #8 and ULID #9.
6. Jackie Frisch addresses the Board with concerns about ULID #9.
