Scott: I looked over the courses, they look real good. One change that needs to be made is that the traffic stop portion will probably have to be done on the main range or the shotgun side (west side) of the tire house. Don't know if you heard, but Lt Rawlins from BPD was flaming mad because the jail shot up his target covering at the rifle range with pistol rounds. I spoke with him about your ideas, he said to use the main portion or the west side shotgun portion (rifle range for rifles only now). Also, if you use the main portion of the range for the traffic stop or rescue scene, make sure we are not shooting into the target bays. Use the east side past where the bays stop to avoid damage from rounds. BPD is quite pissed at us right now, and we need to prevent unnecessary damage and make sure we clean up after use.

Hopefully KRRC will come through with the moving targets, in the past it was always a big hassle because they always claim they are using them. Just make sure there are enough safety monitors on each scene, and not to shoot at metal targets (or anything metal) closer than 10 yards. You may want to design it so that one FI/RSO takes the person through all the way, and each portion also has a separate safety monitor. Especially if someone has to run the flashlight or moving targets (garage door openers), it leaves another to monitor safety, and 2 people clearing in the tire house can be a nightmare for safety at night.

I talked to Rice, he says the garage door openers should be working, but may need some re-wiring. Also they will need plastic bags to cover the switches (rain). You should probably check those prior to the range day. Most of the tire house is usable, make sure you check it prior to the shoot. It sounds like the rear portion has been somewhat altered, but you need to check it.

As far as the drag dummy from the jail, they will probably not let you borrow it. If they do, make sure you wrap cardboard or something around the legs with duct tape to prevent damage. They let us use it a while back, but the last couple of times they did not want us to use it because of damage (its getting old), plus it gets wet and dirty from the weather. I think Lt Payne is the one you need to talk to, she is often not very helpful. If you can't borrow it, you may want to make one (old clothes and newspaper), or get a mannequin from the mall (Penney's or the Bon), and put clothes on it. We made a couple a while back, again start early, it takes time.

The course looks like it will be real fun. We always tweak it a little beforehand and as we go. Try to get help out at the range early (at least 2 hours prior to shoot or more), it always seems like something goes wrong and we are scrambling at the last minute. I hope to be out to help on Wed. and Thu., but it all depends on Chief Simpson finishing the investigation of my investigation....
