Legislative Update from Olympia 21 January 2005

MAJOR ANTI-GUN BILLS FILED

HEARING SCHEDULED 25 JANUARY

MAXIMUM ATTENDANCE REQUESTED

Recall during the campaign period Democrat presidential candidate John Kerry taking photo ops at a trap range in Wisconsin, receiving a shotgun at a union rally in West Virginia and going goose hunting in Ohio? Or all the talk in the newspaper op-ed pages by Democrats after the election about reaching out to "red staters?"

Forget about it.

Several extremist gun control bills have been scheduled for a public hearing - even before bill numbers are assigned (thus preventing the public from obtaining copies of the bills or referencing bill numbers when calling their legislators). One bill will ban possession of "assault weapons" in the state, with the definition of "assault weapon" being much broader than the recently-expired Clinton gun ban. For example, under the Washington bill, M1 carbines and Ruger Mini-14s would be banned, as would any detachable magazine semi-auto or pump rifle or shotgun with a SINGLE "military feature." No more than 10 rounds may be loaded in any magazine (even in your HOME) except at a recognized firing range. Another bill bans rifles chambered for the .50 caliber Browning machine gun cartridge (.50 BMG). Both bills will allow those who currently possess such firearms to keep them (if you owned it BEFORE the effective date) - but ONLY after registering it with local police, undergoing a background check (for an unspecified fee), renewing the registration and background check ANNUALLY - again for an unspecified fee, and the best part: Law enforcement agencies are allowed to conduct an annual inspection of your home to ensure you are "safely and securely" storing the assault weapon or .50 BMG rifle properly (no definition of "safely and securely" is given). Assault weapons and .50 BMG rifles may only be possessed at home, at a range, or transporting directly in between those locations. Under an "emergency clause," the laws take effect as soon as Governor Gregoire signs them.

That's the quick and dirty explanation of the impact of the bills. As soon as bill numbers are assigned and you can obtain copies from the Legislative Web Site or the Bill Room, I will send another GOAL message.

The old "Whitney Graves" safe storage bill has been refiled as SB 5342 (Senator Kohl-Welles, D-36). If a child obtains your loaded firearm, you may be found guilty of a gross misdemeanor and face a year in jail, even if no harm resulted. Amazingly, if someone is harmed as a result of the act, the prosecuting attorney is given explicit permission to DECLINE to prosecute. This is bizarre!

SB 5343 (Senator Kohl-Welles, D-36) is the same old Washington Ceasefire "gun show loophole" bill that's been beating around for four years now. It would require ALL firearms transferred at a gun show to be processed by a licensed federal firearms dealer, subject to a background check, with an unspecified fee to be charged by the state patrol (AND a fee to be charged by the dealer, naturally). The definition of "gun show" includes the parking lots and other curtilage areas of a gun show, placing the burden of patrolling the parking lot on the gun show promoter.

SB 5344 (Senator Fairley, D-32) would make it a criminal offense to possess a firearm inside the Legislative Building (capitol building) on the state Capitol Campus. The Washington State Patrol would be required to provide lock boxes or some other form of secure storage for lawfully-carried pistols. This is the same provision that is in place for court houses... that routinely refuse to accept firearms for safekeeping.

There have been a couple of pro-gun bills filed this week as well. SB 5167 (Hargrove, D-24) allows persons who lawfully possess suppressors (silencers) to actually shoot with them, an act now prohibited by state law. SB 5167 is not currently scheduled for a hearing. Another as-yet unnumbered bill is one from Senator Pam Roach (R-31) that would extend the validity of CPLs possessed by military members if they are deployed out of state. Their 90-day clock on renewal would start upon their return. That bill will be heard with the anti-gun bills on 25 January.

Bills have been filed in both the Senate (SB 5383) and House (HB 1213) that would put a lower age limit on hunting license issuance, 10 years of age. It would also limit attendance at the state-mandated hunter ed courses to those aged 10 and over. Children younger than 10 could still attend other firearms safety courses.

A public hearing on SBs 5131, 5342, 5343, 5344, the a/w ban, the .50 BMG ban and the military CPL renewal bill will be held on Tuesday, 25 January in Senate Hearing Room 1, John A. Cherberg Senate Office Building. The hearing runs from 3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. WE NEED AS MANY PEOPLE AS POSSIBLE TO ATTEND THIS HEARING, and to sign in on the sign-in sheet taking a "pro" (for) or "con" (against) position.

If you know of any pro-gun police officers or retired officers who might be able to attend and speak against the anti-gun bills, it would help immensely. Without doubt the "cop lobby" will speak in favor of the bills.



**BRADY CAMPAIGN LIES AGAIN--
Nevada Law Enforcement Officials' Names
Wrongly Added to H.R. 800 Opposition Letter!**

On March 15, 2004, the "Brady Campaign" testified before the House Judiciary Committee in opposition to H.R. 800--"The Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act"--federal legislation that would protect law-abiding firearm manufacturers from reckless, predatory, and potentially bankrupting lawsuits. During testimony, the group attempted to bolster its argument by introducing a letter that listed five Nevada law enforcement officials who purportedly lent their names to the Brady's effort to thwart the bill. The Bradys and another anti-gun organization--the "Million Mom March"--even posted the opposition letter on their websites as a way to garner key support for their gun-banning efforts.

But, as it turns out (and not surprisingly), the Brady Campaign apparently added the sheriffs' names to the letter without their knowledge or approval!

Due to phone calls generated by NRA members, we're happy to report that all five sheriffs have since contacted NRA to report the error and to determine how to have their names removed. Incidentally, the letter in question has suddenly been removed from the Brady's website.

manufacturers' exports of .50-caliber rifles. The amendment, by notoriously anti-gun Representative James Moran (D-Va.), sought to block .50-caliber exports to civilians.

In what was the first time Congress had been required to vote on any type of .50 caliber ban, the measure was soundly defeated by an overwhelming majority of 278-149.

NRA URGES LT. GOV. KAINE TO STOP MISLEADING VIRGINIA VOTERS

In a brazen attempt to mislead Virginia voters, Democratic Gubernatorial candidate Tim Kaine deliberately misused comments made by former NRA President Charlton Heston. Kaine's campaign advertisement implies that Mr. Heston lauded Kaine for reduced crime in Richmond. In reality, Heston was praising Project Exile, a program implemented prior to Kaine becoming Mayor of Richmond.

Commenting on the allegations, NRA-ILA Executive Director Chris W. Cox said, "It is shameful and dishonest to manipulate comments in an attempt to mislead voters during this gubernatorial campaign. We would like to set the record straight and ask Tim Kaine to cease and desist his false advertising campaign."

Charlton Heston's spokesman, Bill Powers stated, "Charlton Heston knows Jerry Kilgore. They've campaigned together and spent time with each other. There is no doubt that if Mr. Heston were to hit the campaign trail this year, he would be in full support of Jerry Kilgore for Governor."

Project Exile, a successful anti-crime program that strictly enforces all current federal, state and local gun laws against criminals, was recognized as a vital tool in reducing Richmond's violent crime rate. NRA spent over \$1 million to help start this program in Richmond. Tim Kaine was not mayor when Project Exile was implemented.

In fact, as Richmond mayor, Kaine used taxpayer money to send eight chartered buses to gun control rallies (Richmond Times Dispatch, 6/15/00). Also as mayor, he advocated suing lawful gun manufacturers for the actions of criminals (Richmond Times Dispatch, 3/14/99).

Referring to Kaine's suggestion in the advertisement that he had worked with Mr. Heston and that the actor supported him, Powers replied, "To my knowledge, Mr. Heston has never even met the man."

"Clearly, Kaine's record and rhetoric don't match. This raises a legitimate and disturbing credibility issue with this candidate," concluded Cox.

PRO-GUN CANDIDATES SUCCESSFUL IN VIRGINIA PRIMARY ELECTIONS

Virginia NRA Members and law-abiding gun owners turned out in full force for the June 14 Primary Elections as 88% of NRA-PVF-endorsed candidates won their primary races. At the top of the ticket, gubernatorial candidate Jerry Kilgore (R) handily won his race with 82.5% of the vote, and, in the Republican Primary for Lieutenant Governor, Bill Bolling won with 54.5% of the vote. Winners in contested Primaries for the House of Delegates included: Delegate Preston Bryant Jr. (R-23); Delegate Edward T. Scott (R-30); Delegate Bobby Orrock (R-54); challenger Chris Craddock (R) unseated incumbent

Gary Reese in the House District 67; and Michael Golden (R) won the nomination the House District 41.

CALIFORNIA

Anti-gun legislation, Senate Bill 357, is expected to be heard in the Assembly Public Safety Committee on Tuesday, June 28. This bill would establish a program requiring serialization of handgun ammunition to be enforced by the Department of Justice. The manufacture, transfer, and possession of non-serialized handgun ammunition after July 1, 2007, would be considered a crime. SB 357 would also require ammunition vendors and manufacturers to register with the Department of Justice. Please contact members of the Committee at (916) 319-3744 and ask them to oppose SB 357. Assembly Bill 996 is expected to be considered by the Senate Public Safety Committee on Tuesday, June 21 at 9:30 a.m. AB 996 would require all retailers to display and sell ammunition in a manner that is only accessible by an employee, not the purchaser. Any violation of this measure would result in a misdemeanor. This bill has been voted down twice during the 2005 Legislative Session because existing law already makes it a crime to sell ammunition to a minor, or ammunition designed for a handgun to anyone less than 21 years of age. Assembly Bill 352 is also expected to be considered by the Senate Public Safety Committee on Tuesday, June 28. AB 352 expands the definition of "unsafe handguns" to include semi-automatic pistols that are not designed and equipped with an array of microscopic characters which identify the make, model, and serial number of the pistol by imprinting the characters on each cartridge case when the firearm is discharged. This legislation could essentially ban all semi-automatic pistols commonly used by California gun owners. Please contact members of the Senate Public Safety Committee at (916) 651-4118 and ask them to oppose AB 996 and AB 352.

NEW YORK

Lawmakers have sent a NRA-supported measure to Governor George Pataki's (R) desk. A 4853A/S 918A will allow hunters to use a rifle during open season for deer and bear in the counties of Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chenango, Herkimer, Montgomery, Oneida, Oswego, Otsego, Schoharie and Tioga, as well as certain rural towns in Broome County

in those areas east of the Susquehanna River. In addition to increasing hunting opportunities in New York State, this measure will go far in alleviating the dramatic rise in deer/car collisions and crop damage resulting from a drop off in hunters and a rise in deer population. Thanks go out to all who voted for this measure, but most importantly to sponsor Assemblywoman Francine DeMonte (D-138). Please contact Governor Pataki, at (518) 474-8390, and ask him to sign A 4853A/S 918A into law! With just days left in the legislative session, many gun-related measures are still pending. In the Senate are A 673, which creates the crimes of failure to store a weapon "safely" and criminally negligent storage of a firearm; A 2302, which would prohibit the retail sale of a handgun that does not contain a "child proofing" or integrated safety device; A 4471/S 2590, which would ban the sale, use and possession of .50 caliber firearms; A 2345, which would impose new restrictions on firearm dealers; and two bills which would expand the state's ban on "assault weapons," A 2466 and S 5504. Please contact your State Senator TODAY and urge him/her to oppose all of the above measures! You can reach your Senator by calling (518) 455-2800. A 6608, an NRA-backed proposal which would exempt shooting ranges already in existence from new local noise ordinances, awaits action in the Assembly. Anti-gun forces have attempted to use these lawsuits in order to bankrupt firearm businesses and to seek regulations and prohibitions through activist courts that they have been unable to enact through the State Legislature and Congress. With the passage of AB 56, Wisconsin will become the 34th state to have enacted this critical protection of our firearm's heritage. It is essential that you call





To answer your questions:

The Courage Classic, while focused on an LE theme with separate awards for LE, is open to any competent shooter. You'll find many from the USPSA world attending as well. It is a charity match that has as a founding goal to get LE personnel together with other LE departments AND Civilians to promote a camaraderie that is sooooo needed in our times.

To be a LE team, the members must be full time and/or active reservists with a LE agency. There are Civilian teams as well that will be competing against other civilian teams, and there is nothing in the rules that forbid someone from competing on more than one team. It is possible, for example, for an LE officer to compete both on a LE team and a civilian team. It is not possible, however, for a non-LE Civilian to compete on a LE team. There are separate awards for LE individuals and teams.

The top three team members score will count for the team score.

There are categories based on equipment. For LE teams, the equipment used must be department approved duty equipment. For individuals and civilian teams, the basic categories are Open and Limited. If one of the firearms a competitor uses falls into the Open category, then that competitor will compete in Open for the aggregate overall.

Keep in mind that this is not a USPSA match. Knowing USPSA rules and scoring is very helpful for speed is of the essence.

Please let me know if you have any further questions. We would love to have you over. It is a great event for a good cause.

To answer your questions:

The Courage Classic, while focused on an LE theme with separate awards for LE, is open to any competent shooter. You'll find many from the USPSA world attending as well. It is a charity match that has as a founding goal to get LE personnel together with other LE departments AND Civilians to promote a comroderie that is soooo needed in our times.

To be a LE team, the members must be full time and/or active reservists with a LE agency. There are Civilian teams as well that will be competing against other civilian teams, and there is nothing in the rules that forbid someone from competing on more than one team. It is possible, for example, for an LE officer to compete both on a LE team and a civilian team. It is not possible,

however, for a non-LE Civilian to compete on a LE team. There are separate awards for LE individuals and teams.

The top three team members score will count for the team score.

There are categories based on equipment. For LE teams, the equipment used must be department approved duty equipment. For individuals and civilian teams, the basic categories are Open and Limited. If one of the firearms a competitor uses falls into the Open category, then that competitor will compete in Open for the aggregate overall.

Keep in mind that this is not a USPSA match. Knowing USPSA rules and scoring is very helpful for speed is of the essence.

Thank you for attending the Pre-application Meeting on June 21, 2005. This letter, together with the enclosed items, constitutes your Written Summary of Pre-application Meeting, as required by the *Kitsap County Code* (KCC) 21.04.040.

Your Proposal

We understand your proposal is to abandon the use of an existing heavy use long-range firing line and one short-range bay to replace with a new long-range firing line and short-range bay (rifle line and pistol bay) to reduce noise and increase safety. The new range is planned to vegetate with grass. The Properties located at 4900 Seabeck HWY NW in Bremerton.

Land Use

The existing Rifle and Revolver Club site is approximately 72 acres; rectangle shaped and zoned Rural Wooded (1-dwelling unit per 20 acres). The property receives access from Seabeck-Holly Highway NW. The property is leased from Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Review of the Kitsap County resource maps show there is several wetlands scattered across the site, and an area with steep slopes near the southeast corner. Camp Wesley Harris Naval Reservation is abutting the east property line. Abutting the west property line is Washington State School Trust Lands with large wetland systems and to the north are DNR managed State lands also zoned Rural Wooded. There are only a few single-family homes that are adjacent to the project site.

The subject property's Comprehensive Plan designation and zoning is Interim Rural Forest (IRF). The IRF zone is *intended to encourage the preservation of forest uses, retain an area's rural character and conserve the natural resources while providing for some rural residential use. This zone is further intended to discourage activities and facilities, which can be considered detrimental to the maintenance of timber production. Residents of interim rural forest (IRF) Residential tracts shall recognize that they can be subject to normal and accepted farming and forestry practices on adjacent parcels.*

Code Enforcement Action

The County has recently received calls from property owners in the vicinity of the firing range commenting on noise, glare from lights and a significant amount of parking on Seabeck Holly Highway NW. The Code Enforcement Division has documented significant amount of land clearing, grubbing, burning of slash and trenching on the site without required permits to expand the range. All site work must stop until proper land use and civil permits are acquired.

Conditional Use Permit: The prohibited and permitted uses are referenced in Rural Use Table 17.320.020 the most applicable listed use would be 17.370.020(28) that includes recreational facilities public/private for the firing ranges and clubhouse uses. Only a combination of overnight accommodations, meeting facilities and recreational vehicle facilities with public or private recreational facilities are allowed conditionally, based on a decision by the Kitsap County interpretation, dated February 7, 2002 and Reconsideration on April 3, 2002 (Case No. 02110-002).

The County will review the application for the shooting range for consistency with Section 17.420, Conditional Use Permits. You will need to demonstrate that the facility is physically suitable for the site; compatible with existing and future permitted land uses in the area and will not be detrimental to the health and safety of existing and future residents in the neighborhood. Impacts that will need to be mitigated are noise, vibration, and dust. The property will require a rural character screening buffer with native vegetation up to 50-feet. The Kitsap County Hearing Examiner will be the review

Range Safety Analysis Permit: The facility must be located outside those areas identified under KCC Section 10.24.090 discharge of fire arms-areas where prohibited. The existing range is outside of prohibited shooting base on the County map Prohibited Shooting Areas, dates November 23, 2002. A separate permit is required to be reviewed based on the National Rifle Association (NRA) guidelines to allow gun ranges, as provided in KCC Section 10.24.103. The vicinity map or site plan will need to include a safety zone around the range/subject property. The County needs to know the proposed type of firearms to be discharged, the caliber of ammunition and if adequate safety measures have been taken to protect the public (e.g. height and width of berming). Pursuant to this Section, no permit can be issued for a range unless a certified range technical advisor has inspected the proposed range.

Sound Analysis Report: An acoustical expert that has experience with range shooting operations should prepare an acoustical analysis report. The report should include existing noise levels, modeling of the noise that will be generated by the use of the proposed range. In addition, the range design should include mitigation measures to reduce the amount of noise leaving the site. The application will need to include the proposed hours of operation for the range and if shooting will occur past dusk. The proposal should include a description of special events/shooting tournaments, how many people and how often.

Site Plan Review Standards (17.410.040)

The project is approved using the nine (9) criteria in KCC Section 17.410.040(D) Site Plan Review. The proposed commercial use in the above use table will include, but not be limited to the following development standards:

Enclosed Structures (KCC 17.410.040)

This requirement limits non-residential activity to only within an enclosed structure to limit impacts to surrounding properties. This requirement is not applicable to your outdoor firing range.

Service Areas (KCC 17.410.040):

All service areas, outdoor service areas and other intrusive site features should be screened from adjacent property owners and the traveling public on Seabeck Holly Road.

Solidwaste: (KCC 17.410.040)

Providing for trash receptacles and screening.

Pedestrian Access (KCC 17.410.040)

Site plan will need to show pedestrian/cart paths through the site to conform to Kitsap County Code.

Signage (KCC 17.445)

Any proposed signage would need to comply with KCC 17.445. If signage is proposed please provide specific details.

Off-Street Parking and Loading (KCC 17.435)

On your site plan, you will need to demonstrate that your project is consistent with the standards in Section 17.435 Off-Street Parking and Loading KCC. The minimum standard for clubs/lodges is to provide adequate amount of parking for the maximum number of people to attend events. All event parking should be limited to the project site.

Landscaping (KCC Section 17.385)

The County will may require additional landscaping to function as screening to mitigate any potential visual impacts or to reduce noise from the proposed project and to maintain compatibility with the residential neighborhood. Rural Character Buffers will be required around the perimeter of the site. These designated areas will need to be identified as a Native protective Easement on the site plan map. See KCC Section 17.385 Landscaping Standards for further information.

Lighting (KCC 17.455.110)

If artificial outdoor lighting is necessary, the lighting should be fully shielded from the side view, directed downward and away from adjacent properties. Section 17.455.110 Obnoxious Things, KCC requires that not more than one-foot candle of illumination may leave the property boundaries. *Lighting (17.455.110 Obnoxious Things)*

Provisions Applying to Special Uses- Standards (Section 17.430.F)

For community Buildings, Social Halls, Lodges, Fraternal Organizations, Clubs, Places of Worship and Charitable Institutions the additional following standards must be met:

- a) There shall be no external evidence of any incidental commercial activities taking place in the building.
- b) All such uses shall be locate on a County arterial or on a road determined to be adequate by the County engineer, and be able to provide access without causing traffic congestion on local residential streets; and
- c) Any such use shall not be materially detrimental to adjacent (existing or potential) residential development use due to traffic generation, noise or other circumstances.

Environmental Review

The review of County resource maps shows there are several large wetland systems on or near the property that will need to be delineated, categorized and buffers shown consistent with KCC Chapter 19.200 Wetlands and Chapter 19.700 Special Reports. We recommend that lead shot not be used near any wetlands to maintain water quality. If lead is used, continue to follow best management practices. Due to the scale of the project, an environmental checklist should accompany your application submittal. Attention will need to be given to noise, traffic, and the disposal of lead waste on the site (see attached article). A noise analysis report will be required to determine consistency with the KCC Chapter 10.28 Noise standards during normal operation and will included in the environmental review. Contact Robbyn Meyers for wetland information and contact Dave Greetham for all other questions for critical areas at (360) 337-7181.

Kitsap County Health District

The Health District requires you to provide the location of all existing septic tank(s) and primary and reserve septic drainfield areas. If there are no septic approval records available, contact a licensed septic designer to locate the tanks, drainfield laterals, and a reserve area with BSA compliance. You will also need to provide the location of any well(s) on the property, and the number of proposed persons using the septic system. Please refer to the enclosed checklist from the Kitsap County Health District for more information regarding their requirements for your project proposal. You may also contact Tim Quayle, Environmental Health Specialist, at 360-337-5222, for more information.

Development Engineering

Based upon review of the actual site and the submitted site plan, this project meets the definition of a major development. A system for handling storm water that complies with the County's adopted standards must be designed by a licensed civil engineer. A preliminary drainage plan and analysis, as described in the attached checklist, must be submitted with your application (four/five copies). Following land use approval, detailed construction plans for this system must be submitted and approved as part of a Site Development Activity Permit (SDAP). 





> What is going on across the street???? I have built and lived in my home for 25 years.
> I am deeply concerned about new information I have obtained from a neighbor and member of Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club. He wants to keep his name anonymous because the Club officers will perceive him as an non-conformant, anti-development member. His family lives the closest to the Range. He has seen first hand what illegal changes they have done to the club and to the land, the changes you hinted to during our conversation over the phone on August 18th. I walked the land myself and heard from him about the big plans they have for a huge firearms sport facility, the 1000 yard range they want to shoot cannons, 50 cal firearms, and automatic weapons to name a few. According to his calculations the "club" would need approximately 800 acres to keep a safe buffer zone. These rifle rounds can travel up to 3 miles or longer. I talked with DNR director Doug McClelland, who said they asked for permission to increase their range to 640 acres. Now, about the illegal activities, what is being done about clearing trees, burning debris, draining wet land all on this DNR land, the lack of public notification and permits? Why no punitive damages to speak of? Does the range have Federal certification to allow class 3 weapons to be shot there? Do they have permits to light up the firing line at night and shoot weapons until 10pm and start at 7am in the morning, seven days a week? Their April application specified a request to shoot from 10am to 4pm. Also, I still hear very loud firing from their "new" firing line. Along with tactical weapons, they are firing cannons that shoot a 3 gallon coffee can filled with cement. The concussion vibrates my windows. I've talked to neighbors and they agree it has gotten to be a public nuisance. Also, this range is supposed to be a club, non-profit. Through round-about means they are running a business called "Firearms Tactical Institute" and they charge for these training camps and profit the money. The club receives nothing. You can see their automobiles during the week out on Seabeck HWY because the Navy has their buses parked inside the range and use it too. Club members are upset because they can't even use their own course at times because of the business going on. My neighbor has also said he has been at the range while AK 47's, M16's and M14's where fired. See where my gun club neighbors have warped into? What about the plans for a "heritage park", Patty, that will go in that area between Newberry Hill Rd and Seabeck Hwy? How does a huge firing range fit into those plans? What about the safety of Klahowya Secondary School bordering on that area?

What can be done about the noise that already exists? I'm not against the club as it once was. I've lived in harmony with it for a long time. How do we get it back again?

Ms. Angel,

She is no doubt correct in her second point, when she says that many small businesses in and around Belfair will be destroyed by Cabella's and other global conglomerates. I'm sure someone skilled in demographic analyses could come up with some valid statistical arguments against NASCAR.

My objection to NASCAR is much less quantifiable, but all the more important, perhaps, because of its esoteric nature.

I've called Kitsap County home since 1967. I graduated with honors from Central Kitsap High in 1969. I'm currently an adjunct faculty member for both Chapman and Vincennes Universities, catering largely to active-duty sailors and marines, but also to the civilian population of Kitsap County. I have also taught many classes for OC. I have a strong following of both Republicans and Democrats who read my regular letters-to-the-editor of the Kitsap Sun, and I'm on a first-name basis with a couple of employees of that voice of the West Sound. In other words, I think I have my finger on the pulse of this county.

Since I first heard of the plan to bring NASCAR into the area about a year ago, I've been taking some informal surveys of my students. I'll grant you that the young military kids I have in my classes are largely blue collar and thus have not benefitted from the best of educational experiences. To their credit, though, they generally respond to my methods and most of them improve their basic writing and speaking skills under my tutelage.

I have noticed, though, that the ones who, according to my informal survey, profess to be real NASCAR fans are generally the ones who consistently achieve the lowest scores and learn the least. Their vocabularies are limited and their thought processes are retarded--much more so than the students who either dislike NASCAR or who are indifferent to the issue. I'm not saying NASCAR is solely responsible for this. There are lots of reasons people don't acquire adequate communication skills. But, the ones who swear to love NASCAR are consistently the least intellectually developed.

It is my belief that there is, indeed, a connection between slow-wittedness and NASCAR viewing. What IS NASCAR after all? You and some of the people at the Achievers meeting talked all around NASCAR by discussing the job creation, the environmental impact, and the traffic problems, but none of you mentioned what NASCAR really is.

It's twenty-six race car drivers whipping in their vehicles at top speed around and around and around and around and around and around and around a paved oval for hours on end. It

has to be the most mindless and intellectually stultifying activity to watch since bass fishing became popular. There is absolutely NOTHING of intellectual value or stimulation involved. All one need do is swill beer and drool. If one should fall asleep during a race, that's OK because if he or she should wake up, nothing will have changed. It will still be twenty-six race car drivers driving around and around and around a paved oval, making huge amounts of noise and burning up tons of increasingly precious fuel. The one thing that might be exciting is the possibility of seeing a terrible wreck. I'm sure most NASCAR fans would pay extra if they could be guaranteed the spectacle of a crashed driver clawing at the orange flames consuming his trapped body and screaming in agony. That's one of NASCAR's charms, isn't it?

I had some questions concerning the Kitsap Rifle & Gun Club since I have just recently moved to the Silverdale area.

In 2002, a proposed rifle range in South Kitsap was turned down due to the local zoning code for "interim rural forest" which prohibits the use of this type of land for private recreational facilities. Why is the Kitsap Rifle & Gun Club allowed to use their leased parcel, which is zoned for "interim rural forest," for this purpose?

Also, I understand that they have an exemption to the county noise ordinance. I am curious why they are allowed to operate 365 days a year from 7 am until 10 pm at night. Most other rifle ranges around the state in similar locations have much shorter hours of operation and must have an attendant on duty.

Thanks you for your response to these questions.
