

Already sent email about last nights meeting, but wanted to add another comment after having looked at the website and read the comments you posted from the first meeting.

This concerns the KRRC gun club. I'm a life member of this club and have been a member since 1984 and use the facilities of this club on a regular basis. I've seen lots of changes in the structure of the club in those years, both membership wise and facility wise. The club started in 1926 on land leased from DNR until the club was able to acquire the approximately 30 acres (in 2009) it sits on today.

I know and understand that firearms and shooting is not for everyone, but it is a part of our American culture and I feel the improved use of this club and access today by the general public in a controlled and supervised manner (compared to my early membership years when it was "members" only) certainly provides a benefit to the community as a place for safer controlled and supervised firearms use. This means then that the use of this place has grown, but that's what is going to happen in the new park here too; as it becomes more known about and better accessed its use will grow too. Some of the comments I read concerned the "noise" generated by the gun club, well people have to realize that the club was there long before this area became as developed as it is today and yes shooting firearms does make noise. The club operating hours are in accordance with the noise ordinance throughout the general rural areas of the county. Does that mean firearms are not used outside of those hours, certainly not and often the assumption is its from that "gun range" but if we find folks (and it has to be members, since we are not open to the public outside those hours) using the facilities improperly, they are invited to leave and lose membership. So we do try and police our own. Under the right conditions, sounds of firearms being used can often carry a long way and can that be annoying to folks, sure, but I think all the traffic on Seabeck HWY past my house is annoying at times too.

Anyway, so far I like what I've seen and heard at both your public meetings and let's continue with the low impact use in this new park.

Hi Mark. I'm glad you're home safely.

Yes, the MTB folks have been well-represented. There was plenty of input last night, too, about conservation/habitat protections, even though there are fewer emails on those topics.

I'll be putting last night's presentation online soon so you can see it. It included two options of new facilities in the park. The final outcome of the meeting was a group conversation about which aspects of each option were most desirable and why.

The summary, as I recall it before going through my notes to be sure, is that folks wanted mostly to maintain trails with existing user groups, install appropriate parking/trailhead facilities especially along Seabeck Highway and better parking at Newberry Hill, add a disc golf course, but otherwise not add much in the way of large facilities like a dog park or soccer fields unless a serious need was indicated at this location at some point in the future. Even then, such facilities would somehow be near the school/Newberry Hill Road and not off in the woods or where trails are (and will remain).

We collectively used the Guiding Principles to narrow down the list of things to ones appropriate to the "mission" of the site, although obviously I did try to respond to all suggestions by at least testing them out in the two concepts presented and letting the public weigh in at the meeting.

As for the gun club expansion, we are not considering selling or giving any land away at the park, and I noted this last night at the public meeting. I understand that they suggested this additional land in early 2009 as part of their own internal expansion plans. I wasn't involved in any of those discussions, though, so I don't know any details.

I know that the past process was very painful for you. I appreciate your hard work that improved the park and strengthened the volunteer base.

**A Resolution to Assign and Convey Certain Real Estate**

WHEREAS, Kitsap County (County) has been negotiating with the State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) regarding a land exchange in the Central Kitsap area ("the Newberry Hill Land Exchange"); and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that the land transfer with DNR is in the public interest as it will provide contiguous county ownership that will enable more efficient and effective local management and enhanced park, recreational and open space facilities for County residents; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the property DNR intends to transfer to Kitsap County will include the assignment of a lease for a portion of property currently leased to the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRCC) for use as a shooting range; and

WHEREAS, the State of Washington has recognized a need to preserve and rehabilitate shooting ranges that provide important benefits to the public for access and recreation; use by law enforcement and military personnel; and use for firearm training, competition, and hunter safety education classes; and

WHEREAS, KRRC currently meets the stated needs for Kitsap County by its operation of the shooting range as a private nonprofit facility; and

WHEREAS, the County finds that it is in the public interest for firearm safety as well as in the best economic interest of the County to provide that KRRC continue to operate with full control over the property on which it is located; and

WHEREAS, the County has had the KRRC shooting range property appraised, and the appraisal of the property as it is currently used and will be continued in use is less than \$2,500; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 36.34.020, Kitsap County may dispose of the KRRC property without a public bidding process.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved:

The Board of County Commissioners hereby authorizes the assignment and sale of the portion of the property acquired under the DNR/County land exchange, which is more specifically described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, to the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club. Consideration by the KRRC shall include, but not be limited to, covenants to maintain and operate the property as a shooting range with public access, retention of certain easements by the County, other environmental considerations, and assumption of liability for the property and the use of the property.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The conveyance to KRRC shall take place as soon as is practicable after the property is conveyed to Kitsap County by DNR. The Chair of the Board of the County Commissioners is hereby authorized to sign the necessary documents required to convey the property to the KRRC.



In reference to your e-mail dated March 9, 2009, addressed to Kitsap County Commissioner Josh Brown and Kitsap County Parks and Recreation, subject "URGENT TIME SENSITIVE PROPOSAL TO CONTRACT FOR LEASE/PURCHASE SITE/ACREAGE" : I take exception and offense to a number of untrue and/or misrepresentative statements you made in this letter. Specifically:

a.. you state "KRRC's neighbors (adjacent property owners) even if they are not actual members of the club do support the club." This is not true. I have lived next door to the club for over 20 years. I am a former member and did support the club up until a few years ago when the club's purpose and goals radically changed. To the best of my knowledge, only 2 or 3 of the 40+ neighbors most affected by the club's operations actively support the club. Most of the rest seem at best resigned to having made a poor decision when buying or building here years ago and having lacked the foresight to see just how bad conditions could become when living next to an organization such as KRRC has become..

b.. "Neighbors support the club because it is responsibly operated" - Again, blatantly false. In 2005 KRRC submitted a plan to the County to expand club facilities. The county provided comments and requirements to the club on actions necessary to get a permit for the proposed work. KRRC rejected the requirements and started work on the expansion anyway, clearing a significant area of recently planted DNR lands, cutting roads, grading, and cutting ditches to drain wetlands to construct a new 1000 meter range. The County issued a stop work order and DNR required KRRC to at least partially restore and replant the affected area. After the fact KRRC took the position that that they weren't really building a new range, just reorienting the existing range. Even after the stop work order was issued, KRRC continued work on other parts of the range in defiance of County Code and Ordinances. This is hardly the type of responsible, law-abiding behavior KRRC claims and is only one of several examples of irresponsible unilateral behavior demonstrated by the club. There is, incidentally, a very interesting trail of documentation on this and related problems with the club in County records.

c.. "KRRC has reasonable hours" - KRRC's current published hours are 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. These hours were changed from the historic and traditional daylight hours only following the illegal installation of range lights several years ago. Since installation of range lights , shooting has often extended well beyond the published hours, and all too often culminates in an intense 15 to 30 minutes of automatic weapons fire, frequently around bar closing time, particularly during the warmer months.

d.. "KRRC has an effective noise control system" - subjective, but noise levels at my home have increased from only occasionally mildly annoying to levels that sometimes preclude outside activity at my home since the realignment and restructuring of the berms and baffles at the range. I can only suggest that the club invest in a range design review by a credentialed entity with competence in this area. The remainder of my concerns will be addressed in another forum. KRRC's arrogance in claiming to speak for me in matters relating to the range is unconscionable and unacceptable. I request KRRC issue a statement correcting the above items to all recipients of the original e-mail, or, alternatively, provide substantiation to these claims at least 24 hours prior to the public hearing scheduled for 6 p.m. March 18th, 2009.

This leads me and others to be highly suspect about the long term plans the county has for the future of this firing range. I would have to conclude that the long term plan is to shut this club down at the end of whatever negotiated lease agreement is met.

I think I'm not alone in my concern, and I think we need a written and legal commitment that is binding from the County to ensure the future of this firing range. We can not be confident with promises and intentions, especially when they do not match the documented plans of the County Parks Department.

In this discussion I was informed of the reason the Paradise Paintball outfit is no longer operating at the South Kitsap Regional Park. It seems there are some valid concerns based on how that lease was terminated that are driving some concerns here.

The paintball field was a great community recreational facility, and I even used it for my Navy Reserve unit for recreation and training. It is a tragedy to see it go.

I think we need to consider ALL the public uses of parks, not just the ones that seem to have the largest political support. I think it is clear there are a large number of gun owners in the county, and they should have a safe and controlled environment to support their proficiency with their firearms. This is a public service.

I appreciate your consideration on this issue and your dedication to public service.

RCO's General Provisions are incorporated as part of the final grant contract that is issued to the sponsor (which must be signed by both the sponsor and the RCO before the contract is activated.) I have included a sample of our grant contract (this is a generic contract and not for a specific grant), you will find the General Provisions as part of this document. The KRRC's 2009 FARR grant has not been put under contract yet, therefore I do not have a specific document that I can provide to you. The KRRC's previous FARR grant has been completed and is considered closed. The previous grant contract had similar General Provisions as part of its contract.

I have also attached a document that outlines our governing Board's authority. Land use decisions, such as a project's location, environmental impact, zoning, or other effects on a community, are outside the board's authority. The board's evaluation committees may score a project on how well it conforms to a community comprehensive plan, but the board does not review the decision of the local government on whether a project meets its zoning or has thoroughly addressed environmental impacts.

We encourage you to work with Kitsap County and the appropriate permitting agencies regarding these type of issues. The current General Provisions state, in Section 9:

**SECTION 9. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAW**

The sponsor will implement the agreement in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and RCO and funding board policies. The sponsor shall comply with, and RCO is not responsible for determining compliance with, any and all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and/or policies, including, but not limited to: State Environmental Policy Act; Industrial Insurance Coverage; Architectural Barriers Act; permits (shoreline, Hydraulics Project Approval, demolition); land use regulations (critical areas ordinances, Growth Management Act); federal and state safety and health regulations (Occupational Safety and Health Administration/Washington Industrial Safety and Health Act); and Buy American Act.

I have not been able to find any requirement in RCO on-line library for grantees to comply with local and state laws, statues, and ordinances for projects funded by FARR. Specifically, all the projects described in this grant require county permits, inspections, engineering evaluations, and have other legal requirements that should have been met before work was started. No permits have been issued by Kitsap county for any of these projects. I live next door to the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club. Changes in the Club facilities done under this and previous grants (specifically grant 03-1156) have had a major negative impact on the quality of life of the surrounding neighborhood and local environment. County planning and code enforcement personnel have effectively been

rendered helpless in enforcing county codes and ordinances at the range, most probably due to local political leaders refusal to support any action against the Club.

Does the RCO or FARR require compliance with the applicable local and state laws as a condition for the grant? If so, would you please provide me with a reference to the requirement?

Does the RCO or FARR conduct any audits, inspections or reviews of work proposed for grant funding either before, during, or after the grant process, or any type of audit or review of actual use of grant monies and work done during the term of the grant? Could you provide me with reference to any requirement for this?

Do adjacent residents have any input in the grant application and funding process? The only reference I found to this indicates the organization requesting the grant determines if public input is needed. Is there an established avenue for the public to challenge specific grants outside the court system?

Any information you can provide to assist me in preparing a public records request on grants 09-1430 and 03-1156 is deeply appreciated.

Hi Mark. I'm glad you're home safely.

Yes, the MTB folks have been well-represented. There was plenty of input last night, too, about conservation/habitat protections, even though there are fewer emails on those topics.

I'll be putting last night's presentation online soon so you can see it. It included two options of new facilities in the park. The final outcome of the meeting was a group

conversation about which aspects of each option were most desirable and why.

The summary, as I recall it before going through my notes to be sure, is that folks wanted mostly to maintain trails with existing user groups, install appropriate parking/trailhead facilities especially along Seabeck Highway and better parking at Newberry Hill, add a disc golf course, but otherwise not add much in the way of large facilities like a dog park or soccer fields unless a serious need was indicated at this location at some point in the future. Even then, such facilities would somehow be near the school/Newberry Hill Road and not off in the woods or where trails are (and will remain).

We collectively used the Guiding Principles to narrow down the list of things to ones appropriate to the "mission" of the site, although obviously I did try to respond to all suggestions by at least testing them out in the two concepts presented and letting the public weigh in at the meeting.

As for the gun club expansion, we are not considering selling or giving any land away at the park, and I noted this last night at the public meeting. I understand that they suggested this additional land in early 2009 as part of their own internal expansion plans. I wasn't involved in any of those discussions, though, so I don't know any details.

I know that the past process was very painful for you. I appreciate your hard work that improved the park and strengthened the volunteer base.

None of the trails are on their property, but some of their signs are in the park land. His statement at the last meeting were focused on the club desire to acquire more land. Has their required land survey been completed? That will show where the trails are in relation

to the club. It would be nice for the parks department to state this and the past attack on the volunteers was all spin. If Josh will allow that.

Their wanting to buy the lands between the club and the service road is scary. I saw the map they made from Matt. The home owners over there will be thrilled. PUBLIC HEARING ON HB 2499

NEW PRO-GUN BILL FILED?

A public hearing will be conducted on SB 6396, the so-called “assault weapon” ban bill on Tuesday, 26 January. The hearing will take place at 10 a.m. in Senate Hearing Room “1” in the John A. Cherberg Senate Office Building on the Capitol Campus in Olympia.

It is imperative that as many individuals as possible attend the hearing and sign in in opposition to the bill. A sign-in sheet will be available at a side table just inside the hearing room (or if the crowd is large enough, the sign-in sheet may be outside the room in the corridor). Sign in with your name, address and a position on the bill: “con.” There is a place on the sign-in sheet to indicate whether or not you would like to testify. Time is limited, so I anticipate only a few individuals will be called upon on both sides of the issue. Who gets to testify and who does not is solely up to the committee chair (Senator Adam Kline, sponsor of the bill).

Hints on testimony: public input is limited to three minutes or less. Begin by stating your name and where you are from. Personal attacks on the motives of bill supporters are not allowed. If a point has already been made, do not repeat it. As with a letter to the editor, short, concise points are best. While reference to “cold, dead fingers” may be dramatic, this is NOT a drama. Courtesy is a virtue!

Parking in and around the Capitol Campus is extremely limited. Olympia parking enforcement makes a ton of money enforcing the one-hour limit in the residential areas just south of the Campus! If the spaces on Campus or overflow parking lots to the east are taken, it's best to park in the business area in the blocks to the north, using the parking meters. Car-pooling is the way to go!

It is equally imperative that, whether you can attend the hearing or not, you contact your Senator, by e-mail (<https://dlr.leg.wa.gov/MemberEmail/Default.aspx>), direct telephone (<http://apps.leg.wa.gov/DistrictFinder/Default.aspx>) or Legislative Hotline (1-800-562-6000) to indicate your opposition to the bill.

A committee vote on the bill will likely be taken a few days later in executive session. The Judiciary Committee has eight members, five Democrats and three Republicans (matching the proportion of Democrats to Republicans in the Senate). The three Republicans and one Democrat lean our way.

Public testimony will also be taken on HB 2499, the bill that increases the allowable limits on possession of black powder. That hearing will be conducted on Friday, 29 January, at 8 a.m. by the House Labor & Commerce Committee in House Hearing Room "B" in the John L. O'Brien House Office Building, also on the Capitol Campus. This is more of a technical bill, lacking the controversy of SB 6396. While a turn-out isn't needed, calls to your two Representatives in support of HB 2499 ARE needed.

HB 3082, a bill that would lower from 21 to 18 the age at which an application for a concealed pistol license could be applied and issued. The bill was filed by Representative Brendan Williams (D-22), a legislator heretofore known for filing anti-gun bills (e.g. HB 2264, HB 2477). While the language of the bill is straightforward, at this point I can only assume this is a case of election year politicking. Until proven otherwise (and simply filing a bill is not proof), I question the motive behind the bill.

This is **not** about guns. It is about public safety, health, welfare, protection of the environment, and equal application of the rule of law in Kitsap County.

In simple terms, and as briefly as possible, Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) is now and has been for the past 5 years in violation of written orders from the County to stop all construction at KRRC until all required permit, land use, and critical area ordinance requirements have been met. KRRC has ignored the County's orders and has made major changes to the club range. KRRC certified to the Wa. State Interagency Office for Recreation (IAC, also referred to as RCO) that all County requirements have been met and has received about \$50,000 in publicly funded grants to pay for construction at the range. County records do not support KRRC's claim. Another grant totaling \$109,000 from IAC has been approved to continue construction, expansion, realignment at the range. County officials are aware of this, and detailed documentation exists in County records to support these facts. Piecemeal expansion and construction at KRRC has resulted in an even greater negative cumulative effect on nearby residents and the environment because no controls, constraints, or conformance inspections have ever been applied.

This latest round of construction

- has added a number of new firing lines and bays that are aimed directly at adjacent homes south and west of KRRC instead of away from these homes as is the case with the original and long established firing lines. This new alignment, plus the almost daily indiscriminate automatic weapons fire at KRRC presents a potentially lethal hazard to area residents. Noise levels outside the range have increased by orders of magnitude. This also will greatly affect public use of the Newberry Hill Heritage Park as aerial photos show new firing lines have also been built north of the pre-existing lines.
- has added even more outdoor range lighting, allowing the range to be used anytime members want instead of being restricted to the previous and historic daylight hours only. In August 2006, KRRC rejected a County requirement to obtain a conditional use permit that would require, among other things, evaluation of and authorization for range lights and extended hours of operation and address automatic weapons use at the range.
- The magnitude of construction done at KRRC and reported by KRRC to IAC far exceeds that defined in County code as a major development with attendant requirements for engineering evaluation and other controls. KRRC claims an in-house range design expert, whose credentials seem to consist of a certificate of attendance to an unidentified range operation and development conference and lots of time at shooting competitions, designed the range to improve sound attenuation and safety. The range does contain lots of pretty piles of dirt, and has a very nice new ADA ramp, but seems to lack basic consideration or understanding for the principals of geometry, ballistics, acoustics, hydrology, or environmental protection.
- Restructuring of the topography and drainage of the range appears to have caused major changes in the dynamics of the Chico Creek wetland areas adjoining and north of the range. A hazardous materials inspection of the range and wetlands areas by Kitsap County Health District performed in July 09 was embarrassingly superficial. No samples were taken for even baseline analysis; the inspector accepted statements from KRRC personnel that they had an effective lead and hazardous materials control program even though no records exist to support that claim. A very cursory review of industry standard practices, using data published by KRRC, indicates that significant percentage of several tons per year of water transportable particulate lead and other heavy metals and oxides are available for introduction into the Chico Creek drainage.

All this information exists in much greater detail in County, IAC, and DNR records. KRRC has a well-documented recent history of ignoring and/or obstructing attempts by the County and State to apply and enforce the laws, rules, and ordinances of the County and State to activities at the range. Complaints and requests for action to various County officials, including Commissioners, from private citizens and DNR officials, have went unanswered since mid-2007. Local resident's interest and involvement in development

and use of the Heritage Park has regenerated a determination and absolute necessity to get KRRC in compliance with the same laws and rules designed to apply to and to protect all residents instead of allowing one small group's limited and parochial interests to supersede and supplant the rights of others. I can't imagine the County tolerating the contempt and complete disregard for county code demonstrated by KRRC's actions from, for example, some company building a commercial go-cart racing track, so why is it acceptable for a gun range where the potential for disaster and the expectations for compliance to the law is so much greater?

I request the County Commissioners to direct and support the appropriate county departments to investigate and enforce, as necessary and warranted, county code, land use and critical areas ordinances and other laws as they apply to KRRC.

I request to be informed of any action taken, including non-action on this request, as provided for in County Code section 21.04.100.

## NHHP Facts and points of interest

1. The north 250 acres portion is presently the only part of the proposed 1000+ acre park that can be used until the planning process is over and conservation easements are created.
2. There is a 300 acre portion in the middle that was logged in the recent past, and reforested by the Department of Natural Resources. This supposedly belongs to the County, but is in the care of the DNR. There are difficulties that I do not totally understand, but it can not just be returned to the County without some hoops to jump through.
3. The lower 520 acres, part of which was sold to Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club, was added to the proposed park recently in a trade for some land the County owned farther south nearer to Green Mountain. Some grant money was involved in the swap somewhere along the way, and one of the stipulations of the grant was to create greenway and conservation easements on this area.
4. Each of the 3 portions of the Park, are different in their own way. The north part has some very old second growth timber, as does the south part, but it does not appear to be as old in the south part. The middle, having been recently logged, has a lot of slash on the ground, and not very tall trees.
5. There are old stumps from the original forest, in the north part especially, and we hope to find some artifacts to use for display to show the heritage of the area. I have seen wire rope at least 2" in diameter on the east side of the ravine about a mile north of there. This is the sort of thing we are looking for.
6. The ravine north of the high school is a unique area in that it has no underbrush, and resembles a rain forest in some ways.
7. The High School is surrounded by the Park, and most of the ball fields are on County property.
8. The middle piece is being harvested for brush by a private contractor at this time, and they access it from the south gate near the Seabeck Hwy./ Holly Road intersection.
9. The only approved entrance to the Park with parking is the High School entrance gate area at this time. There are entrances around the perimeter for walking or biking, but no parking any other place. It is not recommended to try to access from any other point, since none of the roads have been used for that purpose in the past and local property owners have an expectation of privacy.
10. I have to date had at least one sighting of the following animals in the area.
  - Bear
  - Fox
  - Lynx or Bobcat
  - Beaver
  - Raccoon
  - Possum
  - Muskrat
11. Part of the designation of the Heritage Park is derived from a planning designation. In that planning use only 30% can be used. The remaining 70% must remain natural, and undisturbed.
12. Some longtime uses for the Park have been hiking, cross country running, biking, horseback riding, birdwatching, mushrooming, nature walks, etc.

13. The 1000 acre Park drains 2 directions, north and south, north to a tributary of Anderson Creek, and south to Chico Creek. The dividing point is quite near the middle.
14. The terrain is surprisingly varied, even though the perimeter is reasonably flat. There are 2 good sized hills with an eagle perch on the one nearest to the south pond, which is as much a creation of man as it is a "beaver pond".
15. We hope to have an evaluation and possible locations for the types of mushrooms available at the Park soon.





**Information Requested**

How does the prosecutors office interface with the Department of Community Development (DCD) and the Wa. State Interagency Office for Recreation (IAC) where probable major violations of County code, permit requirements, land use and critical area ordinances have occurred and where it appears that false information was provided the IAC in order to receive public grant funds totaling about \$50,000? Specifically and very briefly, Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) submitted permit application in 2005 for major construction and expansion of the Club's facilities. DCD provided requirements necessary to be met for permit approval to KRRC. KRRC appealed requirements, appeal was denied. KRRC withdrew permit application and started construction without permits. DCD investigated complaints, ordered all construction at KRRC stop until required permits and civil engineering reviews were obtained. KRRC simply shifted work to a different part of the range and submitted amended grant request to IAC to cover new work area. Construction at KRRC has continued to present time. KRRC submitted certification to IAC under grant #03-1156 stating that all requirements for permit and critical area ordinances have been met and received the grant funding.

County records confirm that required permits were not approved and documents agreement by the DCD and DNR that major violations of county code and lease contract requirements have occurred. There are documents in County records that indicate DCD has been ineffective in addressing complaints and applying provisions of County Code at KRRC equally and uniformly as to any other entity in the county because of political pressure. If DCD continues to be unresponsive or unable to enforce code requirements at KRRC, at what point would the Prosecutors Office become involved? Is submittal to the IAC of information known to be false (KRRC officers who went thru the permit application process are the same folks who signed the grant application and certifications) to obtain public funds in a situation such as this a civil or criminal offense, or just aggressive but really o.k. business practices ? Can I, as a private citizen request Prosecutors Office to investigate this situation?

**Reason for request or inquiry/comments**

Construction projects at KRRC have resulted in my home and 5 others being directly down range and less than 200 yards from new firing lines and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards down range from firing bays. Automatic weapons fire at the range has become an almost daily occurrence. This situation presents extreme and potentially lethal hazards to the health, safety, and welfare of adjacent residents. The addition of range lights have changed usage of the range from historic daylight hours only to 15 or more hours daily. Grading, ditching, fill, altering topography of the range has resulted in significant environmental impact, including appearing to be the cause of changes in levels and flow patterns of adjacent wetlands and creating a high probability that lead and other heavy metals will be introduced into the wetlands. These wetlands form the headwaters of Chico Creek. There are a number of other associated problems, all of which are documented in County, DNR, and /or IAC records.


Complaints and requests for action to DCD and County Commissioners to apply and enforce existing provisions of County Code applicable to the activities at KRRC have to date been ineffective; to DNR just generated lots of paper requests for action flowing to the County and KRRC, none of which were answered or resolved; to IAC resulted in receiving a copy of the grant contract that states meeting code and ordinance requirements are the responsibility of the grantee, discusses sanctions that may apply and suggests that I work with County officials to resolve the problems; requests by IAC to KRRC for copies of building permits for grant records went unanswered; to KRRC gets the answer that "we haven't changed anything, the range has always been this way"; my public disclosure request to Commissioner Brown for information on actions he had taken that resulted in DCD planning department being told via e-mail to not worry about complaints at KRRC because he had taken care of it went unanswered. Does this sound like a situation which could/should be addressed by in-place County assets such as your office and the DCD, or is it a situation that must be addressed through outside agencies? Help!

Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has:

- Cleared and graded at least 2 additional acres of land
- Added/moved eight thousand (8,000) cubic yards fill
- Added 12 new covered shooting stations and baffles
- Installed eight hundred (800) feet of 24" culvert
- Installed 600 amp commercial electrical service
- Documented more than 350 hours of heavy earth moving equipment work at the range
- Installed an unspecified quantity of asphalt paving
- Added additional "event parking" areas
- Done extensive berm and baffle "grooming" and restructuring
- Plus more

This information is extracted from documents submitted by KRRC to the Washington State Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation (IAC) in grant 03-1156. KRRC has received \$71,858 in public and matching funds for this work, and has another grant (09-1430) totaling \$109,000 approved by the IAC to continue expansion of the Club range facilities. IAC contracts require KRRC to comply with all local code and ordinances. County records do not support KRRC's statements to IAC that all required permit and code requirements have been met. County records document and affirm repeated major violations of County Code, and of lease contract requirements from when the range was still owned by DNR.

Construction at the range has been in progress since mid-'05 and continues to date.


Kitsap County has in its' records a reasonably detailed record of complaints and investigations of construction and expansion activities at the range, including permit applications submitted by KRRC, requirements for construction provided to KRRC by the County, appeals of the requirements by KRRC and re-confirmation of requirements by the County. The County has issued verbal stop work orders and a written requirement for all work at the site to stop until proper land use and civil engineering permits are acquired. DNR and IAC have also repeatedly directed and required KRRC to obtain and submit copies of required permits. All have been ignored by KRRC.

This round of construction has placed 6 homes less than 200 yards, and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards directly down range from new firing lines and bays. Automatic weapons fire at the range has become a routine, almost daily occurrence. Addition of even more range lighting has significantly increased the after-dark use of the range. Club member parking outside the range along Seabeck Hwy. frequently reduces the highway to one and a half lanes, creating hazardous traffic conditions.

Arial photos show new berms and baffles have been arranged so that sound is focused directly toward my home. The photos also show major changes in the wetlands on the north side of the range and into the Newberry Hill Heritage Park lands. This area forms the headlands of Chico Creek. Drainage from the range appears to have been diverted directly into the wetlands, potentially carrying large quantities of water transportable lead particulate and oxides of heavy metals into the creek headwaters.

KRRC's apparent reckless disregard of land use and site development requirements have resulted in major impact on the health, safety, and welfare of surrounding residents and the local environment.

I request the County take action as defined in at least four sections of County Code to investigate and require correction of code violations at KRRC. I request to be informed of County actions as allowed by County Code section 21.04.100.

Commissioners

This is not about guns. It is about public safety, health, welfare, protection of the environment, and equal application of the rule of law in Kitsap County.

In simple terms, and as briefly as possible, Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) is now and has been for the past 5 years in violation of written orders from the County to stop all construction at KRRC until all required permit, land use, and critical area ordinance requirements have been met. KRRC has ignored the County's orders and has made major changes to the club range. KRRC certified to the Wa. State Interagency Office for Recreation (IAC, also referred to as RCO) that all County requirements have been met and has received about \$50,000 in publicly funded grants to pay for construction at the range. County records do not support KRRC's claim. Another grant totaling \$109,000 from IAC has been approved to continue construction, expansion, realignment at the range. County officials are aware of this, and detailed documentation exists in County records to support these facts. Piecemeal expansion and construction at KRRC has resulted in an even greater negative cumulative effect on nearby residents and the environment because no controls, constraints, or conformance inspections have ever been applied.

This latest round of construction

- has added a number of new firing lines and bays that are aimed directly at adjacent homes south and west of KRRC instead of away from these homes as is the case with the original and long established firing lines. This new alignment, plus the almost daily indiscriminate automatic weapons fire at KRRC presents a potentially lethal hazard to area residents. Noise levels outside the range have increased by orders of magnitude. This also will greatly affect public use of the Newberry Hill Heritage Park as aerial photos show new firing lines have also been built north of the pre-existing lines.
- has added even more outdoor range lighting, allowing the range to be used anytime members want instead of being restricted to the previous and historic daylight hours only. In August 2006, KRRC rejected a County requirement to obtain a conditional use permit that would require, among other things, evaluation of and authorization for range lights and extended hours of operation and address automatic weapons use at the range.
- The magnitude of construction done at KRRC and reported by KRRC to IAC far exceeds that defined in County code as a major development with attendant requirements for engineering evaluation and other controls. KRRC claims an in-house range design expert, whose credentials seem to consist of a certificate of attendance to an unidentified range operation and development conference and lots of time at shooting competitions, designed the range to improve sound attenuation and safety. The range does contain lots of pretty piles of dirt, and has a very nice new ADA ramp, but seems to lack basic consideration or understanding for the principals of geometry, ballistics, acoustics, hydrology, or environmental protection.
- Restructuring of the topography and drainage of the range appears to have caused major changes in the dynamics of the Chico Creek wetland areas adjoining and north of the range. A hazardous materials inspection of the range and wetlands areas by Kitsap County Health District performed in July 09 was embarrassingly superficial. No samples were taken for even baseline analysis; the inspector accepted statements from KRRC personnel that they had an effective lead and hazardous materials control program even though no records exist to support that claim. A very cursory review of industry standard practices, using data published by KRRC, indicates that significant percentage of several tons per year of water transportable particulate lead and other heavy metals and oxides are available for introduction into the Chico Creek drainage.

All this information exists in much greater detail in County, IAC, and DNR records. KRRC has a well-documented recent history of ignoring and/or obstructing attempts by the County and State to apply and enforce the laws, rules, and ordinances of the County and State to activities at the range. Complaints and requests for action to various County officials, including Commissioners, from private citizens and DNR

officials, have went unanswered since mid-2007. Local resident's interest and involvement in development and use of the Heritage Park has regenerated a determination and absolute necessity to get KRRC in compliance with the same laws and rules designed to apply to and to protect all residents instead of allowing one small group's limited and parochial interests to supersede and supplant the rights of others. I can't imagine the County tolerating the contempt and complete disregard for county code demonstrated by KRRC's actions from, for example, some company building a commercial go-cart racing track, so why is it acceptable for a gun range where the potential for disaster and the expectations for compliance to the law is so much greater?

I request the County Commissioners to direct and support the appropriate county departments to investigate and enforce, as necessary and warranted, county code, land use and critical areas ordinances and other laws as they apply to KRRC.

I request to be informed of any action taken, including non-action on this request, as provided for in County Code section 21.04.100.



**Summary:** Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) has significantly altered/modified their range facilities on Seabeck Hwy. over the past couple of years. These alterations/modifications are a major departure from traditional and historic usage of the range and have been done without approval or permit. Range alteration/modification completed and still in progress is in violation of county code and the terms of KRRC's lease with DNR. County planners and code enforcement personnel have been limited in the performance of their duties relating to KRRC by undue outside influence. All the above is clearly and unequivocally documented in county records.

These alterations/modifications present an immediate hazard to the safety and health of my family and have deprived us of the right to use and enjoy our home as we did for 15+ years previous to the changes.

I request the county take immediate, decisive, and effective action to correct this situation.

**Discussion:** I recently had the opportunity to review and copy county records relating to KRRC through a public records disclosure request (PDR). Violations of county code and the provisions of KRRC's lease with DNR concerning safety and the unregulated expansion and modification of the range facilities are substantive and well documented or referenced in county records. Problems with noise are a bit more subjective, but county code certainly specifies the required standards. The county on several occasions has identified the requirements for work done at the range to club officials. Club officials have repeatedly ignored or denied county input.

Issues with the KRRC all have been within the last couple of years. Complaints about the club have all been in that same time frame, and have all been from long-time residents of the area who have experienced the before and after problems resulting from modifications of the range firing lines and bays. We wouldn't be where we are now if it weren't for the efforts of a very small handful of club officers and members to change the way the range has operated for a lot of years into something that is of benefit to their interests without regard to the impact on the neighborhood.

KRRC now requires members to donate labor, materials, or money for projects at the range in addition to club dues as a condition of membership. Through these "donations", much of the work identified in KRRC's grant request for \$50,000 from the IAC has been completed or is in progress., including improvements in lighting, electrical service, access, and moving several hundred cubic yards of dirt to create new berms and firing

areas. There still have been no reviews, evaluations, approvals, or permits for any of this work.

Following your meeting on 1 May '07 with KRRC officials, a DCD senior planner, in an interdepartmental e-mail dated 5 May '07, ask the question "Because we still have complaints what do we tell the public?". The answer says "Joyce called...she said Comm Brown talked to Larry about it and everything has been handled. Said don't worry about it..". I assume Larry refers to Larry Keeton, Director of DCD. I also assume that whatever action you took is a matter of public record. However, there was nothing in the records as of 12 June '07 indicating what that action may be. Since I'm not real sure of where that record would be located, I have enclosed a PDR requesting that information be made available to me. Mr. Pat Hennessy, the lease manager at DNR, in an e-mail dated 23 April '07, stated he would request a written summary from the County to document code compliance or tasks required to insure compliance by KRRC. I have included a request for that summary in my PDR. I would appreciate it if you would have your staff direct the PDR to the right place.

My concerns remain the same. I want to be able to allow my grandkids and their friends to play outside in my yard without the feeling that I'm sending them out in the receiving end of a free-fire combat zone. Been there, done that, and didn't like it then either. I want to be able to take my 20 month old outside without him grabbing his ears and run to me crying because of the intensity of the noise when the altered firing line(s) at the range goes active. I don't want to spend the rest of my life with the stress and worry over what KRRC is going to do next to further deprive us of the right to use and enjoy our home. KRRC is not going to voluntarily correct the conditions that have caused these problems, and the problems aren't going to go away until the range is brought into compliance.

I request that KRRC be held accountable to the same rules that the rest of us have to abide by. The county has a very strong legal basis and certainly a ton of precedence to enforce the county codes as applied to KRRC. I welcome the opportunity to further discuss this with you or the appropriate county official as soon as possible.



The Navy's small arms range at Camp Wesley Harris on Seabeck Highway in unincorporated Kitsap County was closed and range buildings demolished about 3 years ago. Closure was reported to be in part because the range was in excess of the Navy's needs and because the range was located in the middle of a fairly densely populated area. Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) adjoins the former Navy range.

Uniformed Navy personnel now routinely use the KRRC range for small arms training, familiarization fire, and qualification. KRRC claims certification by the Navy as a military small arms range suitable for automatic weapons use. We understand that the small arms range on Bangor has the capacity, facilities, staff, and schedule availability to support all current and anticipated Navy needs.

KRRC has and continues to expand, modify, and realign firing lines at the Club's facilities in violation of Kitsap County code, land use ordinances, and site development requirements creating extreme hazards to the health, safety and welfare of area residents. Recent range realignment has resulted in 6 homes being less than 200 yards and more than 20 homes less than 500 yards directly downrange from new firing lines and bays. We are addressing these concerns separately with the County and State. Citizen complaints specifically about automatic weapons use and traffic congestion on Seabeck Highway caused by off-site parking reducing the highway to one and a half lanes are answered by KRRC as being caused by necessary and required Navy activities. There are indicators that most of the traffic congestion and most, if not all, of the undisciplined and after hours automatic weapons fire is actually caused by members of KRRC who find it convenient to attribute the problems to the Navy.

CENSECFOR PAO has informed me that a freedom of information request (FOI) on the Navy's use of KRRC can include only specifically identified records and documents and cannot answer questions. For a FOI, we request assistance from your command in identifying any instructions, procedures, standards, or protocols used by the Navy to qualify KRRC as a military small arms range, frequency of re-certification, qualifications of personnel performing the certifications, and any contracts with KRRC for use of their range by the Navy. We also request any available information on why the Navy continues to use KRRC if in fact the Bangor small arms range is adequate for the Navy's needs.

As an interesting but troubling aside, KRRC has posted on its public web site ([gunsafety.org](http://gunsafety.org)) a large number of photos clearly showing several civilian club members firing the Navy's M-60 machine guns and Navy personnel firing M-14s belonging to club members, along with a military humvee and M-16 use at various parts of the range.

Any assistance you can give us in this is greatly appreciated.
