Dear Mr. Brown,

A few weeks ago Gail Gross and myself had an appointment with you to discuss the increasingly loud gun noise from KRRC. We mentioned the Navy was shooting their and this is against any of the conditions I've read about the deal the County worked with the Club.

You were nice enough to call the Commanding Office at Bangor to check on whether the Navy was sending their personnel their to shoot. I believe you were told no. **On KRRC web site they show four days this week Navy scheduled shooting. It's not just a couple guys. On Thursday and Friday they are scheduled from 10:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. On Monday and Tuesday they're scheduled 8:00 to 4:00.**

This is not a few isolated guys coming out to shoot or adjust their sights. They are firing large caliber weapons repeatedly. This would be a good time for you to check it out.

I've been doing some reading and would like to find out more on petitioning to create a "No Shooting area" where the KRRC is located. The County has grown up around this range and what they did in the past is just no longer acceptable to the residents. From what I've seen the deal with the Gun Club clearly states they were to continue as they have in the past. **In the past they were a small rifle and revolver club with a small membership. They are now public and have increased their firing power by allowing the military to shoot.**

Forty years ago, even twenty years ago Kitsap County was relatively small and the club probably didn't interfere with many residents. The deal the County worked out with this Club clearly did not take into consideration the development around the club and the impact the noise would have.

There must be a solution to this growing problem. We are growing number of concerned citizens who would like very much to work with you and other Commissioners and County agencies to solve this before it get totally out of hand. The constant gun shot noise is damaging to the peace and quite all the residents of Kitsap County deserve. Surely the need of the many out way the need of a select few.

I look forward to continuing this conversation. Please contact me to set up another meeting at your convenience.





Information Requested

How does the prosecutors office interface with the Department of Community Development (DCD) and the Wa. State Interagency Office for Recreation (IAC) where probable major violations of County code, permit requirements, land use and critical area ordinances have occurred and where it appears that false information was provided the IAC in order to receive public grant funds totaling about \$50,000? Specifically and very briefly, Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) submitted permit application in 2005 for major construction and expansion of the Club's facilities. DCD provided requirements necessary to be met for permit approval to KRRC. KRRC appealed requirements, appeal was denied. KRRC withdrew permit application and started construction without permits. DCD investigated complaints, ordered all construction at KRRC stop until required permits and civil engineering reviews were obtained. KRRC simply shifted work to a different part of the range and submitted amended grant request to IAC to cover new work area. Construction at KRRC has continued to present time. KRRC submitted certification to IAC under grant #03-1156 stating that all requirements for permit and critical area ordinances have been met and received the grant funding.

County records confirm that required permits were not approved and documents agreement by the DCD and DNR that major violations of county code and lease contract requirements have occurred. There are documents in County records that indicate DCD has been ineffective in addressing complaints and applying provisions of County Code at KRRC equally and uniformly as to any other entity in the county because of political pressure. If DCD continues to be unresponsive or unable to enforce code requirements at KRRC, at what point would the Prosecutors Office become involved? Is submittal to the IAC of information known to be false (KRRC officers who went thru the permit application process are the same folks who signed the grant application and certifications) to obtain public funds in a situation such as this a civil or criminal offense, or just aggressive but really o.k. business practices? Can I, as a private citizen request Prosecutors Office to investigate this situation?

Reason for request or inquiry/comments

Construction projects at KRRC have resulted in my home and 5 others being directly down range and less than 200 yards from new firing lines and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards down range from firing bays. Automatic weapons fire at the range has become an almost daily occurrence. This situation presents extreme and potentially lethal hazards to the health, safety, and welfare of adjacent residents. The addition of range lights have changed usage of the range from historic daylight hours only to 15 or more hours daily. Grading, ditching, fill, altering topography of the range has resulted in significant environmental impact, including appearing to be the cause of changes in levels and flow patterns of adjacent wetlands and creating a high probability that lead and other heavy metals will be introduced into the wetlands. These wetlands form the headwaters of Chico Creek. There are a number of other associated problems, all of which are documented in County, DNR, and /or IAC records.

Complaints and requests for action to DCD and County Commissioners to apply and enforce existing provisions of County Code applicable to the activities at KRRC have to date been ineffective; to DNR just generated lots of paper requests for action flowing to the County and KRRC, none of which were answered or resolved; to IAC resulted in receiving a copy of the grant contract that states meeting code and ordinance requirements are the responsibility of the grantee, discusses sanctions that may apply and suggests that I work with County officials to resolve the problems; requests by IAC to KRRC for copies of building permits for grant records went unanswered; to KRRC gets the answer that "we haven't changed anything, the range has always been this way"; my public disclosure request to Commissioner Brown for information on actions he had taken that resulted in DCD planning department being told via e-mail to not worry about complaints at KRRC because he had taken care of it went unanswered. Does this sound like a situation which could/should be addressed by in-place County assets such as your office and the DCD, or is it a situation that must be addressed through outside agencies? Help!

Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has:

- Cleared and graded at least 2 additional acres of land
- Added/moved eight thousand (8,000) cubic yards fill
- Added 12 new covered shooting stations and baffles
- Installed eight hundred (800) feet of 24" culvert
- Installed 600 amp commercial electrical service
- Documented more than 350 hours of heavy earth moving equipment work at the range
- Installed an unspecified quantity of asphalt paving
- Added additional "event parking" areas
- Done extensive berm and baffle "grooming" and restructuring
- Plus more

This information is extracted from documents submitted by KRRC to the Washington State Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation (IAC) in grant 03-1156. KRRC has received \$71,858 in public and matching funds for this work, and has another grant (09-1430) totaling \$109,000 approved by the IAC to continue expansion of the Club range facilities. IAC contracts require KRRC to comply with all local code and ordinances. County records do not support KRRC's statements to IAC that all required permit and code requirements have been met. County records document and affirm repeated major violations of County Code, and of lease contract requirements from when the range was still owned by DNR.

Construction at the range has been in progress since mid-'05 and continues to date.


Kitsap County has in its' records a reasonably detailed record of complaints and investigations of construction and expansion activities at the range, including permit applications submitted by KRRC, requirements for construction provided to KRRC by the County, appeals of the requirements by KRRC and re-confirmation of requirements by the County. The County has issued verbal stop work orders and a written requirement for all work at the site to stop until proper land use and civil engineering permits are acquired. DNR and IAC have also repeatedly directed and required KRRC to obtain and submit copies of required permits. All have been ignored by KRRC.

This round of construction has placed 6 homes less than 200 yards, and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards directly down range from new firing lines and bays. Automatic weapons fire at the range has become a routine, almost daily occurrence. Addition of even more range lighting has significantly increased the after-dark use of the range. Club member parking outside the range along Seabeck Hwy. frequently reduces the highway to one and a half lanes, creating hazardous traffic conditions.

Aerial photos show new berms and baffles have been arranged so that sound is focused directly toward my home. The photos also show major changes in the wetlands on the north side of the range and into the Newberry Hill Heritage Park lands. This area forms the headlands of Chico Creek. Drainage from the range appears to have been diverted directly into the wetlands, potentially carrying large quantities of water transportable lead particulate and oxides of heavy metals into the creek headwaters.

KRRC's apparent reckless disregard of land use and site development requirements have resulted in major impact on the health, safety, and welfare of surrounding residents and the local environment.

I request the County take action as defined in at least four sections of County Code to investigate and require correction of code violations at KRRC. I request to be informed of County actions as allowed by County Code section 21.04.100.

Commissioners

This is not about guns. It is about public safety, health, welfare, protection of the environment, and equal application of the rule of law in Kitsap County.

In simple terms, and as briefly as possible, Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) is now and has been for the past 5 years in violation of written orders from the County to stop all construction at KRRC until all required permit, land use, and critical area ordinance requirements have been met. KRRC has ignored the County's orders and has made major changes to the club range. KRRC certified to the Wa. State Interagency Office for Recreation (IAC, also referred to as RCO) that all County requirements have been met and has received about \$50,000 in publicly funded grants to pay for construction at the range. County records do not support KRRC's claim. Another grant totaling \$109,000 from IAC has been approved to continue construction, expansion, realignment at the range. County officials are aware of this, and detailed documentation exists in County records to support these facts. Piecemeal expansion and construction at KRRC has resulted in an even greater negative cumulative effect on nearby residents and the environment because no controls, constraints, or conformance inspections have ever been applied.

This latest round of construction

- has added a number of new firing lines and bays that are aimed directly at adjacent homes south and west of KRRC instead of away from these homes as is the case with the original and long established firing lines. This new alignment, plus the almost daily indiscriminate automatic weapons fire at KRRC presents a potentially lethal hazard to area residents. Noise levels outside the range have increased by orders of magnitude. This also will greatly affect public use of the Newberry Hill Heritage Park as aerial photos show new firing lines have also been built north of the pre-existing lines.
- has added even more outdoor range lighting, allowing the range to be used anytime members want instead of being restricted to the previous and historic daylight hours only. In August 2006, KRRC rejected a County requirement to obtain a conditional use permit that would require, among other things, evaluation of and authorization for range lights and extended hours of operation and address automatic weapons use at the range.
- The magnitude of construction done at KRRC and reported by KRRC to IAC far exceeds that defined in County code as a major development with attendant requirements for engineering evaluation and other controls. KRRC claims an in-house range design expert, whose credentials seem to consist of a certificate of attendance to an unidentified range operation and development conference and lots of time at shooting competitions, designed the range to improve sound attenuation and safety. The range does contain lots of pretty piles of dirt, and has a very nice new ADA ramp, but seems to lack basic consideration or understanding for the principals of geometry, ballistics, acoustics, hydrology, or environmental protection.
- Restructuring of the topography and drainage of the range appears to have caused major changes in the dynamics of the Chico Creek wetland areas adjoining and north of the range. A hazardous materials inspection of the range and wetlands areas by Kitsap County Health District performed in July 09 was embarrassingly superficial. No samples were taken for even baseline analysis; the inspector accepted statements from KRRC personnel that they had an effective lead and hazardous materials control program even though no records exist to support that claim. A very cursory review of industry standard practices, using data published by KRRC, indicates that significant percentage of several tons per year of water transportable particulate lead and other heavy metals and oxides are available for introduction into the Chico Creek drainage.

All this information exists in much greater detail in County, IAC, and DNR records. KRRC has a well-documented recent history of ignoring and/or obstructing attempts by the County and State to apply and enforce the laws, rules, and ordinances of the County and State to activities at the range. Complaints and requests for action to various County officials, including Commissioners, from private citizens and DNR

officials, have went unanswered since mid-2007. Local resident's interest and involvement in development and use of the Heritage Park has regenerated a determination and absolute necessity to get KRRC in compliance with the same laws and rules designed to apply to and to protect all residents instead of allowing one small group's limited and parochial interests to supersede and supplant the rights of others. I can't imagine the County tolerating the contempt and complete disregard for county code demonstrated by KRRC's actions from, for example, some company building a commercial go-cart racing track, so why is it acceptable for a gun range where the potential for disaster and the expectations for compliance to the law is so much greater?

I request the County Commissioners to direct and support the appropriate county departments to investigate and enforce, as necessary and warranted, county code, land use and critical areas ordinances and other laws as they apply to KRRC.

I request to be informed of any action taken, including non-action on this request, as provided for in County Code section 21.04.100.



Summary: Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has significantly altered/modified their range facilities on Seabeck Hwy. over the past couple of years. These alterations/modifications are a major departure from traditional and historic usage of the range and have been done without approval or permit. Range alteration/modification completed and still in progress is in violation of county code and the terms of KRRC's lease with DNR. County planners and code enforcement personnel have been limited in the performance of their duties relating to KRRC by undue outside influence. All the above is clearly and unequivocally documented in county records. These alterations/modifications present an immediate hazard to the safety and health of my family and have deprived us of the right to use and enjoy our home as we did for 15+ years previous to the changes. I request the county take immediate, decisive, and effective action to correct this situation.

Discussion: I recently had the opportunity to review and copy county records relating to KRRC through a public records disclosure request (PDR). Violations of county code and the provisions of KRRC's lease with DNR concerning safety and the unregulated expansion and modification of the range facilities are substantive and well documented or referenced in county records. Problems with noise are a bit more subjective, but county code certainly specifies the required standards. The county on several occasions has identified the requirements for work done at the range to club officials. Club officials have repeatedly ignored or denied county input.

Issues with the KRRC all have been within the last couple of years. Complaints about the club have all been in that same time frame, and have all been from long-time residents of the area who have experienced the before and after problems resulting from modifications of the range firing lines and bays. We wouldn't be where we are now if it weren't for the efforts of a very small handful of club officers and members to change the way the range has operated for a lot of years into something that is of benefit to their interests without regard to the impact on the neighborhood.

KRRC now requires members to donate labor, materials, or money for projects at the range in addition to club dues as a condition of membership. Through these "donations", much of the work identified in KRRC's grant request for \$50,000 from the IAC has been completed or is in progress., including improvements in lighting, electrical service, access, and moving several hundred cubic yards of dirt to create new berms and firing

areas. There still have been no reviews, evaluations, approvals, or permits for any of this work.

Following your meeting on 1 May '07 with KRRC officials, a DCD senior planner, in an interdepartmental e-mail dated 5 May '07, ask the question "Because we still have complaints what do we tell the public?". The answer says "Joyce called...she said Comm Brown talked to Larry about it and everything has been handled. Said don't worry about it..". I assume Larry refers to Larry Keeton, Director of DCD. I also assume that whatever action you took is a matter of public record. However, there was nothing in the records as of 12 June '07 indicating what that action may be. Since I'm not real sure of where that record would be located, I have enclosed a PDR requesting that information be made available to me. Mr. Pat Hennessy, the lease manager at DNR, in an e-mail dated 23 April '07, stated he would request a written summary from the County to document code compliance or tasks required to insure compliance by KRRC. I have included a request for that summary in my PDR. I would appreciate it if you would have your staff direct the PDR to the right place.

My concerns remain the same. I want to be able to allow my grandkids and their friends to play outside in my yard without the feeling that I'm sending them out in the receiving end of a free-fire combat zone. Been there, done that, and didn't like it then either. I want to be able to take my 20 month old outside without him grabbing his ears and run to me crying because of the intensity of the noise when the altered firing line(s) at the range goes active. I don't want to spend the rest of my life with the stress and worry over what KRRC is going to do next to further deprive us of the right to use and enjoy our home. KRRC is not going to voluntarily correct the conditions that have caused these problems, and the problems aren't going to go away until the range is brought into compliance.

I request that KRRC be held accountable to the same rules that the rest of us have to abide by. The county has a very strong legal basis and certainly a ton of precedence to enforce the county codes as applied to KRRC. I welcome the opportunity to further discuss this with you or the appropriate county official as soon as possible.



The Navy's small arms range at Camp Wesley Harris on Seabeck Highway in unincorporated Kitsap County was closed and range buildings demolished about 3 years ago. Closure was reported to be in part because the range was in excess of the Navy's needs and because the range was located in the middle of a fairly densely populated area. Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) adjoins the former Navy range.

Uniformed Navy personnel now routinely use the KRRC range for small arms training, familiarization fire, and qualification. KRRC claims certification by the Navy as a military small arms range suitable for automatic weapons use. We understand that the small arms range on Bangor has the capacity, facilities, staff, and schedule availability to support all current and anticipated Navy needs.

KRRC has and continues to expand, modify, and realign firing lines at the Club's facilities in violation of Kitsap County code, land use ordinances, and site development requirements creating extreme hazards to the health, safety and welfare of area residents. Recent range realignment has resulted in 6 homes being less than 200 yards and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards directly downrange from new firing lines and bays. We are addressing these concerns separately with the County and State. Citizen complaints specifically about automatic weapons use and traffic congestion on Seabeck Highway caused by off-site parking reducing the highway to one and a half lanes are answered by KRRC as being caused by necessary and required Navy activities. There are indicators that most of the traffic congestion and most, if not all, of the undisciplined and after hours automatic weapons fire is actually caused by members of KRRC who find it convenient to attribute the problems to the Navy.

CENSECFOR PAO has informed me that a freedom of information request (FOI) on the Navy's use of KRRC can include only specifically identified records and documents and cannot answer questions. For a FOI, we request assistance from your command in identifying any instructions, procedures, standards, or protocols used by the Navy to qualify KRRC as a military small arms range, frequency of re-certification, qualifications of personnel performing the certifications, and any contracts with KRRC for use of their range by the Navy. We also request any available information on why the Navy continues to use KRRC if in fact the Bangor small arms range is adequate for the Navy's needs.

As an interesting but troubling aside, KRRC has posted on its public web site (gunsafety.org) a large number of photos clearly showing several civilian club members firing the Navy's M-60 machine guns and Navy personnel firing M-14s belonging to club members, along with a military humvee and M-16 use at various parts of the range.

Any assistance you can give us in this is greatly appreciated.





Information Requested

How does the prosecutors office interface with the Department of Community Development (DCD) and the Wa. State Interagency Office for Recreation (IAC) where probable major violations of County code, permit requirements, land use and critical area ordinances have occurred and where it appears that false information was provided the IAC in order to receive public grant funds totaling about \$50,000?

Specifically and very briefly, Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) submitted permit application in 2005 for major construction and expansion of the Club's facilities. DCD provided requirements necessary to be met for permit approval to KRRC. KRRC appealed requirements, appeal was denied. KRRC withdrew permit application and started construction without permits. DCD investigated complaints, ordered all construction at KRRC stop until required permits and civil engineering reviews were obtained. KRRC simply shifted work to a different part of the range and submitted amended grant request to IAC to cover new work area. Construction at KRRC has continued to present time. KRRC submitted certification to IAC under grant #03-1156 stating that all requirements for permit and critical area ordinances have been met and received the grant funding.

County records confirm that required permits were not approved and documents agreement by the DCD and DNR that major violations of county code and lease contract requirements have occurred. There are documents in County records that indicate DCD has been ineffective in addressing complaints and applying provisions of County Code at KRRC equally and uniformly as to any other entity in the county because of political pressure. If DCD continues to be unresponsive or unable to enforce code requirements at KRRC, at what point would the Prosecutors Office become involved? Is submittal to the IAC of information known to be false (KRRC officers who went thru the permit application process are the same folks who signed the grant application and certifications) to obtain public funds in a situation such as this a civil or criminal offense, or just aggressive but really o.k. business practices? Can I, as a private citizen request Prosecutors Office to investigate this situation?

Reason for request or inquiry/comments

Construction projects at KRRC have resulted in my home and 5 others being directly down range and less than 200 yards from new firing lines and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards down range from firing bays. Automatic weapons fire at the range has become an almost daily occurrence. This situation presents extreme and potentially lethal hazards to the health, safety, and welfare of adjacent residents. The addition of range lights have changed usage of the range from historic daylight hours only to 15 or more hours daily. Grading, ditching, fill, altering topography of the range has resulted in significant environmental impact, including appearing to be the cause of changes in levels and flow patterns of adjacent wetlands and creating a high probability that lead and other heavy metals will be introduced into the wetlands. These wetlands form the headwaters of Chico Creek. There are a number of other associated problems, all of which are documented in County, DNR, and /or IAC records.


Complaints and requests for action to DCD and County Commissioners to apply and enforce existing provisions of County Code applicable to the activities at KRRC have to date been ineffective; to DNR just generated lots of paper requests for action flowing to the County and KRRC, none of which were answered or resolved; to IAC resulted in receiving a copy of the grant contract that states meeting code and ordinance requirements are the responsibility of the grantee, discusses sanctions that may apply and suggests that I work with County officials to resolve the problems; requests by IAC to KRRC for copies of building permits for grant records went unanswered; to KRRC gets the answer that "we haven't changed anything, the range has always been this way"; my public disclosure request to Commissioner Brown for information on actions he had taken that resulted in DCD planning department being told via e-mail to not worry about complaints at KRRC because he had taken care of it went unanswered. Does this sound like a situation which could/should be addressed by in-place County assets such as your office and the DCD, or is it a situation that must be addressed through outside agencies? Help!

Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has:

- Cleared and graded at least 2 additional acres of land
- Added/moved eight thousand (8,000) cubic yards fill
- Added 12 new covered shooting stations and baffles
- Installed eight hundred (800) feet of 24" culvert
- Installed 600 amp commercial electrical service
- Documented more than 350 hours of heavy earth moving equipment work at the range
- Installed an unspecified quantity of asphalt paving
- Added additional "event parking" areas
- Done extensive berm and baffle "grooming" and restructuring
- Plus more

This information is extracted from documents submitted by KRRC to the Washington State Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation (IAC) in grant 03-1156. KRRC has received \$71,858 in public and matching funds for this work, and has another grant (09-1430) totaling \$109,000 approved by the IAC to continue expansion of the Club range facilities. IAC contracts require KRRC to comply with all local code and ordinances. County records do not support KRRC's statements to IAC that all required permit and code requirements have been met. County records document and affirm repeated major violations of County Code, and of lease contract requirements from when the range was still owned by DNR.

Construction at the range has been in progress since mid-'05 and continues to date.


Kitsap County has in its' records a reasonably detailed record of complaints and investigations of construction and expansion activities at the range, including permit applications submitted by KRRC, requirements for construction provided to KRRC by the County, appeals of the requirements by KRRC and re-confirmation of requirements by the County. The County has issued verbal stop work orders and a written requirement for all work at the site to stop until proper land use and civil engineering permits are acquired. DNR and IAC have also repeatedly directed and required KRRC to obtain and submit copies of required permits. All have been ignored by KRRC.

This round of construction has placed 6 homes less than 200 yards, and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards directly down range from new firing lines and bays. Automatic weapons fire at the range has become a routine, almost daily occurrence. Addition of even more range lighting has significantly increased the after-dark use of the range. Club member parking outside the range along Seabeck Hwy. frequently reduces the highway to one and a half lanes, creating hazardous traffic conditions.

Aerial photos show new berms and baffles have been arranged so that sound is focused directly toward my home. The photos also show major changes in the wetlands on the north side of the range and into the Newberry Hill Heritage Park lands. This area forms the headlands of Chico Creek. Drainage from the range appears to have been diverted directly into the wetlands, potentially carrying large quantities of water transportable lead particulate and oxides of heavy metals into the creek headwaters.

KRRC's apparent reckless disregard of land use and site development requirements have resulted in major impact on the health, safety, and welfare of surrounding residents and the local environment.

I request the County take action as defined in at least four sections of County Code to investigate and require correction of code violations at KRRC. I request to be informed of County actions as allowed by County Code section 21.04.100.

Commissioners

This is not about guns. It is about public safety, health, welfare, protection of the environment, and equal application of the rule of law in Kitsap County.

In simple terms, and as briefly as possible, Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) is now and has been for the past 5 years in violation of written orders from the County to stop all construction at KRRC until all required permit, land use, and critical area ordinance requirements have been met. KRRC has ignored the County's orders and has made major changes to the club range. KRRC certified to the Wa. State Interagency Office for Recreation (IAC, also referred to as RCO) that all County requirements have been met and has received about \$50,000 in publicly funded grants to pay for construction at the range. County records do not support KRRC's claim. Another grant totaling \$109,000 from IAC has been approved to continue construction, expansion, realignment at the range. County officials are aware of this, and detailed documentation exists in County records to support these facts. Piecemeal expansion and construction at KRRC has resulted in an even greater negative cumulative effect on nearby residents and the environment because no controls, constraints, or conformance inspections have ever been applied.

This latest round of construction

- has added a number of new firing lines and bays that are aimed directly at adjacent homes south and west of KRRC instead of away from these homes as is the case with the original and long established firing lines. This new alignment, plus the almost daily indiscriminate automatic weapons fire at KRRC presents a potentially lethal hazard to area residents. Noise levels outside the range have increased by orders of magnitude. This also will greatly affect public use of the Newberry Hill Heritage Park as aerial photos show new firing lines have also been built north of the pre-existing lines.
- has added even more outdoor range lighting, allowing the range to be used anytime members want instead of being restricted to the previous and historic daylight hours only. In August 2006, KRRC rejected a County requirement to obtain a conditional use permit that would require, among other things, evaluation of and authorization for range lights and extended hours of operation and address automatic weapons use at the range.
- The magnitude of construction done at KRRC and reported by KRRC to IAC far exceeds that defined in County code as a major development with attendant requirements for engineering evaluation and other controls. KRRC claims an in-house range design expert, whose credentials seem to consist of a certificate of attendance to an unidentified range operation and development conference and lots of time at shooting competitions, designed the range to improve sound attenuation and safety. The range does contain lots of pretty piles of dirt, and has a very nice new ADA ramp, but seems to lack basic consideration or understanding for the principals of geometry, ballistics, acoustics, hydrology, or environmental protection.
- Restructuring of the topography and drainage of the range appears to have caused major changes in the dynamics of the Chico Creek wetland areas adjoining and north of the range. A hazardous materials inspection of the range and wetlands areas by Kitsap County Health District performed in July 09 was embarrassingly superficial. No samples were taken for even baseline analysis; the inspector accepted statements from KRRC personnel that they had an effective lead and hazardous materials control program even though no records exists to support that claim. A very cursory review of industry standard practices, using data published by KRRC, indicates that significant percentage of several tons per year of water transportable particulate lead and other heavy metals and oxides are available for introduction into the Chico Creek drainage.

All this information exists in much greater detail in County, IAC, and DNR records. KRRC has a well-documented recent history of ignoring and/or obstructing attempts by the County and State to apply and enforce the laws, rules, and ordinances of the County and State to activities at the range. Complaints and requests for action to various County officials, including Commissioners, from private citizens and DNR

officials, have went unanswered since mid-2007. Local resident's interest and involvement in development and use of the Heritage Park has regenerated a determination and absolute necessity to get KRRC in compliance with the same laws and rules designed to apply to and to protect all residents instead of allowing one small group's limited and parochial interests to supersede and supplant the rights of others. I can't imagine the County tolerating the contempt and complete disregard for county code demonstrated by KRRC's actions from, for example, some company building a commercial go-cart racing track, so why is it acceptable for a gun range where the potential for disaster and the expectations for compliance to the law is so much greater?

I request the County Commissioners to direct and support the appropriate county departments to investigate and enforce, as necessary and warranted, county code, land use and critical areas ordinances and other laws as they apply to KRRC.

I request to be informed of any action taken, including non-action on this request, as provided for in County Code section 21.04.100.



Summary: Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has significantly altered/modified their range facilities on Seabeck Hwy. over the past couple of years. These alterations/modifications are a major departure from traditional and historic usage of the range and have been done without approval or permit. Range alteration/modification completed and still in progress is in violation of county code and the terms of KRRC's lease with DNR. County planners and code enforcement personnel have been limited in the performance of their duties relating to KRRC by undue outside influence. All the above is clearly and unequivocally documented in county records.

These alterations/modifications present an immediate hazard to the safety and health of my family and have deprived us of the right to use and enjoy our home as we did for 15+ years previous to the changes.

I request the county take immediate, decisive, and effective action to correct this situation.

Discussion: I recently had the opportunity to review and copy county records relating to KRRC through a public records disclosure request (PDR). Violations of county code and the provisions of KRRC's lease with DNR concerning safety and the unregulated expansion and modification of the range facilities are substantive and well documented or referenced in county records. Problems with noise are a bit more subjective, but county code certainly specifies the required standards. The county on several occasions has identified the requirements for work done at the range to club officials. Club officials have repeatedly ignored or denied county input.

Issues with the KRRC all have been within the last couple of years. Complaints about the club have all been in that same time frame, and have all been from long-time residents of the area who have experienced the before and after problems resulting from modifications of the range firing lines and bays. We wouldn't be where we are now if it weren't for the efforts of a very small handful of club officers and members to change the way the range has operated for a lot of years into something that is of benefit to their interests without regard to the impact on the neighborhood.

KRRC now requires members to donate labor, materials, or money for projects at the range in addition to club dues as a condition of membership. Through these "donations", much of the work identified in KRRC's grant request for \$50,000 from the IAC has been completed or is in progress., including improvements in lighting, electrical service, access, and moving several hundred cubic yards of dirt to create new berms and firing

areas. There still have been no reviews, evaluations, approvals, or permits for any of this work.

Following your meeting on 1 May '07 with KRRC officials, a DCD senior planner, in an interdepartmental e-mail dated 5 May '07, ask the question "Because we still have complaints what do we tell the public?". The answer says "Joyce called...she said Comm Brown talked to Larry about it and everything has been handled. Said don't worry about it..". I assume Larry refers to Larry Keeton, Director of DCD. I also assume that whatever action you took is a matter of public record. However, there was nothing in the records as of 12 June '07 indicating what that action may be. Since I'm not real sure of where that record would be located, I have enclosed a PDR requesting that information be made available to me. Mr. Pat Hennessy, the lease manager at DNR, in an e-mail dated 23 April '07, stated he would request a written summary from the County to document code compliance or tasks required to insure compliance by KRRC. I have included a request for that summary in my PDR. I would appreciate it if you would have your staff direct the PDR to the right place.

My concerns remain the same. I want to be able to allow my grandkids and their friends to play outside in my yard without the feeling that I'm sending them out in the receiving end of a free-fire combat zone. Been there, done that, and didn't like it then either. I want to be able to take my 20 month old outside without him grabbing his ears and run to me crying because of the intensity of the noise when the altered firing line(s) at the range goes active. I don't want to spend the rest of my life with the stress and worry over what KRRC is going to do next to further deprive us of the right to use and enjoy our home. KRRC is not going to voluntarily correct the conditions that have caused these problems, and the problems aren't going to go away until the range is brought into compliance.

I request that KRRC be held accountable to the same rules that the rest of us have to abide by. The county has a very strong legal basis and certainly a ton of precedence to enforce the county codes as applied to KRRC. I welcome the opportunity to further discuss this with you or the appropriate county official as soon as possible.

CENSECFOR PAO has informed me that a freedom of information request (FOI) on the Navy's use of KRRC can include only specifically identified records and documents and cannot answer questions. For a FOI, we request assistance from your command in identifying any instructions, procedures, standards, or protocols used by the Navy to qualify KRRC as a military small arms range, frequency of re-certification, qualifications of personnel performing the certifications, and any contracts with KRRC for use of their range by the Navy. We also request any available information on why the Navy continues to use KRRC if in fact the Bangor small arms range is adequate for the Navy's needs.

As an interesting but troubling aside, KRRC has posted on its public web site (gunsafety.org) a large number of photos clearly showing several civilian club members firing the Navy's M-60 machine guns and Navy personnel firing M-14s belonging to club members, along with a military humvee and M-16 use at various parts of the range.

Any assistance you can give us in this is greatly appreciated.

Commissioner Garrido,

I am one of a growing number of citizens/residents who are become very angry at the KRRC for the ever increasing noise. The club is going unchecked - firing larger and larger weapons - more frequently. When we call to complain they tell us they were here first and we shouldn't have move in the area. I'll bet the Kitsap Community Development will be happy to hear about this attitude. They could not have been more nasty.

We are forming a group to begin the process of protesting their current operation. One of the things were looking into is the sale of land to the club for the cost of only \$2,500. How is this possible? The value had been assessed for over \$400,000 in 09 and now over \$300,000 in "10. Why was this property sold to the Gun Club taking away lease revenue from the County, not to mention the loss of the price of land. This transaction does not make any sense and I would like to get more details on this deal. If the County wanted to sell it at such a low cost why was it not open to the public for bidding.

In reading some of the transfer documents it clearly states the club is to operate as they have in their historical pass. The club was private, not public so the membership has increased drastically as well as the type of fire power being shot. A 50 caliber automatic weapon is not a gun normally fired at a Rifle and pistol range.

I addition I have reservation about the public funds they are using. They claim they have used close to \$100,000 for improvements, including noise reduction, yet the noise gets louder week by week. We've talked with Steve Mounts and he has confirmed the noise level has increased dramatically in the last year or so. I live two miles away and the noise is quite distracting when we are outside and trying to enjoy our yards.

In the last several weeks I have driven around to various neighborhoods and gotten signatures to see just how large of problem this has become. I have a radius of almost 4 miles of people hearing the firing when they are home or outside. This represent a huge amount of home and residents. something needs to be done immediately to solve this problem.

I would like very much to have a meeting with regarding this growing problem. I want to know more about petitioning for a NON- Shooting Area. Judging from the neighbors responses we should no problem delineating an area and getting the 51% of the residents to sign.

I am one of many, and the number of angry residents is growing at the growing noise level coming from the KRRC. The more I look into this situation I am becoming more applaud at the circumstances which lead to the sale of this property to KRRC.

I was out of town last year when this whole thing went down and I can't believe the deal. At no time during this process did you or the County Commissioners look out for the surrounding residents. Instead some manufactured price was created (\$2500) so the land could transfer without a public auction or notice.

Currently the KRRC has increased it's shooting to include high caliber automatic weapons and training of Military personnel. It clearly is not operating as a non -profit. It has taken grant funds that supposedly would eliminate noise, but the noise level continues to grow.

The membership has become extremely hostile every time a resident calls to complain. They start shooting @ 8:00 A.M on Sundays and were shooting after dark last night (Saturday @ 8:30 P.M.) I believe county ordinance clearly states no guns shall be fired after sunset, other than law enforcement.

The KRRC is not, and has never kept records to show how much lead is cleaned up. I believe the County sold this so they could get rid of the problem land. How is this suppose to work with the adjacent Heritage Park. Isn't anyone worried about water, wetland and soil pollution, not to mention the noise pollution to thousands and thousands of residents.

I recently did a quick survey and drove and walked neighborhoods to see if the noise was bothering others and exactly how far. I plotted these addresses on a map and it clearly shows noise pollution in approximately 3 to 4 mile radius. can you guess how many households this impacts.

I would like very much to schedule a meeting with you so a few of us can sit down and discuss in more detail. A solution needs to be arrived at before this grows any larger.

In quick review I personally have two suggested solutions.

1. Close the KRRC club and combine it with the Trap and Skeet of Bremerton. There is only commercial land and the airport out there, plus there is also the police firing range so the gun noise is already in existence.
2. make the KRRC return to the historic use of the property. That is revolver and rifle range. make them stop shooting large caliber weapons and military training.

When we get together we can show you much more evidence that the KRRC are not keeping the conditions nor are they responsible neighbors. When anyone calls them to complain their told they were here first and we should not have moved here. I wonder what the Kitsap Community Development folks would say to this attitude.





I have reviewed your first reimbursement request for this project but I would like to clarify the following:

1. Copies of the payment checks and invoices were included with the billing but we do not require or want to receive this information. Please do not include these copies with future billings.
2. An unskilled labor donation was included but it was calculated at the incorrect rate of \$10.16 an hour. We currently reimburse all unskilled labor donations at \$12.00 an hour so I have changed the amount of this donation from \$1,766.82 to \$2,086.80.
3. There were five charges listed on the expenditure summary where fuel and oil was purchased but the payment number was blank or stated "cash." We will only accept the following for a payment number: a check number, payroll if it was for payroll and benefits or force account if the sponsor uses its own labor, equipment or materials for the project. I have changed the payment number for these five charges to force account.

I am also providing you with the link to our reimbursement manual for grant programs. This manual provides examples on how to complete our forms and what information we require in order to process a reimbursement request. 4. I have reduced your donated materials amount from \$706.25 to \$156.25. *\$500 cash not eligible*

 - a. I have listed \$33,840.87 in construction expenditures.
 - b. I have listed \$8,351.60 in construction non-reimbursable match for a total of \$42,192.47.


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Firearms training: Shooting on the move




My January 14, 2010, Tactics & Training article generated quite a bit of feedback — I received many e-mails and there were a handful of comments beneath the article itself — from which I must conclude that a good portion of our readership have been bit by that budget bug. Everyone, it seems, is riding in that “doing more with less” bus nowadays.

Part of my job as a training consultant involves reviewing and auditing force training programs. I’ve consulted with some of the largest agencies in the country (more than 40,000 sworn) as well as some of the smallest (around 10 sworn). What I write here is principally directed to those smaller agencies that have found either their resources slashed or their facilities eliminated, particularly in the firearms training realm.

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

Mobile firing ranges have been around for years. I’ve had the pleasure of both visiting and using several, and most members of the International Law Enforcement Educators and Trainers Association (ILEETA) and its forerunner, the American Society of Law Enforcement Trainers (ASLET), have probably had the pleasure of experiencing a few. In fact, Meggitt Training Systems, the folks who acquired FATS a few years ago, had their three-lane, 25-yard mobile firearms training trailer, The Road Range, available for a week for interested trainers outside the ILEETA conference headquarters in suburban Chicago last year. I recently had the good fortune of touring and experiencing one of the newest mobile police firearms training facilities recently set up in southwest Florida.

Mike Christoff is a 20-year veteran of law enforcement, first cutting his teeth in the streets of Dearborn, Michigan before transferring to the Marco Island, Florida PD. Mike is also a veteran firearms trainer. Seeing the need for a mobile range after working for a number of years in southwest Florida, Mike created Mobile Tactics. Based in Naples, Florida — about 40 miles south of Ft. Myers — this three-lane range on wheels is capable of handling virtually every handgun round currently used by today’s law enforcement officers. The armor plating in his shoot trailer can also withstand .223 caliber rifle rounds and all shotgun loads including rifled slugs. No longer is judgmental (shoot / don’t shoot) or low-light (night fire) firearms training just a pipe dream for smaller agencies. If you don’t have an indoor range or have to share outdoor range facilities with a municipality or civilian gun club, Mike will gladly bring his range to you.



As the lead instructor for Calibre Press, and a member of IALEFI, ILEETA and its predecessor ASLET, as well as a private trainer and consultant, I've had the pleasure of firing on some of the most sophisticated police firearms training facilities in the United States, including the FBI's indoor and outdoor ranges at Quantico. I've trained on virtually every commercial computer-driven range operation around. There's nothing that those facilities offer that Mike Christoff and his "ShootOnTheMove" staff cannot duplicate at Mobile Tactics, including "shoot / don't shoot" training through more than 500-scenario video-based, menu-driven, decision-making CAPS system.

The County has allowed residential neighborhoods to grow around the club to a point now the club is just not located in an area that fits our Urban growth. They are firing larger and larger weapons, I've seen military people out there using automatic and semi automatic weapons.

The KRRC was a private club for members to shoot pistols and hunting rifles. They operated under that premise for decades, but now have expanded their usage to a level that is just not acceptable.

Something must be done now to quite this unwanted neighbor. I strongly urge the County to enforce Codes for noise or rewrite the Codes so Gun noise is included in those unwanted sounds. I also suggest the County make the KRRC role back their usage to what was historically.

Surly there has to be some Officials that care about the welfare of the residents. I have driven the area and started getting signatures of residents who are fed up with this nonsense.
