

Newberry Hill Property Exchange Status Report

OVERVIEW

This morning Chip Faver, Brian Lyman and Rick Fackler, representing Kitsap County (County), met with Brad Pruitt from the Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to begin formal discussions about County acquisition of approximately 750 acres of DNR lands known as Newberry Hill.

Much of that acquisition is intended to be accomplished through a trade of approximately 400 acres of County-owned land peripheral to DNR's Green Mountain holdings. The intention is to trade the County lands for the southernmost 500 acres of the DNR Newberry Hill land. The County lands being discussed for this trade include: 1) 320 acres of property the County purchased from Port Blakely Tree Farm in 2004, and: 2) a played out 80 acre gravel pit owned by the County. The 500 acres being considered for the trade are an asset of the Common School Trust, and can be disposed of, as long as the asset remains whole (does not lose value). While we will not know until the property is appraised, it is likely that the large wetlands on the DNR Newberry Hill property will reduce the value of that property, and the trade value of the County lands could equal or exceed the value of the school trust lands at Newberry Hill.

The remaining 250 acres of DNR land at Newberry Hill is land of which the County became owner decades ago when property owners forfeited it in lieu of paying property taxes. It was subsequently deeded to the DNR under the terms of State law, and is managed as "Forest Board – Transfer" (forest board) with proceeds from that management coming back to the County and junior taxing districts within the County. Forest board lands, under state law cannot be disposed of, but they can be "reconveyed" (given back) to the County for recreational purposes under certain circumstances. The 255 acre site currently owned by the County and called Newberry Hill Heritage Park was reconveyed to the County by DNR in the mid nineteen-nineties. While DNR is hesitant to reconvey land, as they do not want to set precedents, we have discussed reconveyance of those parts of the forest board lands where the value exceeds that of the County's 400 acres.

DNR is in the midst of evaluating all the lands it manages in west-central Kitsap County. There are many small, isolated parcels around which rural development is occurring. They are working toward repositioning their lands into larger, more easily and cost-effectively managed blocks at Green Mountain, Tahuya State Forest and the Stavis Natural Resource Conservation Area/Kitsap Forest Natural Area Preserve. They intend to work in a transparent way with the County, other governmental agencies, the public and property owners to accomplish the consolidation of their land holdings in this part of the County. The Newberry Hill exchange is an element of this strategy, and DNR is prepared to proceed with this transaction now.

PROCEDURES AND TIMELINES

IMMEDIATE ACTIONS

- Kitsap County:** Do boundary line adjustment of land to be traded.
Amend property description and complete deed of right with IAC
Clarify with Public Works the status of the 80 acre gravel pit site
- DNR:** Prepare a Letter of Intent, delineating the exchange responsibilities and commitments. This document will be presented to the Board of County Commissioners for signature when it has been prepared and reviewed by appropriate County staff.

APPRAISALS

Brad indicated he supports jointly funded appraisals, with the County and DNR agreeing on appraisers and sharing the costs of one appraisal and one review appraisal. He will confer with others at DNR to determine whether we can proceed with one set of jointly funded appraisals.

If we are able to share appraisals, we would choose five appraisers from DNR's list of approved contract appraisers. Their list includes appraisers the County commonly uses. We would ask for bids (both price and timeframe) from the five, and choose two appraisers – one to do a self contained appraisal, and a second to review that appraisal. We will also need to hire a timber cruiser to value the timber on all lands involved. The appraisers would do reports on all the lands involved in the exchange.

If we are unable to share appraisers, both the County and DNR will hire appraisers and reviewers for all properties, as well as timber cruisers. This will increase the costs for both agencies, and may lengthen the process, as there is a limited pool of qualified appraisers, and they are all busy now.

Retaining appraisers is the first step to take after we have a signed letter of intent, and can proceed as soon as the letter is signed.

KITSAP RIFLE AND REVOLVER CLUB

As lessee of a portion of the DNR lands being considered for this trade, the Club will be contacted by DNR soon after the appraiser is retained.

PUBLIC HEARING

Approximately three weeks before the self contained appraisal is completed, DNR will conduct a public meeting in Kitsap County to announce the proposed exchange and hear public testimony. It is important that County representatives appear and testify at this hearing.

NEGOTIATE PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT

When the appraisal and review are completed, the County and DNR will meet to negotiate the details of the exchange/reconveyance. The potential for grants which could defray the cost & reduce the need for reconveyance of land should be considered by the County once the appraisals are completed.

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HEARING, APPROVAL

The final package will come to the Board for review and approval.

BOARD OF NATURAL RESOURCES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

County representatives need to attend the Board of Natural Resources meeting where this exchange is presented for approval. DNR staff estimate this meeting will take place next June, if this process proceeds as typical. The length of the process will be driven primarily by the time the appraisers will require to do their work. We will make every effort to speed the process, but appraisers are busy now.

To The President and The Trustees of Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club,

I am writing to express my concerns about the direction KRRC has taken in the past few years. While my concerns cover several areas, I am concerned most specifically that KRRC and all of its facilities now appear to be run and operated for the financial benefit of one family. Not only does KRRC appear to be the sole source of income for various members of Marcus Carter's immediate family, the club and its facilities have been co-opted by Mr. Carter and his family for further financial gain through the creation of The National Firearms Institute, whose mailing address is the same as the Club's. With the VP of NFI being the VP of KRRC, and the "Academic Dean" of NFI being the Executive Officer of KRRC, and the Secretary/Treasurer of KRRC being the Executive Officer's wife (and whose e-mail address uses the same domain name as the principals of NFI), am I the only voice of concern over potential conflicts of interest?

Has any member of the governing board visited the National Firearms Institute's web site? Please visit [_http://www.gunschool.com/index.html_](http://www.gunschool.com/index.html) (<http://www.gunschool.com/index.html>) and focus on the "Training" link. There you will find not only the undeniable overlay between KRRC and NFI, but also its two main executives in a childish and shameful display of "James Bond"-style posing in tuxedos and weapons. I ask the board to consider whether or not this is an image which will be favorable to gun owners in general or to KRRC members in specific. Are we actively in the business of promoting and endorsing a mercenary-chic business? Is this an image responsible gun owners want to project? Accompanying the farcical photos is a self-aggrandizing list of "Past and Present" awards and certifications including Mr. Carter presenting himself as a FFL holder, when in fact he agreed to forfeit his FFL in lieu of prosecution some years back when he

owned Bayside Shooter's Supply. Deceit by omission is still deceit. Pretending that the disclaimer "Past and Present" covers his deception is disingenuous and cheapens the truth. And, just what is "GUNOLOGY" anyway? On a related note, of the items for sale on the KRRC web site, 24 of the 29 items listed are linked to Mr. Carter's e-mail address. Is he piggy-backing on the Club's FFL as a means of getting around the agreement he made to avoid prosecution? It certainly seem suspicious, beyond what most reasonable people would consider selling off a private collection. What liability does this attach to the Club? Even if it's technically legal, does it comport with the ethical standards we should insist on from the Club officers? We don't need BATF sniffing around because of perceived misconduct or bad faith on the part of a Club officer.

Let's presume that Mr. Carter and his son-in-law created the NFI as a revenue-generating business enterprise. I want to know, and I hope you do as well, whose interests are being represented when some outside agency inquires about range usage, KRRC's or NFI's? Given a prior questionable history with the disbursement of range usage fees from Surgical Shooters, Inc., I really wonder if it's a good idea to trust him with pretty much exclusive use and oversight of the Club's facilities. Will he arrange yet another sweet deal for himself and give the club a pittance, all the while exhorting members to contribute to the maintenance of the Club in order to satisfy his notion of what makes a member a "true" member and not just a "customer"? Has the board considered whether or not the existence of a for-profit enterprise occupying the grounds and facilities of KRRC will endanger our status as a not-for-profit club under IRS guidelines? Is our lease with Washington Dept of Natural Resources threatened by the operation of a commercial activity overlaying Club grounds and facilities? To close this paragraph, as a member in good standing of KRRC I am formally asking the KRRC President and the Trustees if Marcus Carter as Executive Officer of KRRC, or Marcus Carter/Travis Foreman doing business as NFI has arranged with any outside activity for use of the KRRC facilities, and what are the financial details of any and all such deal(s)? I am also requesting a list of all paid employees of KRRC, and all employees or members including Club Officers who receive financial remuneration from KRRC on a regular or irregular basis.

Of lesser concern, but still directly related to the Club's seemingly sole function as a livelihood for the Carter family, I want to address the issue of the "Participation Credits" program instituted by the Club. I don't concede that Marcus Carter or any of his acolytes are in a position to assess any member of the Club for any reason outside the safe handling and operation of firearms. The notion that our betters can make a demand on my time or my money above and beyond my membership payment is repugnant. It suggests an arrogance which comes with presumed power and job security. To suggest that a member who doesn't participate to Mr. Carter's satisfaction is merely a "customer", flies in the face of reason and years of precedent. If the program is deemed so important to the well being of the Club that it cannot be revoked, then surely it can be applied to new members as a condition of membership. I refer back to my earlier characterization of the Club apparently being run and operated for the financial benefit of one family, and believe this participation credit program is just one more money-grubbing enterprise by that family. Convince me I'm wrong. In the mean time, while I'm waiting for a response, I'm going to expand the reach of my concerns by infoing (blind) other Club members and asking for their input and wisdom, along with asking them to forward this letter to other Club members in their sphere of communication. I'm going to ask them to voice their concerns to the President and Trustees on their own, via whichever means they find most convenient, and ask for responses from those governing board members whose duties include the well being of the Club and resolution of membership questions.

If I had a crystal ball in front of me I'm pretty sure I would see drastically dropping membership numbers for KRRC when we non-Carter level participants are faced with a 166% increase in membership costs. Poulsbo Sportsmen's Club (\$62.50 for a family) and Gig Harbor (\$60 for a family) are gladly accepting new memberships. I am asking for the governing board to reconsider this policy and eliminate it as soon as you can prior to the coming new year's membership renewal season. In all truth, I visit KRRC less than 6 times per year, so

it would be cheaper for me to pay \$10 per visit, but it's worth the extra money to me to not have a range officer hovering over my shoulder when I do go to shoot. I, along with those members I can reach and bring to my way of thinking, will offer you \$60 for a one year membership, take it or leave it.

I am grateful for the work done by the volunteers. The improvements to the Club have not gone unnoticed, and are appreciated. That said, I'm nobody's indentured servant. My time and my money are mine to spend where and how I see fit, and such judgment is not subject to Marcus Carter's approval. I am not unaware that some in the Club's leadership and governing board view Mr. Carter as nearly the second coming of John Browning himself, but I don't feel that way, and I'm not alone. There are a number of us who feel his questionable dealings with the Navy and the Navy's contractors, along with his still-pending indictment for illegal possession of a machinegun, render him a liability to the Club, vice an asset. You, as the President and Trustees, may feel tempted to ignore this letter as the rant of a single disappointed member, a malcontent, but I'm imploring you not to. You may even be tempted to revoke my membership using some procedural trick. Again, I strongly implore you to take my concerns seriously and not take any action which may be perceived as retributive in the face of criticism and uncomfortable questioning. I am not the only member who has these concerns, and I hope to bring voice to others.

Lastly, I'd like to be clear that I want to continue my association with KRRC this year, next year, and for the foreseeable future. Nothing I've made reference to can't be fixed, I believe, to everybody's satisfaction. Please extend me the courtesy of answering the questions I've posed above and the issues I've addressed in a timely manner.

I have attached the **revised** matrix for the Silverdale Community Campus and the **new** Rolling Hills Golf Course Acquisition & LID Retrofit proposed funding strategies.

The HUD-CDBG capital funds can be used for both of these projects and as I mentioned on your voicemail message; the funding range is \$250,000 - \$300,000. Under the HUD-Economic Development funding mechanism; there is \$13,000 remaining (available) funds from 2007 and the 2008 appropriation is expected to be over \$73,000. At that time we could ask for \$50,000 - \$75,000. These federal funds can be used for design, architecture & engineering, and construction. The economic development funds have to show that jobs are created for low-income persons and the CDBG capital funds can be used for community facilities but must show that a fair share of low to middle income persons benefit as a user-base. I really don't think that is a push since the majority of Silverdale residents are young, renters, families, service folk, etc.


Mission Statement: To promote recreational shooting opportunities in a safe and educational environment.

Federal funding for hunter education and shooting ranges is derived from one-half of the 11% federal excise tax on archery equipment and 10% federal excise tax on handguns, pistols and revolvers. The federal excise tax money is distributed to the states on the basis of population, with each state receiving a maximum apportionment of 3% and a minimum of 1%.

Funds for federally-funded statewide shooting range development in Washington State vary each year. In a typical recent year, \$50,000 - \$80,000 has been available. The shooting range development program is a matching, reimbursement program. This means that grantees will first pay any costs associated with construction and materials and then later will be reimbursed for up to 75% of these costs. The remaining 25% must be provided by a local, cost-share match.

At the time of application the project sponsor must have at least 25% of the total project costs available, which serves as the sponsor match. The local share may be case, including tax sources, bond issues or other contributions. The donated value of labor, equipment and materials may also be used.

Successful project sponsors will NOT receive a cash grant at the time of project approval. Instead, project sponsors must first pay the bills and later be reimbursed for a maximum of 75% of the expenses incurred for the project according to the terms of the project agreement. Reimbursement requests may be made

- 
- Costs exceed the public shooting benefits.
 - The facility requires intensive and high-cost maintenance.
 - Fees charged at the site are excessively high when compared to fees charged at similar facilities.

Shooting Range Committee

The Shooting Range Committee (SRC)—comprised of representatives from Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife enforcement, wildlife, and hunter education programs—selects successful project applications. Using criteria and a scoring matrix identified elsewhere in this manual (See: Appendices) SRC representatives meet at least once per year to evaluate shooting range project applications.

A separate public advisory committee—comprised of citizen representatives from various shooting disciplines—also review and score all project applications and provide funding recommendations for agency SRC staff. Agency SRC represent the final authority in funding decisions.

SRC and advisory committee meetings are conducted in accordance with the Open Public Meetings act and are open to the general public. For specific meeting dates, times, and locations, please contact hunter education staff at (360) 902-8211.



How are Projects Selected?

Ranges must be open regularly to law enforcement, hunter safety classes, and the public to qualify for grants. Grant applications are evaluated in an open, competitive process by an advisory committee of ten firearms and archery representatives. The committee submits a ranked list of projects to the IAC for funding.

Funding comes from a portion (\$3) of each concealed pistol license fee.

My failure to attend does not constitute anything except my non-attendance. Period. You and the rest of the Executive Board are not authorized, nor qualified, to read anything into my non-attendance. If you intend to invoke the KRRC by-laws to revoke my club membership as a punitive action related to my no-show status at what I consider to be a kangaroo court, it is I who will seek legal remedy.

If your latest e-mail, and the pseudo-legal mish-mash in it, is any indication of the legal advice you've solicited, I think your lawyer is not an especially good one. As I have included Kitsap County Prosecutor Hauge and his capable staff in all of our correspondence, and none of them have raised any concerns with the tone of my letters. . . . well, I don't think you will have much luck pursuing a slander case. Please check with your legal adviser, remind said counselor that a slander case would be a civil case not criminal, and then ask what information my lawyer can demand from you and everyone concerned during the deposition process. I believe at that time you will reconsider your threat as being ill-advised.

Also, and this is important: I haven't made any allegations, despite your feeble attempt to link me to such actions in your e-mail. Accusing me of making allegations doesn't make it so. I have raised concerns based on my own observations, and on the concerns of others; and I have asked questions. Neither you nor any of your compatriots on the executive board whose duty is to the well-being of KRRC has bothered to address any of the concerns or answer any questions.

I truly wish you hadn't threatened me with cheap legalese (please do yourself a favor and look up the definition of "remand" before you "remand me again"). I truly wish you had merely answered the questions posed, and given me a straight response to the concerns I raised with you. If this is how you deal with questions from members, it really does make me wonder what you are hiding. Why not just answer the questions if everything is legitimate? Are KRRC members not allowed to know what business dealings the Executive Board has entered into? Are KRRC members not allowed to question the actions of the leadership without threats of legal action?

At such time as I do agree to meet with you, who will guarantee my safety? Given the belligerent and threatening tone of your latest e-mail, I no longer feel safe around you or the others in KRRC leadership. How about instead of meeting at KRRC, we meet at a neutral location where I will have a better opportunity to ensure my personal safety?

I am now formally requesting that the entire un-edited text of this e-mail and all the others between us (also un-edited), in their correct chronological order, be published in the next KRRC Newsletter. As the September/October newsletter has not yet been released, it should be an easy matter to include these for consideration by the whole of our membership, vice just the Executive Board.
