Judy, I went out to Camp Wesley Harris with NBK SECO today to check out the new shoot house and noticed that a portion of the fence was cut across the street.

I took the Newberry Hill exit off 3 south, turn right (away from Silverdale) go all until it dead ends into Seabeck Hwy (approx 3 miles). Turn left on Seabeck Hwy go about 2.5 miles and the Camp Wesley Harris (CWH) is on both sides. Easy to miss look for GOV Property signs.

The spot where the fence is cut is on the far left (east) side of the road. Turn left at the first road at the south border of the installation and approx 100 yards up you will see there was a road there and the fence has been cut and the sign was down.

I tried to put the top span of wire back up by hand along with the sign but it will need to be repaired. If EJB has a hard time finding it have them call me and I will try to explain better.

Hi Dereck!

Thanks for coming and again supporting injured Marines, Sailors and their families.

As far as the scoring, your right that in pistol you had only 3 FTE's, however when you have an FTE (Failure to Engage), you also chalk up 2 misses, and then also a FTN (Failure to Neutralize).

That's 4, +5 second penalties per target that you don't engage. So, 3 targets x 4 penalties per target = 12 - +5 second penalties.

Same for Rifle...7 FTE's + 14 misses + 7 FTN's = 28 +5 second penalties and 1 no-shoot at +10.

Each target must be (1) engaged, (2) hit twice, (3) neutralized. Failure to perform any of these will incur +5 second penalties.

Does that make sense? The scores appear correct.

Thanks for putting on a good match again this year. I appreciate you getting the individual match results online--we are waiting the final tallies with anticipation.

I have a concern about two of my scores and they are probably my lack of knowledge on how to score.

First, if you could please check my House Clearing 101 pistol score. I remember only having 3 FTE's and no no-shoots, yet my score online was 12- 5 second penalties totalling 60. Is this correct?

Second, the same stage on rifle I remember I had 7 FTE's (ouch) and 1 no shoot yet my score reflects a 28-5 second penalties totalling 140. Is this correct? I understand the no shoot is a 10 sec penalty.

I figured if I received 2 FTE's per missed target (10 sec penalty) and 1 miss per target (10 sec penalty) then the numbers would jive but not annotated in the 10 second penalty column. Sorry for any hassle!!!

Again, we had a great time and I already have other Officers showing interest for next year, thanks for all you hard work and dedication to put this on... bye for now.

More Kitsapers Packing Heat for Their Peace of Mind

SEABECK -- In Julian Piercy's mind, the small bulge in his shirt near his lower back is a way of "leveling a situation."

The clip that he fastens to his waist band before leaving the house isn't just another accessory. It gives him an option, he said, when all others are off the table and a life is on the line.

When he feels the pressure of metal on his back, it gives him confidence that he has a chance of protecting those he cares about most.

"As a parent, I am the first line of defense for my children," he said. "Not the police."

Piercy, a nursing student at Olympic College, lifts his shirt to reveal a .45-caliber Springfield XD, a black semi-automatic handgun that weighs about 30 ounces when loaded. He carries constantly with a few exceptions — mostly when he's on campus and prohibited from doing so.

Having carried in his younger days because, frankly, he could, Piercy, 38, has once again obtained a license to carry a concealed weapon and is getting used to the feel of carrying again.

"The gun doesn't make me invincible, smarter, or tougher than anyone else," he said. "It's merely there as a tool."

Spurred by fear of a violent attack — or because they have actually survived one — more Washingtonians are getting a concealed pistol license. The license, or CPL, allows them to travel with a hidden gun among an unknowing public. License holders jumped from about 179,000 to 258,000, 43 percent, between 2003 and 2007. The state Department of Licensing says permit applications in Kitsap County jumped from 1,587 in 2004 to 3,339 in 2007.

Federal buildings, courthouses, military installations, bars, schools and airports are off limits to concealed weapons, but they are allowed in most other public areas. In fact, Washington's constitution permits its residents to "open carry" with a gun on their hip in public, but many gun owners choose to apply for the CPL and keep their weapon hidden.

"Nobody knows," said Jim Wamsher, 52, of Port Orchard, who carries a Kimber 1911 on his hip. "And that's

the whole idea."

Wamsher believes he has a "moral obligation" to protect his family and the community. But he acknowledges that carrying also gives him an obligation to be well-trained with his weapon.

There is no training requirement to get a concealed pistol license, however. To be eligible in Washington, residents must have no felony or domestic violence misdemeanor convictions, or any warrants for their arrest. They must pass nationwide and local criminal background checks. But they don't have to state a reason for getting a license.

But many who do subscribe to the mantra: "When seconds count, the police are just minutes away."

"It's like a seat belt," said April Borbon, 41, a business owner in Central Kitsap. "Hopefully I'll never need it. And if I do, it'll be a life or death situation."

Eugene Volokh, a law professor at the University of California at Los Angeles, said those considering carrying concealed weapons are not necessarily analyzing the crime rate when they decide to apply for a license.

Aggravated assaults in Kitsap County did increase from 655 to 743 between 2006 and 2007, according to the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs, but Volokh said that may not be the deciding factor for CPL holders.

"I think (CPL holders) ask themselves 'What's the cost of this to me, and what's the benefit to me,'" he said. "It's very little cost to them, but they feel very comfortable with guns and carrying one gives them confidence."

GET A CPL, THWART A CRIMINAL?

But do concealed pistol holders actually make society safer, a kind of armed public service?

Mark Duncan, deputy police chief on Bainbridge Island, said that's a difficult question to answer. An easier question for him is whether they make society more dangerous. His answer is no.

"The cases of someone misusing their concealed pistol license are virtually unheard of," he said.

Dean Byrd, chief deputy with the Mason County Sheriff's Office, goes further.

"Sometimes that's what people have to rely on," Byrd said of CPL holders in rural parts of the county he patrols, "because law enforcement may be a long ways away."

Duncan, who added that he carries "everywhere I go," including when he's off-duty, said those who get a concealed pistol license see themselves as having a "sacred responsibility."

Volokh said he believes there is a deterrent effect with having a population that carries concealed pistols.

"Rapists aren't the most rational creatures," he begins. "But if they think, 'Maybe I'll be shot dead if I do this,' they'll probably think twice about it."

Kristen Comer, executive director for Washington Ceasefire, a gun control advocacy group, questions whether having more people carrying concealed pistols results in greater public safety. But she does concede that it might be true among weapons carriers who are trained and know the "gravity" of their undertaking. She cites a Texas law that requires concealed license holders to go through two days of training.

But that training shouldn't be limited to target practice, she said. If one pulls his weapon and shoots, "You have to be willing to live with whatever consequence follows," she said.

Reserving the use of a gun for life-and-death situations — and spotting them — is what Marcus Carter, executive officer at the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club, attempts to instill in everyone he teaches.

Carter's classes include instruction on the legalities of carrying. He can cite from memory numerous articles of the Constitution — both the U.S. and Washington's version. Their amendments on the right to bear arms come most easily to his mind.

But just as he believes in guns, he believes in gun safety. He snagged the domain name "gunsafety.org" for the club's Web site several years ago.

"If you're going to carry a firearm, you have a responsibility to train with it," he said.

Doug Hartley, 52, agrees.

"I'm not a vigilante, and I don't want to chase down robbers," he said. "The idea is to never have to use it."

Hartley is a Bainbridge resident and high school teacher who carries away from school and belongs to the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club. "You're better off running away if you can avoid the situation."

But Hartley believes that those with CPLs who are well-trained can help keep crime rates and incidents of violence down.

"I think as a whole, society is safer," he said. "If people have the weapons and use them responsibly, and the

criminals know that, they'll do less of this stupid stuff."

Carter, too, sees an upswing in the numbers coming to the club for training. He points to many reasons — a slumping economy or an upcoming election with fewer "pro-gun" candidates, for example — that prompt people to take their Second Amendment rights more seriously.

He said there's been a steady influx of women, who typically are outnumbered by their male counterparts in gun use, at the club. In Kitsap County, home to a large and often out-to-sea Naval population, those women left behind are apt to get trained with a firearm.

CARRYING ON CAMPUS

The most heated issue recently concerning carrying concealed weapons occurred in the Legislature this past session with the introduction of two bills.

Ed Murray, D-Seattle, tried to ban guns from any campus that hosts high school students, such as at Olympic College, which hosts the Running Start program for high school juniors and seniors. Pam Roach, R-Auburn, also introduced a bill aimed at prohibiting colleges and universities from banning CPL holders from carrying on campus. There is no state law — only college policy — keeping weapons off campus.

Olympic College, with its campuses in Bremerton, Poulsbo and Shelton, bans all weapons and explosives from being carried on campus, according to Richard MacLennan, OC's vice president of student services.

Roach, who herself has a concealed-weapons permit, said she supports having carriers on campus because the mentality of a shooter "is to hone in on places that people are the most defenseless."

"The reality is these scenarios are never good ones," she said. "But potentially we have 258,000 people out there who can save people from dying. The issue is how many lives can be saved."

'YOU CAN'T COUNT ON HELP BEING THERE'

Two common factors triggered the CPL holders interviewed for this story to get their licenses: they had familiarity with firearms, either from their upbringing or in their profession; or they'd either been frightened by or experienced a violent situation.

South Kitsap resident Bill Williams' home had been burglarized twice before a group of crooks invaded his home and robbed him in 2000.

It was "an attack on my person by some people that thought they had a right to take my car and property just because there were more of them than me," he said. "They wanted to get the easy way what I worked hard for." That was the last straw for Williams, who now carries — inside a belt or shoulder holster — various guns, from a small revolver to a .45-caliber automatic colt pistol.

"Mike" in North Kitsap — who asked that his last name not be used because many of his relatives would disapprove of his gun ownership — cites violent outbursts around the country as his rationale to carry.

Mike got his concealed pistol license about four years ago and carries a .45-caliber Glock (he has a smaller 9 millimeter for when he's wearing lighter clothes or is in the company of his "anti-gun" relatives). He carried intermittently until the Virginia Tech massacre, in which 32 people died when a gunman shot up classrooms in a building and then killed himself.

"It was then that I realized that you can't count on help being there when you need it. You're only guaranteed a chance when you are able to defend yourself," he said.

Schools:

See RCW 9.41.280, (3) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to: (e) Any person in possession of a pistol who has been issued a license under RCW 9.41.070, or is exempt from the licensing requirement by RCW 9.41.060, while picking up or dropping off a student;

Airport:

See RCW 9.41.300, Subsection (1 e) The restricted access areas of a commercial service airport designated in the airport security plan approved by the federal transportation security administration, including passenger screening checkpoints at or beyond the point at which a passenger initiates the screening process. These areas do not include airport drives, general parking areas and walkways, and shops and areas of the terminal that are outside the screening checkpoints and that are normally open to unscreened passengers or visitors to the airport. Any restricted access area shall be clearly indicated by prominent signs indicating that firearms and other weapons are prohibited in the area.

See RCW 9.41.300, See section (1 b) In addition, the local legislative authority shall provide either a stationary locked box sufficient in size for pistols and key to a weapon owner for weapon storage, or shall designate an official to receive weapons for safekeeping, during the owner's visit to restricted areas of the building. The locked box or designated official shall be located within the same building used in connection with court proceedings. The local legislative authority shall be liable for any negligence causing damage to or loss of a

weapon either placed in a locked box or left with an official during the owner's visit to restricted areas of the building.

Lori started this informational meeting by introducing herself as the Parks Stewardship Coordinator.

Coordinating Efforts

Lori said she would like to establish a fresh start to the volunteer process on this land and county-wide to assure maximum project coordination and to ensure that all volunteers are registered with the County. The process includes having each volunteer complete a liability release form, pre-approving all volunteer projects, making sure each volunteer using power tools has been trained in their use, and tracking volunteer time. Lori explained that since the County assumes the liability for all registered volunteers and County park lands, all of this is a requirement of Kitsap County.

Limits of County Parks Dept. Coordination

Lori stated that the meeting was about coordinating volunteers on land owned by the County Parks Department at Newberry Hill. Unfortunately, County Parks does not yet own the DNR land just south of Newberry Hill Park and the school. Therefore, it was not possible for Lori to address questions regarding management and access to that land. Lori also shared that County Parks is not ready to enter into a management plan for the property at this time because of the pending parcel expansion. [*see below for details about the expansion*]

Coordinating Training and Certifications Across Agencies

As one attendee offered, it might be possible to coordinate with DNR in the training offered in order to avoid duplication, since the DNR has already registered some of the volunteers and has previously offered safety training. Lori thought this was an excellent idea and will check into it.

Another person mentioned the possibility of inviting a tool manufacturer representative to perform safety training on the tools being used, such as a Stihl chainsaw. This person also suggested that the County train a volunteer to train and checkout volunteers on power equipment. Lori thought this was an excellent idea and will contact our Risk Manager and Maintenance Supervisor for approval.

Land Ownership and Potential Park Expansion

At this point in the meeting, Parks and Recreation Department Director Chip Faver was introduced and fielded questions from the audience.

Chip was asked to clarify the reconveyance – or land exchange. What is happening? Which lands are involved? What will the uses be?

Chip described the long-term vision for a potential land exchange with DNR to create a larger park at Newberry Hill that would include the current DNR and School Trust land (currently managed by DNR) located south of Newberry Hill Park and the school. The land being proposed was long ago purchased from DNR with grant funds then fell back into DNR ownership and now that the land is no longer useful for DNR timber management, they proposed the reconveyance. Chip explained that the County is 80 acres short on land for the reconveyance and that we're working on a solution. The DNR is willing to wait for the County to work through the process of eventually owning the land and is not at this time interested in developing the land.

Chip added that this proposed land exchange follows County Park's comprehensive plan for open space acquisition.

Helen Daly mentioned that approximately 10 years ago, the DNR was interested in selling the land.

Chip is hoping the timeline for this process is months instead of years, and will be working toward this goal.

Future Uses at the Park

Chip explained to the audience that this eventual County Parks-owned property would be restricted for the public's passive recreational use and enjoyment, and will help to provide environmental protection/buffer from development. Chip explained the eventual public process that would establish the user groups for this land and hopes to include all interested user groups within the parameters of the Kitsap County Comprehensive Plan and the Parks and Recreation mission statement.

Chip also commented that current uses on the DNR land are not guaranteed to remain when the County completes the Master Plan of the property. However, he also stressed that the County will work with businesses and individuals during the planning process. He encouraged all interested parties to get involved with the Master Planning process when that time comes.

On the subject of motorized uses Chip answered that we considering motorized vehicles into one of our parks but there is no plan to add motorized uses to this park.

Community Involvement

Mark Fisher introduced himself and spoke of his interest to preserve the land for passive use by the public. He spoke about his enjoyment of building trails and paying attention to the types of soils and environs offered within the park and would like to encourage all users to be involved with the maintenance of the property.

Chip stated that he would shift his use of language to name the user groups "stakeholders", because this is a better description of the citizens involved with the property.

Chip invited the public to attend the Park and Recreation Advisory Council meetings to stay informed on Park issues. The meetings were announced to occur the 3rd Wednesday of the month and locations to rotate from north, central, and south county locations. Locations are listed on the County website.

Mark also suggested to the audience that they might be interested in attending the next DNR meeting to be held in Belfair at the Timberland Library next Thursday at 6:00pm. The DNR will be discussing recreational sustainability.

Healthy Skepticism

An audience member communicated some skepticism in regards to government agencies and their plans for the property. Chip answered that a little skepticism when dealing with government agencies is healthy and the outcome of honest discussions makes the government work product better. He added that that the County will facilitate the public process for the community to express their opinions for the use of this land.

The audience was thanked for attending this meeting, and the meeting was adjourned at approximately 11:30 am.

First, there have been no new signs put up in at least 5 years. Multiple eyes in the woods will agree to this.

Looking at the trail, moving wood on the ground, out of the way is not removing natural barriers. Plus the expanse of wetland between the range and the woods is not a barrier. This trail has existed for many years and recently cleaned up. Rounds made it past the 'barrier' across the road, and into lands not part of the lease.

These are school trust lands managed by the DNR only. Which is they do nothing.

Can you provide us the coordinates, text of your lease, so the county and all others involved with this now and in the future will have actual information.

All of this makes no difference. I don't see the organization addressing the problem. The only issue is why there were multiple shots coming from the club or from the direction of the club. Zero rounds making it past the berm is what gun safety is all about.

Here's the information you requested. I thought the back stops were probably no longer functioning correctly and letting the high powered shots through.

I sent you the actual GPS track. I punched waypoint 004 after the first shot. The rest of the shots all happened within minutes/seconds of that one. (there was another person firing a handgun at the same time, but the big blasts (rifle) were coming through the woods.)

The fifth waypoint is at the gate of the gun club.

My location Waypoint: N47.61098 W122.74704 Waypoint was set at: 1:44 PM
27OCT08

Seven shots with three different sounds (all shots except the ricochet continued on north from my location). I thought the speed of the bullet had been slowed down considerably since the sound of the gun fire happened almost instantaneously with the sound of the bullets coming through the trees. I was 1100 foot north of the shooting range almost directly down range.

a) 4 shots hit tree limbs and could be heard coming through the woods

b) 2 shots whistled through the air with a high pitch whine (these were the most un-nerving). Two distinct sounds, 1) the movement through the air, and 2) the whistle of the bullet.

c) 1 shot hit something in the woods/ground and had a distinct ricochet sound.



I am writing to urge you to oppose the rezoning plans of Gig Harbor's Olympic Property Group and the Gig Harbor Gun Club.

As a resident, I am strongly concerned about the effects of gunfire on our area. Personally, I find the sound offensive and nerve-racking. Currently, we hear them during hunting season. And, my neighbors and I take it in stride since it is for just a portion of the year.

Our area is a relatively quiet, family oriented community. We love our children. Most of us have chosen to commute to our jobs so our children can grow up in a quiet, natural environment. We embrace the wildlife we are fortunate enough to glimpse on occasion. We are even fortunate enough to have several endangered and threatened species living in our area. I have personally seen bald eagles, a river otter and a western pond turtle. What will happen to our peaceful environment if gunshots are allowed to be a constant part of the acoustics? I have done some research since learning about the proposed gun club. The studies of noise on the human brain yield distressing conclusions.

The Carnegie Corporation has discovered that brain development is much more vulnerable to environmental influence than ever before suspected. The influence of early environment on brain development is long lasting. Dr. Jane Healy further explains this stating, "environmental experiences significantly shape the developing brain because of the plasticity of its neuronal connectivity." She further shares that we are seeing "an 'epidemic' of attention deficit disorder, behavioral problems, faltering academic abilities, language difficulties...and weak problem-solving skills."

David Tame and Steven Halpern independently explain that exposure to repeated loud noises induces a perpetual "startle" or "fight or flight" response in children as well as adults, leading to tensed muscles, fatigue, diminished reflex responsiveness, and accident proneness. Other physical responses to noise include headaches, tension, high blood pressure, hyperactivity, poor digestion, decreased immunity and neurological disorders. Inability to concentrate, irritability, poor sleep, poor work performance, and reduced mental acuity can also result.

Does this sound like a healthy environment for our families? It's not the kind of noise pollution I want my family to be exposed to.

Please do everything in your power to oppose the rezoning for the Gig Harbor Gun Club to move to our area.

My family and I live in the Tiger lake area . We moved here to enjoy the quiet rural area . We frequently enjoy the passing of deer , bear and many other types of wild life through our property. The noise from the proposed gun range will not only disturb our pets but will drive wild life out of the area. This combined with the constant noise will severely diminish our quality of living. I am also concerned about my ability to sell our home in the future. The constant high noise level will drive our property value down and cost us real dollars if we choose to sell our property. This could put us in a situation where we want to move to a quieter area but the noise level would preclude us from selling our hard earned property for its previous value. This gun club will cost every homeowner in the area thousands of dollars . If you doubt this, ask the folks who live in the area of the gun club in Gig Harbor.

I would also like to address the wetlands located in the middle of the proposed rezone property. The wet land is fed by natural springs and runoff from the surrounding hills . The wet land consists of two large ponds and a huge marsh area that feeds down through the logging exclusion area , down to a creek and then into the Union River and then directly into Puget sound. This area is not logged because the state is required to protect natural wet lands. These areas have a buffer 100 feet around them that cannot be logged under the current zoning. This restriction is in place to protect the environmental cleanliness and vitality of this wet land area. 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
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

Areas Open for Review. The following types of proposals will be considered in this annual review of the plan:

- o Site Specific Amendment Requests located within the Manchester Village Limited Area of More Intensive Rural Development. (LAMIRD).

Who does this Effect?

Citizens located within the Manchester Village Limited Area of More Intensive Rural Development (LAMIRD).

Inquiry Process

Question: **Can I apply for a re-zone? How?** (Also known as a site specific amendment application)

OR

How do I get the zoning on my lot/property changed? (i.e. I have 9.8 acres but my zoning only allows 1 house per 10 acres, and I want to sub-divide/put 2 houses on the land, so I want to request this "exception")

Answer: In 2008, the Board of County Commissioners limited all re-zones/site specific applications to the Manchester area (LAMIRD). THIS MEANS:

- o If you do not live within the Manchester LAMIRD (Limited Area of More Intensive Rural Development), you MAY NOT apply for a re-zone/Site Specific Application in 2008.
- o If you do live within the Manchester LAMIRD, they will need to submit a completed 2008 Comprehensive Plan Amendment Pre-Application Meeting Request to begin the process. (Download from Internet or come in and pick up)
 - 2008 Comp Plan Amendment Site Specific Pre-Application Meeting Request (REQUIRED)
 - 2008 Comp Plan Amendment Site Specific Application (You must have attended a Pre-App Meeting before your application will be accepted.)

Legally, the BoCC does not have to allow any Site Specifics, but this is the first time that the BoCC has put any specific geographic restrictions on who can apply for them, so people might be a little agitated.

Question: **So what am I supposed to do?**

Answer: You can wait until 2009, to see if the Board of County Commissioners decides to lift the restrictions for your area.

If they want more, they can send a request to their specific Commissioner and ask them to support opening up the Site Specifics to include their community/area/etc.


No Support

Contacted the Bill McKenney with the City of Bremerton. They had recently performed some clearing within the City's watershed, however, all trees had been marketed. There were a few stragglers along the haul roads that he offered for our use. However, we would have had to mobilize equipment to each location to load and haul. It was determined that this option was cost prohibitive and would have taken considerable time.

Contacted Pope Resources. They did not have any trees down at the time but, with some research, could have found some trees within areas of their right-of-way/easements. It would have taken considerable time to acquire the trees necessary for this project.

Tom Bumsted with KCM/Tetra Tech, our consultant on the project, had a source for LWD somewhere on the east side of Puget Sound. The exact location escapes me now. Tom received a general price quote for the trees, including loading and delivery costs. Can't remember the exact price quote at this time but it was determined to be exorbitant.

Signed a P.O. with SAW Enterprises for 40 trees from clearing activities at the Clear Creek Gun Club site on Clear Creek Road. The trees were readily available, at a reasonable cost (\$325 each) and within reasonably close proximity to the project site.

Signed a P.O. with Robert Ross for 70 trees (and another 50 for the Clear Creek Bridge). The trees came from clearing activities for a residential plat in Seabeck. This site was even closer to the project site and the cost was comparable (+- \$300 per tree).
