Karen;

Here is some new info on law enforcement folks wanting to use/shoot at Kitsap Rifle & Revolver Club range. Some of this may have come from the insurance carrier, too. There have been many complaints of people (not cops) using the range who are not members; that is people who have gotten the gate combination from someone else, and so on. At the first of the year they decided to a "safety briefing" (where to shoot, where not to shoot, what type of targets to use, etc.) for ALL members and at same time take a digital picture of each member and issue a laminated badge card w/ clip to wear when at the range. At the last meeting I asked about law enforcement, who had been welcome in the past. They will still be welcome, but will have to have the "safety briefing", will be pictured and issued a badge w/ their name & personnel # on it. They have already done it for several BPD guys. Some one should be there most days (Mon - Fri) that can give the briefing; probably Marc Carter. After that they will be given the gate combination and can use the facility at will. Usually, on Tuesday evenings there is open combat type shooting and a briefing can probably be gotten then, also. We probably have 5 to 10 people in the department who like to use the facility who are not members; they need to get this info, and anyone else who would like to shoot there. Any questions, get ahold of me.

I met with the club officers about their plans to develop an outdoor shooting sports park. Present were:

Marc Carter, Executive Officer
Brad Smith, President
Earl Jull, VP

Karen Demerick, KCSO

Their plans are summarized below. They have great interest in partnering the the are LE agencies. Part of their long-term plan is to set aside an area for LE only use for range training. Ideas also include allowing area agencies to construct buildings for use in tactical firearms training, such as what is available at Ft. Lewis in Regensburg Training Area; a training classroom; storage of supplies/equipment; etc.

They are interested in exploring win-wins for the county, other LE and their organization.

They are putting together a powerpoint presentation that they hope to have done by late-April. Their plans are then to begin marketing their idea and plans. Most of their initial funding will be done through teh IAC program at DNR. IAC funds are obtained through grants. Three dollars of every Concealed Pistol License goes into this fund, which is set aside for the development of shooting facilities around the state through the grant process. KRRC has already sent a letter of intent to apply for grant monies to cover most of their project.

I have cut the following information from their website.

KRRC's Challenge and Opportunity

KRRC's range is located on land leased since 1926 from the Washington Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The Legislature mandates that the Commissioner of Public Lands obtain income reflecting the "best and highest use" of School Trust and other public lands managed by DNR.

KRRC's current lease expired early in 2001. DNR has offered to extend the lease, but at a cost that more nearly reflects what they calculate as market value, which will be a 600% increase, phased in over five years. Clearly, to remain in business, the Club must find some means of financing a dramatically higher lease, either through significantly increased dues or other means.

KRRC Board Members have held exploratory meeting with DNR and the Commissioner, during which DNR expressed an interest in a counter proposal that would provide both DNR and KRRC the potential for additional revenue by developing area around the range for shooting and other outdoor sports. The current vision is that KRRC would develop and manage the facility. The advantage to the Club is not only increased revenue, but also the opportunity to expand the range into a world class facility.

The proposal is subject to approval by both club members and DNR prior to proceeding.

The Plan

The first phase of development, with a target completion by December 2004, will include the following:

Re-orient rifle range to North-South axis and extend the range to 300 yd

Construct second rifle range line

Expand to pistol range to 5 lines

Establish a Limited Liability Company (LLC) or Corporation

Construct IPSC/Law enforcement pistol range bays

Install manufactured building as a "club house"

Establish a concession

Establish a training center

Hire full-time Range Officer/"Park Ranger" and trainer

Negotiate law enforcement training contracts _____

At this time, there was no discussion of costs to the county for this project. They just wanted to talk with us about what our needs would be if the county wanted to be a part of this project. Karen and I told them what our current needs were (based on what we do at the BPD range) and what I saw as the future in firearms training in LE.

I am sure KRRC will be contacting Sheriff Boyer and others in county and state government as this progresses. They will also meet with BPD, PPD, POPD and WSP. We know that we cannot afford our own range and who knows how long we can use the BPD range.

I believe this is an opportunity for us to explore. It may be an excellent opportunity with government to partner with a local non-profit for the win-win.

I will continue to be a liaison at this time. If you have any instructions or information you want me to pass on, I am at your service.

The Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has operated for a number of years, under a policy of allowing Law Enforcement Officers to use their range. As part of that policy, they have provided the gate combination to our office.

As a representative of the weapon's board, I met with the officers of their club to talk about many ways we can partner with their organization. During this discussion, the club wanted to make us aware of a new program they have instituted at their range.

Due to some problems with the use of the range by non-LE or non-members, they have now implemented a new program for access to their facility.

Basically, the process includes completion of a "safety briefing" (where to shoot, where not to shoot, what type of targets to use, etc.), which lasts less than 2 hours. Then, the club will take your picture and issue a badge with the name of the LE officer and personnel number and provide the officer with the combination to the gate. After they give the combination, it is not to be shared with anyone, including other fellow LE officers, unless they have a ID card issued by KRRC. They have already done this for several BPD officers.

This safety briefing is available every Tuesday from 0900-1500 Hours at the KRRC. If this time is not convenient, another time can be arranged with the club by contacting the club through their web site: <http://www.gunsafety.org/>

In addition to this opportunity, KRRC hosts, every Tuesday evening beginning at 1700 Hours, an action shooting training shoot. This is an excellent opportunity for those who want additional practice on the fundamentals of combat-style shooting to do so. There is no cost to this program, but they do ask for a nominal donation to cover costs of targets, tape and paint. You will need to provide your own ammunition and other shooting accessories for this event.

KRRC has been a wonderful partner to the Sheriff's Office over the years. Please respect their club and their rules should you choose to become a part of their programs.

I am glad to hear from you today. I believe you took a lot of heat for something that was not entirely of your doing and want very much to help.
We need a code for Kitsap County that works for the staff and the citizens and PROMOTES rather that acts to prohibit safe, secure places for the many residents who want such places.

I will personally call on the people who responded last night and give you a list of names and contact information so we can begin this process right away. I agree with you that regardless of the "legality" of the committee's role, the intent was to involve responsible persons with experience (users of rifle, pistol and shotgun ranges) in the process early on. I know that we can work together to have something to present to the Planning Commission and the Board of Commissioners that will be acceptable.

Mr. Kitchens,

This note is to thank you for your testimony at the Planning Commission hearing last night and to apologize for my failure to contact you, and others in the gun club community, for help in drafting a more sensible set of rules.

You are correct in your observation that very little thought has gone into the draft before the Planning Commission. Our purpose was to get public gun ranges legitimized in the code by adding them to the rural use table.

Obscure language in the current code, along with a prohibition against siteing "public recreation facilities" in the Interim Rural Forest zone has made it difficult in the past to respond to requests for new gun ranges in the County.

I would like to ask for your help in organizing a stakeholder committee to put together a performance-based set of siteing standards for consideration by the Planning Commission and Board of County Commissioners. We were told by County staff persons who participated in earlier efforts to draft no-shooting area rules that the committee that is mentioned in the code was formed only for the purpose of recommending those rules, and has no further legal role in the review process. If you believe that is not the case, I would be pleased to take your arguments and evidence to my bosses for reconsideration. Regardless of the truth about the committee, we clearly need to assemble a group of comparable persons to work on the gun range rules.

If you could provide me with a list of names and addresses of your peers, I would like to send an outreach invitation. Also, if there is model code language out there that would provide a starting point for our discussion, could you send me a reference?

The Review committee specified in 10.24.105 was established in 1993 (by Ordinance 50-B). I believe that the Board at that time intended the committee for the limited purpose of "recommending to the Board of Commissioners appropriate criteria for ranges and for petitions to establish additional "no shooting" areas." I do not think it was intended to function as an ongoing review committee. The committee fulfilled its purpose and the Board adopted its recommendations in 1993 through Ordinance 50-C [section 10.24.107 of the code] "Designation of additional no-shooting areas through petition method."

If the Board now wants to conduct outreach and promote citizen involvement in siting shooting ranges, we can develop a more effective approach than using the committee composed as specified in the code (the Sheriff, the DCD Director, the presidents of existing shooting ranges and 3 citizens). Accordingly, I recommend that DCD staff develop and alternative approach for the Board's consideration. Additionally, I recommend that DCD staff also draft an ordinance for the Board to consider to either repeal or amend the section of the code that established the committee. Otherwise, each time a shooting range issue surfaces, the code provisions concerning the committee will create confusion.

Mr. Kitchens,

This note is to thank you for your testimony at the Planning Commission hearing last night and to apologize for my failure to contact you, and others in the gun club community, for help in drafting a more sensible set of rules.

You are correct in your observation that very little thought has gone into the draft before the Planning Commission. Our purpose was to get public gun ranges legitimized in the code by adding them to the rural use table. Obscure language in the current code, along with a prohibition against siteing "public recreation facilities" in the Interim Rural Forest zone has made it difficult in the past to respond to requests for new gun ranges in the County.

I would like to ask for your help in organizing a stakeholder committee to put together a performance-based set of siting standards for consideration by the Planning Commission and Board of County Commissioners. We were told by County staff persons who participated in earlier efforts to draft no-shooting area rules that the committee that is mentioned in the code was formed only for the purpose of recommending those rules, and has no further legal role in the review process. If you believe that is not the case, I would be pleased to take your arguments and evidence to my bosses for reconsideration. Regardless of the truth about the committee, we clearly need to assemble a group of comparable persons to work on the gun range rules.

If you could provide me with a list of names and addresses of your peers, I would like to send an outreach invitation. Also, if there is model code language out there that would provide a starting point for our discussion, could you send me a reference?

I haven't seen any articles on this issue, but here's the background. The KRRC currently leases the site (which is School Trust Land) from the DNR. For the past few years, this DNR property (along with existing County park land on Newberry Hill) has been earmarked as a future Heritage Park site for Central Kitsap. Staff and the Commissioners have been engaged in discussions with DNR about a future transfer of this property to the County to enable the creation of a Heritage Park.

DNR recently informed us that their lease with KRRC is about to expire. DNR has expressed an interest in renewing the lease, with a caveat that KRRC's use of the property would need to be renegotiated with the County whenever the property is transferred to the County. The County would then be able to work with the KRRC on future development plans for the site.

Though we haven't had any recent discussions with KRRC, and haven't done any serious long-range planning for the site, we've never assumed that a gun club couldn't be incorporated into the master plan for this large Heritage Park.

Last week, Chris asked me to find out what April Borbon's email about the Kitsap Rifle and revolver Club's concern over the Newberry Hill heritage park proposal. On 8/22, Cris Gears wrote an email explaining that we have not had any discussions on this issue.

Because I had already called April and left a message earlier in the week, I called April to make sure she had received Cris Gear's email and had her questions answered. What I found out was that she has a specific concern about the DNR lease. Because DNR is anticipating a future sale of the land to the county, the DNR has added a caveat to the Rifle Club's lease (the expired lease is being renewed), that makes the property subject to renegotiation with the county if the property is transferred to the county.

April explained that this is a problem. She is the club's grant writer. By having less than a 20-something year lease, they cannot apply for grant funds. They have extensive plans to develop a "sportsman" park (paint ball, etc.) there and are hoping to get funding. She is very concerned that this will turn "ugly" quickly and that we need to establish a means of clear communications. She suggested that a delegation, including her and key leadership from the Club, come to a Commissioner study session and tell you about their plans and have you explain your plans. As a result of the meeting, they hope to resolve the lease issue and have a clearer understanding of each other's goals and can find ways to work together.

With 600+ members, the club thinks they can help as stakeholders in the future park. I wasn't sure if the Board or just Cris should meet with them, but I thought her attitude was very productive and promised to pass on the information for the Board and Cris to coordinate.

Please let me know if you want me to do anything further, I need to call her back to let her know who will be talking to her.

Karen: Red Man suits are pretty weak. \$500.00 for a used suit is very high, unless it is in excellent condition. We can get a better partial High Gear suit brand new for much less than that price. I am willing to come in if it is late afternoon to check them out though. Maybe getting one would be alright, however there are a lot more pressing issues as far as DT gear right now. (MATS, facility).

As a side note, Surgical Shooting Inc. is (or was) based out of the east side (Yakima?) and used the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver club quite often to put on classes, which were sparsely attended. They were never very forthcoming with any information, myself and Russ Holt from BPD tried to contact and talk with their instructors several times. However, they never wanted to associate with local law enforcement, which is why no one ever heard of them and why they aren't really in business any more, since they would not talk to their prospective clients (bad business practice). I think they still do some contract training for the Navy and Coast Guard though.

If Ryan is willing to come in late on an afternoon, say 1600 on this Wednesday (9/10) or next Tuesday or Wednesday (10/16 or 10/17), I would come in and check the suits out. Red Man suits are not as impact resistant as the FIST suits that we have been using, and they are movement restrictive for the same amount of impact resistance that a High Gear suit would provide.

My advice is get the combat shorts (\$130) and torso protector (\$190) from High Gear - 1 set in large, one set in extra large. They are a much better deal, and they can be worn under an actors clothes. We have helmets, shin guards, groin protectors, gloves, etc. already. By the way, Chad and I use the High Gear suits when we act and grade the final mock scenes at the academy. They work extremely well. We have used Red Man suits in the past, and they constantly rip and tear, requiring lots of duct tape.

Anyway, hope this helps, Joe.

SK gun enthusiast in 'holding pattern' for court ruling

South Kitsap resident Marcus Carter is spending his Wednesdays waiting by the phone now. That's the day the result of his recent appearance before the state Supreme Court will be released. Carter's appeal hearing Sept. 9 was only the latest in a series of charges, lawsuits and appeals that extend back into 1999, when he was first accused of possessing an illegal automatic weapon. The case that developed between Carter and Kitsap County is as basic as it gets — the county says it was a machine gun and they had the right to seize it; Carter said it wasn't a machine gun and, no, the county didn't have the right to take it.

In general, the courts have agreed with Carter. His appearance before the Supreme Court is based on an appeal of a Tacoma Court of Appeals decision filed by the county shortly after the appeals court backed Carter's claims.

Kitsap County Prosecutor Russ Hauge has said the county doesn't plan on taking this case any further should Carter win again. So, after spending the last four years immersed in legal jargon, Carter is breathlessly waiting to see whether this will be the last round, or whether he'll have to start all over again.

"It's just a matter of waiting to see what they come up with," he said. "I have no way to gauge this — I've never been there before." The facts surrounding the case and alleged crime have been a matter for debate ever since the very beginning.

On May 15, 1999, Carter, a near-full-time volunteer at Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club near Seabeck, was teaching a gun instructor certification class to a small group of people. Two of the men in the class were employed as investigators for the Pierce County Prosecutor's Office.

At one point in the class, each attendee had to demonstrate how to clear a weapon, which included demonstrating the chamber was empty. Bruce Jackson, who at that point was chief criminal investigator for Pierce County, picked up one of the available weapons — an AR-15 competition rifle owned by Carter — and demonstrated how to clear it.

However, Jackson didn't put it back down. According to the report Jackson filed, he found several parts that didn't match the factory-issue AR-15s. When he opened up the gun to look inside, he found what he identified as parts from an M-16 military assault rifle — an automatic weapon banned from civilian ownership under state law. Past that initial recitation of facts, the county's and Carter's stories diverge considerably. Carter said the investigator was very rude and insisted Carter relinquish the weapon to him so he could go back to Pierce County and have it tested. The investigator reported Carter got very anxious and tried to destroy or remove the illegal parts

inside the weapon.

Eventually, the police got called in and Carter's weapon was seized. Ironically, when the case finally went to court it didn't last long enough and the official reports of the gun's capacities were never entered as evidence.

The case was thrown out in the early stages on grounds of illegal search. Essentially, the court said the investigators had no right to go poking around inside Carter's weapon without a warrant or permission from Carter.

"That's what I wrote in my report, that he started a clandestine investigation without my knowledge," Carter said. "When he pushed that pin and opened that gun, he went beyond the open-view doctrine."

"It was more a matter of being rude than anything else," he added. When the county appealed the ruling to the Court of Appeals in Tacoma, the three-judge panel there agreed with Carter and upheld the Superior Court decision.

The county's motion for reconsideration failed as well.

The county's appeal of that ruling is what got the case to the Supreme Court, and the current waiting game.

Carter said he's aware the Supreme Court can take up to six months to make a decision, so he knows it's a little premature to be hanging over the phone. However, he said it's hard not to be a little impatient.

Ever since the initial seizure, Carter hasn't been able to find a job — not that he'd have time for one with all the legal proceedings. Carter, a professional gunsmith, hopes to go back to that profession when the court issues are wrapped up.

Until then, he's been keeping busy with the gun club and talking to people who he said have offered words of support for his battle.

Of course, even if the Supreme Court uphold the Court of Appeals, life may not go back to normal right away. Hauge has pledged to retain control of Carter's weapon, regardless of the court ruling.

Carter said he'll fight tooth and nail to keep that from happening.

"I don't want a lawsuit," he said. "I want my gun back and I want to be left alone."

The Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has operated for a number of years, under a policy of allowing Law Enforcement Officers to use their range. As part of that policy, they have provided the gate combination to our office.

As a representative of the weapon's board, I met with the officers of their club to talk about many ways we can partner with their organization. During this discussion, the club wanted to make us aware of a new program they have instituted at their range.

Due to some problems with the use of the range by non-LE or non-members, they have now implemented a new program for access to their facility.

Basically, the process includes completion of a "safety briefing" (where to shoot, where not to shoot, what type of targets to use, etc.), which lasts less than 2 hours. Then, the club will take your picture and issue a badge with the name of the LE officer and personnel number and provide the officer with the combination to the gate. After they give the combination, it is not to be shared with anyone, including other fellow LE officers, unless they have a ID card issued by KRRC. They have already done this for several BPD officers.

This safety briefing is available every Tuesday from 0900-1500 Hours at the KRRC. If this time is not convenient, another time can be arranged with the club by contacting the club through their web site: <http://www.gunsafety.org/>

In addition to this opportunity, KRRC hosts, every Tuesday evening beginning at 1700 Hours, an action shooting training shoot. This is an excellent opportunity for those who want additional practice on the fundamentals of combat-style shooting to do so. There is no cost to this program, but they do ask for a nominal donation to cover costs of targets, tape and paint. You will need to provide your own ammunition and other shooting accessories for this event.

KRRC has been a wonderful partner to the Sheriff's Office over the years. Please respect their club and their rules should you choose to become a part of their programs.

Chris,

I am a local landowner who lives adjacent to the Poulsbo Gun Club located on Clear Creek Road. I have been in communication with city officials including Mark Grimm on concerns of the current use of the gun range pertaining to the gun ranges safety issues and noise levels. I am concerned for the safety of my boys who play in open land adjacent to and behind the range as well as the hours of operation and the excessive noise levels from the high powered and muzzle loaded rifles operated at the range and on the ranges property behind the marked range.

I contacted Mark Grimm after reading an article in the Kitsap Reporter on expansions to the range (Feb 19 2003 page A2). I was concerned since I was told by Steve Mount (conversations throughout 2002) that the county had grandfathered the range prior to local zoning changes in the 1992 time frame which placed the range in a nonconforming use status. However the grandfathering prevented any improvements or expansions to the range with the exception of safety related changes. Mr. Grimm assured me that the only changes were safety related and included a "Blue screen" for all ranges (including the recent expansion of the range (to include muzzle loaders) into the woods behind the marked range) to ensure no bullet could leave the range. We addressed the very excessive noise levels emitted from the range (particularly the muzzle loading area just behind my residence) and he said the range had assured him that these improvements would also act as noise abatement screens and I should hear a marked improvement when the upgrades were complete.

I observed new construction including a three story building on the skeet range (I don't know what that has to do with safety) but did not note any changes in noise level and began to wonder about the safety improvements to the range. A phone voice mail to Mr. Grimm on the 18th and again on the 24th of Sept was never returned.

I note on the city's web site that there are significant changes to the county's gun range development codes and I am concerned that the apparent free reign the ranges currently enjoy will only become worse. I am concerned for my family's safety and the excessive noise levels and operating times of the range.

What I would like to know is that this range does meet the highest level possible for safety (not for the users, but for the surrounding homeowners and adjacent lands). A BULLET SHOULD NOT BE ABLE TO LEAVE THE RANGE LIKE AT LEAST ONE DID ON SATURDAY SEPT 10TH from the sportsman's club on Bainbridge Island (SUN Sept 10th page A1, Sept 13 page A4, Sept 18 page A9) AND I would like to see some protection for my rights and the adjacent landowners in the hours of operation and the allowable noise levels that are emitted from the range use. I am curious how the city can write code limiting the "Maximum permissible noise levels" EDNA of receiving property (ORD 3A, 1975) at 55 dB for residential property yet allow a gun range

(recreational use) to emit noise in the 70 and 80 dB range AS RECORDED IN MY BACK YARD. I would really like the county to do something to protect my rights and the residents of this area who pay far more in taxes (each) than the Poulsbo Gun Club does. Please consider these points when you are discussing the controls and changes to the codes for the gun ranges.

Mrs. Endresen,

Thank You for your quick response. If you would like to make a matter of public record my e-mail that would be OK, however much of it was just information to address conversations I have had in the past with city representatives.

As I identified earlier I am a landowner living adjacent to the Poulsbo Sportsman Club and am concerned for my families safety, health and our rights as land and home owners. In making the decisions to change the county's gun range restrictions I would ask the county commissioners to consider the following issues.

1) What level of risk to it's citizens is the county willing to accept for the purpose of approving new and existing gun range uses? I would propose there should be no appreciable risk to county residents, since even one death would obviously not be acceptable. With this being the only acceptable response one would expect, then what is the risk associated with current approved range operations? What prevents stray bullets from leaving the range and impacting in residential areas such as the bullet that impacted the home of Bob and Karen King which was fired from the Bainbridge Island Sportsmens Club as identified in the Sun in at least three different articles? I would expect someone to analyze the risk these ranges expose the local residents to and ensure these ranges eliminate these risks. I would suggest the range is responsible to have accomplished an independent safety inspection with results being provided to the county's oversight committee and all local residents. Isn't it the responsibility of the range to verify and ensure they do not endanger local residents?

2) County Ord 3-A of 1975 restricts noise emission from any property (exempting gun ranges) to no more than 55 - 60 dB at the receiving Class A (home) property. I am sure this ordinance is designed to protect the health and safety of the county's residents. Why then is it OK for a gun range to exceed these identified limits? If these noise levels have been identified by the county as acceptable maximums to protect public safety and health, then it should not matter what the source of the noise is, the noise emission limitations should be the same. I can ensure you that the Poulsbo Sportsmans Club exceeds these noise levels on a regular basis with the noise dB level easily reaching 70 - 80 dB at times on my property. I strongly encourage the county commissioners to include very specific noise levels and abatement requirements for the existing gun ranges and any future approved ranges. This would certainly benefit and protect the health of the ranges residential neighbors.

3) The changes being considered to the county's codes on new ranges should include provisions for these same requirements to existing gun ranges. Grandfathering land use is understandable to protect land owner rights, however you can not nor should not grandfather any use that increases the publics risk to accidental death or the increased health risk due to the excessive noise levels of existing ranges. All new provisions to county codes that deal with health and safety considerations should be included in language for existing land use as well. I would ask the commissioners to consider that Section 17.430.20 (g) a-e be applied to existing gun ranges as well as new applications. This would ensure that all ranges are reviewed using the same criteria and all approved ranges meet the acceptable standards as identified in this language. Additionally, I would suggest that sections a through e be spelled out in very definitive language to ensure the same standards are applied to all ranges to ensure all residents share in equal protection of their health and safety.

4) In the proposed changes to 17.430.20 (d) the safety committee reviews the gun range application and makes written recommendations for safety related matters only. Why is this and shouldn't they be reviewing and making recommendations on all section (g) factors to include screening and buffers, noise mitigation issues, hours of operation?

Thank You for your consideration of the issues as addressed above. I am available to discuss these issues with the Commissioners and would like to be considered for the local home owners position on the "Safety Committee".
