The Gun Club started shooting @ 7:10A.M. this morning (Sunday). I'm lying in bed with my wife and our house is 1.65 miles from the KRRC. WE moved here 10 years ago and we never heard the club inside before this past months.

They are not shooting large weapons, but they are semi automatic, PLUS THEY ARE SHOOTING AT SOME OBJECT THAT EXPLODES WHEN IT'S HIT. I've talk with some x-members and they say that is a regular shooting exercise, shooting at these exploding balls or containers.

Why would anyone want to start shooting @ 7:00 A.M. on Sunday, unless they realize they are disturbing others and enjoy it.

Why is the County letting this practice continue. I have been doing research and this club has broken or ignored so many county codes and building permits. They've torn down wetlands, clear cut (that's why we hear them now), and expanded shooting bays from 2 to 16. All are against lease agreements, buy sell stipulations etc etc etc.

This has to stop. Somebody needs to stand up for the surrounding residents. In this day and time there is no reason our community should have to put up with this situation. The KRRC has only a small number of really active members, so I can't understand how such a select few can dominate the County and continue to harass some many law biding citizens.

Why hasn't the County done anything about soil and water sampling? I've been researching this aspect and KRRC may have thousands and thousands of lead and copper leaching into the water table.

Chico Creek I've found out is one of the states (maybe Northwest), biggest salmon (chum)runs and I'll bet it is polluted.

I look forward to working with you on this issue. Our group is growing and I know they are looking forward to working you and the other County Departments to stop this ridiculous situation.

As I mentioned in an e-mail sent about noise, I'm trying to finish up my presentation to you with some suggested solutions. I always want to be to offer solutions. You never know where an idea can come from.

I look forward to working with on this problem. We're having another meeting (Wednesday, 10th) of our community group. We've added more folks and are bringing them up to speed so we can hear their concerns and complaints, along with suggested ideas on how to solve the problem. several are x members, some are gun advocates. One thing they all say is the KRRC certainly has to conform to noise levels and be sensitive to neighbor complaints. Unfortunately that is not the position of the Gun Club members who continue to say we should all move away. On of the x-members said he quit because he did not agree with the plans for growth of shooting bays - which is now 16 vs the two they historically had. He said this is not consistent with the agreement to keep in line with restrictions originally put on the club.

Dear Mr. Brown,

A few weeks ago Gail Gross and myself had an appointment with you to discuss the increasingly loud gun noise from KRRC. We mentioned the Navy was shooting their and this is against any of the conditions I've read about the deal the County worked with the Club.

You were nice enough to call the Commanding Office at Bangor to check on whether the Navy was sending their personnel their to shoot. I believe you were told no. On KRRC web site they show four days this week Navy scheduled shooting. It's not just a couple guys. On Thursday and Friday they are scheduled from 10:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. On Monday and Tuesday they're scheduled 8:00 to 4:00.

This is not a few isolated guys coming out to shoot or adjust their sights. They are firing large caliber weapons repeatedly. This would be a good time for you to check it out.

I've been doing some reading and would like to find out more on petitioning to create a "No Shooting area" where the KRRC is located. The County has grown up around this range and what they did in the past is just no longer acceptable to the residents. From what I've seen the deal with the Gun Club clearly states they were to continue as they have in the past. In the past they were a small rifle and revolver club with a small membership. They are now public and have increased their firing power by allowing the military to shoot.

Forty years ago, even twenty years ago Kitsap County was relatively small and the club probably didn't interfere with many residents. The deal the County worked out with this Club clearly did not take into consideration the development around the club and the impact the noise would have.

There must be a solution to this growing problem. We are growing number of concerned citizens who would like very much to work with you and other Commissioners and County agencies to solve this before it get totally out of hand. The constant gun shot noise is damaging to the peace and quite all the residents of Kitsap County deserve. Surely the need of the many out way the need of a select few.

I look forward to continuing this conversation. Please contact me to set up another meeting at your convenience.

I want to go on record as protesting any consideration of additional land given, sold, or exchanged to the KRRC (Gun Club). This includes the 60 acres they've tried to request, plus the boundary switch they've recently requested.

The Gun Club was given 72 acres by the County for only a \$10 transfer fee. Property that had an assessed value over \$300,000 (2010) and could be worth up to \$800,000 when compared to surrounding acreage pricing. This was of one of worst decisions I've ever witnessed by the County. No consideration was given to the noise and pollution concerns to the residents or wetlands. The clubs recent expansion in number of firing lanes, clear cutting of trees and other improvements, with most of work done without the proper permits, has created a sound nightmare for the surrounding community and park.

I personally have driven neighborhoods and gotten signatures complaining of noise up to 4 miles away. Can you image how many homes and families this club is now adversely affecting. I've personally talked with families who's babies can't sleep, cry continuously when the firing begins. I've talked with a Grandfather who told me his grandchild is afraid to visit due to the gun sounds. Another set of grandparents can't let their grand kids play in their backyard for fear of stray bullets. The club has added firing lanes in which the new directions in their minds put their house in the direct line of fire.

In addition I've had families tell me that if the County Commissioners and Code enforcement don't do anything to correct this situation they will have to consider moving.

When you call the gun club to complain that is the exact response you get. " We were here first, we shouldn't have moved here." I'm sure the Kitsap County Development Agency will be proud to here their attitude. The County has let the community grow up around this problem and now the expansion has caused this problem to become a cancer.

Granted the club has been there longer, but consider the fact they never bought land. Instead they only leased. They have never invested in the community. Many of the members don't even live in close proximity of the club. Residents have spent hundreds of thousands of dollars buying their homes and paying their taxes. The KRRC can not say the same. In fact, if you go the County web site you'll find that they are behind on their taxes.

They didn't pay anything for the land they are now using. The County, in one of the most short sighted decisions, gave the 72 acres for free. Surely the County has to consider all this plus the fact they are adjacent to the planned new Heritage Park. The existing firing lanes, plus the clubs plan for a long range rifle firing lane would put the park in direct line of fire.

Imagine yourself going for a walk/hike in the park to see the wetlands and enjoy the wildlife or even having a picnic. Now imagine that walk destroyed by the constant sound of gun fire. Not just isolated single shots, but rapid fire of semi automatic and automatic weapons. On June 24, 2009, I visited the Kitsap Rifle & Revolver Club (KRRC) to conduct an Initial Investigation inspection. I had made an appointment. I arrived on site at 10 am and met with Marcus Carter, Brad Smith, Dan ?? and two other gentlemen that were officers of the club. I explained that I had received a complaint from Ecology on lead contamination at the range and I was investigating that concern. I also explained that the EPA BMP Guidance for ranges discusses range contamination issues. I asked if they were familiar with the document and they said Yes. Dan stated that he had a copy. I asked about lead recovery programs. I was told that KRRC has been doing lead recovery for at least 16 years (1993) . I asked about documentation. They said that they were starting to document as they just got title to the property but, that they could show that they have had lead recovery working parties through the club newsletter for many years.

We walked across all of the ranges. In general the areas of the property that we walked over were clean and well maintained. There is one large rifle range (200 yards), one large pistol range (50 yards), and about 10 small pistol ranges for competition shooting. All of the small ranges are backed by 8' to 10' high berms. Some trap and skeet shooting takes place on the rifle range. No shooting is allowed above the berms (except for some trap and skeet). Any rifle or pistol shooting above the berms immediately disqualifies the shooter. The impact zones of the ranges are all 95% or more sand. The pistol range is backed by a 10' to 12' high berm that has wetlands on the other side. There were no or little sign of rounds going over the berms on any of the ranges.

We spoke further after the walkthrough. I told the group that what I had seen of the KRRC looked good. I also said that the key points that I had gotten out of the EPA guidance manual was that the lead on the site must be kept within the boundaries of the ranges, a lead recovery program must be in place, and that they must document the lead recovery. Based on what I saw and learned while talking to them the first two items were taken care of appropriately. The documentation of the lead recovery needs to be active and ongoing. I told them that I believed that the complaint was without merit, but that I would make a note in my calendar to check back with them in 6 months to look at their documentation.

We discussed MTCA and the II process. We also talked about sampling. Whether or not I would be tasked by Ecology to sample, what I would sample for, what they could sample for, etc. Dan indicated that the club would be looking at sampling portions of the club for their own information. I left the site about 11 am.

I met with the representatives of the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) yesterday. We had arranged an appointment for 2 pm. I arrived on site at about 1:50 pm and met Dan Daniels (Environmental Stewardship Chairman), Marcus Carter (Executive Director), and Brad Smith (President).

We met in an office onsite where Mr. Daniels showed me his procedure for pH testing of the soil at KRRC. Mr. Daniels was using a pH meter and logging results in a lab notebook. The method used was thorough and included quality control measures. Calibration solutions, a soil baking oven, and de-ionized water were all onsite. I asked Mr. Daniels to write up the procedure so that others could check soil pH should he not be available. I told them that the pH testing methods they were using were above and beyond what was needed for the KRRC.

We spoke of the Lead Recovery Program and what the KRRC had accomplished. They have established a log book for lead recovery. Apparently individual members of the KRRC regularly dig in the ranges for lead. The log book is used to note who, the weight, purpose, where from, and date of the recovery. Also some lead will be recovered during work parties on the weekends. The data from that recovery will be recorded in the log book also. I checked the book and noted about 10 entries for individuals with recovery amounts ranging from 5 lbs to 45 lbs. There is a scale in the office for weighing the lead. The dates range back to September (?) of 2009. In most cases reloading ammunition was to be the use of the recovered lead.

Mr. Carter noted that they had been in contact with several firms that do whole range lead removal and are discussing having one of these firms come out to the KCCR and do the entire site. I asked the KRRC to write out a procedure for the lead recovery program. I reminded them that there was a sample program in the back of the EPA BMP manual.

I recommended that the KRRC consider soil testing for lead. I stated that as far as I knew there was no requirement for it but that if they knew what was going on with their soil they would be better off. We discussed where samples would be taken. We talked about several in the ranges at about 2 feet deep and of the sediment at the inflow and outflow areas for stormwater at the property.

We discussed lead toxicity and what steps the KRRC was taking to educate club members. Hand washing after shooting or handling lead, discussions of lead toxicity during trainings, etc. was among the steps that have been taken.

Mr. Smith asked about the rules that the club had to comply with and I told him about the local and state solid waste rules, the Model Toxics Control Act (WAC 173-340), and the EPA BMP Manual for Gun Ranges. Mr. Daniels mention the federal rule called the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). We discussed how the EPA BMP Manual was the guidance that the Health District would be following based on the recommendation of Washington State Department of Ecology.

We did a quick walk around of the site. The site looked good with minimal litter, the berms in decent shape, and little brass on the ground. Mr. Carter noted that a work party this weekend was going to be doing some cleanup after the winter weather. I took several photos during the walk around.

We agreed that the Health District would visit the KRRC again in August of 2010 to check on the written lead recovery and the pH testing programs. I left the site at approximately 3:40 pm.

I want to go on record as protesting any consideration of additional land given, sold, or exchanged to the KRRC (Gun Club). This includes the 60 acres they've tried to request, plus the boundary switch they've recently requested.

The Gun Club was given 72 acres by the County for only a \$10 transfer fee. Property that had an assessed value over \$300,000 (2010) and could be worth up to \$800,000 when compared to surrounding acreage pricing. This was one of the worst decisions I've ever witnessed by the County. No consideration was given to the noise and pollution concerns to the residents or wetlands. The club's recent expansion in number of firing lanes, clear cutting of trees and other improvements, with most of the work done without the proper permits, has created a sound nightmare for the surrounding community and park.

I personally have driven neighborhoods and gotten signatures complaining of noise up to 4 miles away. Can you imagine how many homes and families this club is now adversely affecting. I've personally talked with families whose babies can't sleep, cry continuously when the firing begins. I've talked with a Grandfather who told me his grandchild is afraid to visit due to the gun sounds. Another set of grandparents can't let their grandkids play in their backyard for fear of stray bullets. The club has added firing lanes in which the new directions in their minds put their house in the direct line of fire.

In addition I've had families tell me that if the County Commissioners and Code enforcement don't do anything to correct this situation they will have to consider moving.

When you call the gun club to complain that is the exact response you get. " We were here first, we shouldn't have moved here." I'm sure the Kitsap County Development Agency will be proud to have their attitude. The County has let the community grow up around this problem and now the expansion has caused this problem to become a cancer.

Granted the club has been there longer, but consider the fact they never bought land. Instead they only leased. They have never invested in the community. Many of the members don't even live in close proximity of the club. Residents have spent hundreds of thousands of dollars buying their homes and paying their taxes. The KRRC can not say the same. In fact, if you go to the County web site you'll find that they are behind on their taxes.

They didn't pay anything for the land they are now using. The County, in one of the most short sighted decisions, gave the 72 acres for free. Surely the County has to consider all this plus the fact they are adjacent to the planned new Heritage Park. The existing firing lanes, plus the club's plan for a long range rifle firing lane would put the park in direct line of fire.

Imagine yourself going for a walk/hike in the park to see the wetlands and enjoy the wildlife or even having a picnic. Now imagine that walk destroyed by the constant sound of gun fire. Not just isolated single shots, but rapid fire of semi automatic and automatic weapons. This is what the future visitors of Heritage Park will experience if the County does not step up and address this unworkable relationship.

The KRRC can not be a good neighbor at it's present or anticipated future levels. They don't want to be good neighbors. They only care about their right to shot their guns. They do not care about the rights of the surrounding residents to enjoy their property in relative peace and quite.

In my talks with the surrounding residents I have found that people are not anti guns. They don't want to take away anyone's rights, they just want the club to maintain the historical usage patterns.

Counties, I have learned, all over the country are facing the same problems with gun clubs. The County Officials have all come to same conclusion, " unrestricted outdoor shooting ranges are environmental problems". They represent continuous noise pollution, as well as soil and water contamination to the urban residents. Counties have put in place shooting restrictions, such as types of weapons, hours of operation and limits on who can use the range. These are solutions Kitsap County Officials should put in place until KRRC has been forced to clean-up its lead contamination and submit to all the county agencies reviews. The relationship and level of noise must be addressed before any growth above the historic levels can be approved. Note: There were never any complaints of the gun club, prior to 2002, when they operated with their historical usage of one pistol and one rifle firing lanes. They are operating 16 lanes now at it obviously is to much.

To have a good relationship with the Heritage Park it is time for the County to roll back the usage, investigate the grounds and bring the KRRC into compliance. All of this, now the land has been given to the KRRC members, has to be paid for by the club and its members. It's time they invested in the community and became a good neighbor.

I want to go on record as protesting any consideration of additional land given, sold, or exchanged to the KRRC (Gun Club). This includes the 60 acres they've tried to request, plus the boundary switch they've recently requested.

The Gun Club was given 72 acres by the County for only a \$10 transfer fee. Property that had an assessed value over \$300,000 (2010) and could be worth up to \$800,000 when compared to surrounding acreage pricing. This was of one of worst decisions I've ever witnessed by the County. No consideration was given to the noise and pollution concerns to the residents or wetlands. The clubs recent expansion in number of firing lanes, clear cutting of trees and other improvements, with most of work done without the proper permits, has created a sound nightmare for the surrounding community and park.

I personally have driven neighborhoods and gotten signatures complaining of noise up to 4 miles away. Can you image how many homes and families this club is now adversely affecting. I've personally talked with families who's babies can't sleep, cry continuously when the firing begins. I've talked with a Grandfather who told me his grandchild is afraid to visit due to the gun sounds. Another set of grandparents can't let their grand kids play in their backyard for fear of stray bullets. The club has added firing lanes in which the new directions in their minds put their house in the direct line of fire.

In addition I've had families tell me that if the County Commissioners and Code enforcement don't do anything to correct this situation they will have to consider moving.

When you call the gun club to complain that is the exact response you get. " We were here first, we shouldn't have moved here." I'm sure the Kitsap County Development Agency will be proud to here their attitude. The County has let the community grow up around this problem and now the expansion has caused this problem to become a cancer.

Granted the club has been there longer, but consider the fact they never bought land. Instead they only leased. They have never invested in the community. Many of the members don't even live in close proximity of the club. Residents have spent hundreds of thousands of dollars buying their homes and paying their taxes. The KRRC can not say the same. In fact, if you go the County web site you'll find that they are behind on their taxes.

They didn't pay anything for the land they are now using. The County, in one of the most short sighted decisions, gave the 72 acres for free. Surely the County has to consider all this plus the fact they are adjacent to the planned new Heritage Park. The existing firing lanes, plus the clubs plan for a long range rifle firing lane would put the park in direct line of fire.

Imagine yourself going for a walk/hike in the park to see the wetlands and enjoy the wildlife or even having a picnic. Now imagine that walk destroyed by the constant sound of gun fire. Not just isolated single shots, but rapid fire of semi automatic and automatic weapons. This is what the future visitors of Heritage Park will experience if the County does not step up and address this unworkable relationship.

The KRRC can not be a good neighbor at it's present or anticipated future levels. They don't want to be good neighbors. They only care about their right to shot their guns. They do not care about the rights of the surrounding residents to enjoy their property in relative peace and quite.

In my talks with the surrounding residents I have found that people are not anti guns. They don't want to take away anyone's rights, they just want the club to maintain the historical usage patterns.

Counties, I have learned, all over the country are facing the same problems with gun clubs. The County Officials have all come to same conclusion, " unrestricted outdoor shooting ranges are environmental problems". They represent continuous noise pollution, as well as soil and water contamination to the urban residents. Counties have put in place shooting restrictions, such as types of weapons, hours of operation and limits on who can use the range. These are solutions Kitsap County Officials should put in place until KRRC has been forced to clean-up its lead contamination and submit to all the county agencies reviews. The relationship and level of noise must be addressed before any growth above the historic levels can be approved. Note: There were never any complaints of the gun club, prior to 2002, when they operated with their historical usage of one pistol and one rifle firing lanes. They are operating 16 lanes now at it obviously is to much.

To have a good relationship with the Heritage Park it is time for the County to roll back the usage, investigate the grounds and bring the KRRC into compliance. All of this, now the land has been given to the KRRC members, has to be paid for by the club and its members. It's time they invested in the community and became a good neighbor.

We are writing to complain about the increased noise from the Kitsap Rifle & Revolver Club in Bremerton. We live a mile and a half from the club and are able to easily hear the shooting. We are hearing the firing of automatic and semi-automatic weapons. The noise wakes us up at night and in the early morning, and makes it unpleasant to have outdoor family barbecues.

At least as important, if not more, than the noise level is the damage and devastation KRRC is causing to Chico Creek and the wetlands which abut KRRC's property. We understand the KRRC increased its shooting lanes from 2 to 16 without any sort of permit, which accounts for the added noise over the last couple years. We also understand that during its more than 80 years of operation, the KRRC has failed to perform any type of cleanup of its grounds. What kind of contamination is this putting into Chico Creek and the surrounding wetlands? The adjacent Camp Wesley Harris was closed due to pollution and KRRC does not seem to care what kind of impact it is having. As you all know, this impact can be devastating for years to come. Do you realize that, on average, shooting ranges could have up to 1 million pounds of lead in the soil after a few decades of operation? Don't you think it's time KRRC starts being responsible and clean up their area of all the lead it has been putting onto and into its grounds since its inception in 1926? Have the wetlands and/or Chico Creek ever been tested for water quality?

Why were there no public hearings or concerns for the surrounding residents (some as far as 4 miles away from the club are hearing the shooting) when Kitsap County granted 72 acres to KRRC?

We also protest any further "grants" by Kitsap County of property to the Kitsap Rifle & Revolver Club in Bremerton. Any further expansion of the club would cause that much more noise pollution and would further damage the wetlands surrounding the club. In addition, there would be potential physical danger to any who wish to use any planned park or outdoor recreation areas near the club, not to mention listening to gunfire while trying to enjoy the outdoors.

**BARGAIN AND SALE DEED
WITH RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS**

GRANTOR: Kitsap County

GRANTEE: Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club, a Washington Non-Profit Corporation

LEGAL DESCRIPTION: A Portion of 36251W Bldg Value (Land Value Carried Under Acct. No. 362501-2-001-1001)

ASSESSOR'S TAX PARCEL NO: 362501-2-002-1000

For and in consideration of \$10.00 and other good and valuable consideration, Kitsap County, as Grantor, bargains, sells and conveys all of it's right, title and interest in and to the real property described on Exhibit A hereto to the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club, and Washington Non-Profit Corporation, as Grantee.

This conveyance is made subject to the following covenants and conditions, the benefits of which shall inure to the benefit of the public and the burdens of which shall bind the Grantee and the heirs, successors and assigns of the Grantee in perpetuity.

1. Grantee for and on behalf of itself, its heirs, successors and assigns, and each subsequent owner of the property described in Exhibit A hereto, hereby releases and agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend Kitsap County, its elected officials, employees and agents from and against any liabilities, penalties, fines, charges, costs, losses, damages, expenses, causes of actions, claims, demands, orders, judgments, or administrative actions, including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, arising from or in anyway connected with (1) injury to or the death of any person or the physical damage to any property, resulting from any act, activity, omission, condition or other matter related to or occurring on or about the property, regardless of cause, unless due solely to the gross negligence of any of

the indemnified parties; (2) the violation or alleged violation of, or other failure to comply with, any state, federal, or local law, regulation or requirement, including, without limitation, CERCLA and MTCA, by any person in anyway effecting, involving, or relating to the property; (3) the presence or release in, on, from, or about the property, at any time, past or present, of any substance now or hereafter defined, listed, or otherwise classified pursuant to any federal, state or local law regulation, or requirement as hazardous, toxic, polluting, or otherwise contaminating to the air, water, or soil, or anyway harmful or threatening to human health or the environment.

2. Grantee shall maintain commercial general liability insurance coverage for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage, subject to a limit of not less than \$2 million dollars per occurrence. The general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this covenant and be no less than \$5 million. The grantee will provide commercial general liability coverage that does not exclude any activity to be performed in fulfillment of grantees activities as a shooting range. Specialized forms specific to the industry of the Grantee will be deemed equivalent, provided coverage is no more restrictive that would be provided under a standard commercial general liability policy, including contractual liability coverage.

3. Grantee shall confine its active shooting range facilities on the property consistent with its historical use of approximately eight (8) acres of active shooting ranges with the balance of the property serving as safety and noise buffer zones. It is the intent of the parties that the activities of Grantee shall conform to the rules and regulations of the Firearms Range Account, administered by the State Recreation and Conservation Office. This account is established by the legislature upon the following finding: "Firearms are collected, used for hunting; recreational shooting, and self-defense, and firearm owners as well as bow users need safe, accessible areas in which to shoot their equipment. Approved shooting ranges provide that opportunity, while at the same time, promote public safety. Interest in all shooting sports has increased while safe locations to shoot have been lost to the pressures of urban growth." (Wash. Laws 1990 ch. 195 Section 1.)

4. Grantee's activities shall also conform to the Firearms and Archery Range (FARR) Program as found in Chapter 79A.25 RCW. The primary goals of this program are to assist with acquisition, development, and renovation of firearm and archery range facilities to provide for increased general public access to ranges. This includes access by a) law enforcement personnel; b) members of the general public with concealed pistol or hunting licenses; and c) those enrolled in firearm or hunter safety education classes. Access by the public to Grantee's property shall be offered at reasonable prices and on a nondiscriminatory basis.

5. Grantee agrees to operate the shooting range at all times in a safe and prudent manner and conform its' activities to accepted industry standards and practices.

6. Mineral Reservations, held by the State of Washington, that run with the land.

7. Existing Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP), as detailed below:

The site has been publicly identified for conservation provisions applying to, but not limited to: murrelet habitat; spotted owl nest sites; wolves; grizzly bears; nests, communal roosts, or feeding concentrations of bald eagles; peregrine falcon nests; Columbian white-tailed deer; Aleutian Canada geese; and Oregon silverspot butterflies. The existing Habitat Conservation Plan is to remain in effect, regardless of parcel segregation or aggregation or potential sale or land transfer.

8. Riparian Management Zones, as detailed below:

Bodies of water, including but not limited to those streams, rivers and lakes and other lakes and wetlands have been identified and/or may be located on the Premises. All activities within the Riparian Management Zone, as defined in the existing and publicly-filed Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) and including that portion of the inner riparian ecosystem between the aquatic zone and the direct influence zone (uplands) and including the outer wind buffer, must comply with and remain in compliance with the current HCP Procedures. Activities in a Riparian Management Zone, including but not limited to cutting or removing any tree and/or timber (including hardwood, merchantable and unmerchantable timber, downed timber, windthrow and snags), and road, trench and/or trail use, and/or maintenance, may be restricted or not permitted during specific times. All activities must provide for no overall net loss of naturally occurring wetland function. These protective measures are to run with the land, regardless of parcel segregation or aggregation or potential sale or land transfer.

Dear Members of the Board for the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club,

Recently the Department of Ecology has received complaints alleging that unauthorized clearing and grading activities have been taking place within the boundaries of your facility. The Department of Ecology is respectfully requesting an opportunity to meet with you or your representative(s) at the facility to determine the validity of these allegations. We would like to coordinate our visit with other local, state and federal agencies so that disruption of your daily operations can be kept at a minimum.

On March 2, 2010 I visited a neighboring site located at 4792 Seabeck Highway where I viewed recent clearing along the property line which extended through an existing seasonal stream. This neighbor informed me (and others) of the intent by KR&RC to create a perimeter road around the KR&RC property. In viewing your own web-site I have found that there is a planned Work Party scheduled for April 17-18, 2010 with one of the proposed actions being to blaze a perimeter road/brushing out property line. Given the extensive wetland areas in the vicinity of your property, it is a concern of Ecology that wetland areas might be negatively impacted from this proposed activity. I believe that it is in the best interest of all parties to discuss the implications of any action(s) that would affect waters of the state and to assist you in any permitting that may be required. Any work within waters of the state requires authorization from state agencies.

Paul Anderson, another staff person from the Department of Ecology will likely accompany me for the site visit in part because we both need to visit the UW facility on Big Beef Creek to coordinate an educational program that we hope to do at that location.

In summary, Ecology staff requests a coordinated meeting at your facility with local, state, federal and tribal agencies to discuss concerns about alleged violations and or/potential impacts to critical areas that need to be properly permitted. Given that at least some of this activity appears to have already been started (brushing the perimeter), there appears to be an immediate need for the interagency meeting to discuss these actions.

Since I haven't learned how to attach two files to one e-mail, I'm sending another with the billing summary for the grant. Note that the site prep clearing column was later revised to 2.4 acres. The 8012 cubic yards of cut and fill includes the ditches for the new drainage.

I would encourage you to work with Kitsap County as they are the local jurisdiction that is responsible for issuing permits and enforcing local ordinances (including noise enforcement.) In terms of our grant programs, the 2009 FARR projects were presented at the Recreation and Conservation Board (RCFB) meeting in November of 2009, and subsequently approved. The RCFB meetings are open to the public and there is always opportunity for public testimony. Our Board Meeting dates are published on our website (http://www.rco.wa.gov/boards/rcfb_meetings.shtml) and are usually held here in Olympia. Included on our website is a document for your reference that talks about the purview of our Board and how to provide your testimony, you can find this document at: (<http://www.rco.wa.gov/documents/ProvidingPublicComment.pdf>)

Again, I would like to reiterate that land use decisions, such as a project's location, environmental impact, zoning, or other effects on a community, are outside the board's authority. The board's evaluation committees may score a project on how well it conforms to a community comprehensive plan, but the board does not review the decision of the local government on whether a project meets its zoning or has thoroughly addressed environmental impacts. Grant agreements require the grant recipient to secure all permits before beginning construction.

We are writing to complain about the increased noise from the Kitsap Rifle & Revolver Club in Bremerton. We live a mile and a half from the club and are able to easily hear the shooting. We are hearing the firing of automatic and semi-automatic weapons. The noise wakes us up at night and in the early morning, and makes it unpleasant to have outdoor family barbecues.

At least as important, if not more, than the noise level is the damage and devastation KRRC is causing to Chico Creek and the wetlands which abut KRRC's property. We understand the KRRC increased its shooting lanes from 2 to 16 without any sort of permit, which accounts for the added noise over the last couple years. We also understand that during its more than 80 years of operation, the KRRC has failed to perform any type of cleanup of its grounds. What kind of contamination is this putting into Chico Creek and the surrounding wetlands? The adjacent Camp Wesley Harris was closed due to pollution and KRRC does not seem to care what kind of impact it is having. As you all know, this impact can be devastating for years to come. Do you realize that, on average, shooting ranges could have up to 1 million pounds of lead in the soil after a few decades of operation? Don't you think it's time KRRC starts being responsible and clean up their area of all the lead it has been putting onto and into its grounds since its inception in 1926? Have the wetlands and/or Chico Creek ever been tested for water quality?

Why were there no public hearings or concerns for the surrounding residents (some as far as 4 miles away from the club are hearing the shooting) when Kitsap County granted 72 acres to KRRC?

We also protest any further "grants" by Kitsap County of property to the Kitsap Rifle & Revolver Club in Bremerton. Any further expansion of the club would cause that much more noise pollution and would further damage the wetlands surrounding the club. In addition, there would be potential physical danger to any who wish to use any planned park or outdoor recreation areas near the club, not to mention listening to gunfire while trying to enjoy the outdoors.







Dear Members of the Board for the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club,

Recently the Department of Ecology has received complaints alleging that unauthorized clearing and grading activities have been taking place within the boundaries of your facility. The Department of Ecology is respectfully requesting an opportunity to meet with you or your representative(s) at the facility to determine the validity of these allegations. We would like to coordinate our visit with other local, state and federal agencies so that disruption of your daily operations can be kept at a minimum.

On March 2, 2010 I visited a neighboring site located at 4792 Seabeck Highway where I viewed recent clearing along the property line which extended through an existing seasonal stream. This neighbor informed me (and others) of the intent by KR&RC to create a perimeter road around the KR&RC property. In viewing your own web-site I have found that there is a planned Work Party scheduled for April 17-18, 2010 with one of the proposed actions being to blaze a perimeter road/brushing out property line. Given the extensive wetland areas in the vicinity of your property, it is a concern of Ecology that wetland areas might be negatively impacted from this proposed activity. I believe that it is in the best interest of all parties to discuss the implications of any action(s) that would affect waters of the state and to assist you in any permitting that may be required. Any work within waters of the state requires authorization from state agencies.

Paul Anderson, another staff person from the Department of Ecology will likely accompany me for the site visit in part because we both need to visit the UW facility on Big Beef Creek to coordinate an educational program that we hope to do at that location.

In summary, Ecology staff requests a coordinated meeting at your facility with local, state, federal and tribal agencies to discuss concerns about alleged violations and or/potential impacts to critical areas that need to be properly permitted. Given that at least some of this activity appears to have already been started (brushing the perimeter), there appears to be an immediate need for the interagency meeting to discuss these actions.



I would encourage you to work with Kitsap County as they are the local jurisdiction that is responsible for issuing permits and enforcing local ordinances (including noise enforcement.) In terms of our grant programs, the 2009 FARR projects were presented at the Recreation and Conservation Board (RCFB) meeting in November of 2009, and subsequently approved. The RCFB meetings are open to the public and there is always opportunity for public testimony. Our Board Meeting dates are published on our website (http://www.rco.wa.gov/boards/rcfb_meetings.shtml) and are usually held here in Olympia. Included on our website is a document for your reference that talks about the purview of our Board and how to provide your testimony, you can find this document at: (<http://www.rco.wa.gov/documents/ProvidingPublicComment.pdf>)

Again, I would like to reiterate that land use decisions, such as a project's location, environmental impact, zoning, or other effects on a community, are outside the board's authority. The board's evaluation committees may score a project on how well it conforms to a community comprehensive plan, but the board does not review the decision of the local government on whether a project meets its zoning or has thoroughly addressed environmental impacts. Grant agreements require the grant recipient to secure all permits before beginning construction.

My name is Kevin Howell and I am a deputy prosecuting attorney for Kitsap County. Having received no response from you to my earlier phone message, I will attempt contact through email.

The RCO has awarded several grants to the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club in recent years for certain improvements to its shooting range facilities in the central Kitsap area. From review of correspondence between your office and KRRC, it is clear that the club was to have submitted copies of building and other land use permits to your agency for the work the grants were to partially pay. Please let this note serve as notice that the KRRC has not applied for nor received the local permits for most of the recent works at its facility.

Representatives of the regional Indian Tribes, the US Corps of Engineers, the state Departments of Ecology and Fish and Wildlife as well as our county's Department of Community Development are alarmed at the clearing and grading activities that have taken place in environmentally sensitive areas of the KRRC property. All of these agencies anticipate a joint site inspection in the near future to assess the extent of the environmental disturbance and construction activities.

My question to you is whether RCO still controls any grant funds earmarked for KRRC activities and whether these funds may be sequestered until we learn the extent of the damage done by KRRC's activities?

Thank you in advance for your prompt attention to these matters.

Dear Members of the Board for the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club,

Recently the Department of Ecology has received complaints alleging that unauthorized clearing and grading activities have been taking place within the boundaries of your facility. The Department of Ecology is respectfully requesting an opportunity to meet with you or your representative(s) at the facility to determine the validity of these allegations. We would like to coordinate our visit with other local, state and federal agencies so that disruption of your daily operations can be kept at a minimum.

On March 2, 2010 I visited a neighboring site located at 4792 Seabeck Highway where I viewed recent clearing along the property line which extended through an existing seasonal stream. This neighbor informed me (and others) of the intent by KR&RC to create a perimeter road around the KR&RC property. In viewing your own web-site I have found that there is a planned Work Party scheduled for April 17-18, 2010 with one of the proposed actions being to blaze a perimeter road/brushing out property line. Given the extensive wetland areas in the vicinity of your property, it is a concern of Ecology that wetland areas might be negatively impacted from this proposed activity. I believe that it is in the best interest of all parties to discuss the implications of any action(s) that would affect waters of the state and to assist you in any permitting that may be required. Any work within waters of the state requires authorization from state agencies.

Paul Anderson, another staff person from the Department of Ecology will likely accompany me for the site visit in part because we both need to visit the UW facility on Big Beef Creek to coordinate an educational program that we hope to do at that location.

In summary, Ecology staff requests a coordinated meeting at your facility with local, state, federal and tribal agencies to discuss concerns about alleged violations and or/potential impacts to critical areas that need to be properly permitted. Given that at least some of this activity appears to have already been started (brushing the perimeter), there appears to be an immediate need for the interagency meeting to discuss these actions.



I met with the representatives of the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club (KRRC) yesterday. We had arranged an appointment for 2 pm. I arrived on site at about 1:50 pm and met Dan Daniels (Environmental Stewardship Chairman), Marcus Carter (Executive Director), and Brad Smith (President).

We met in an office onsite where Mr. Daniels showed me his procedure for pH testing of the soil at KRRC. Mr. Daniels was using a pH meter and logging results in a lab notebook. The method used was thorough and included quality control measures. Calibration solutions, a soil baking oven, and de-ionized water were all onsite. I asked Mr. Daniels to write up the procedure so that others could check soil pH should he not be available. I told them that the pH testing methods they were using were above and beyond what was needed for the KRRC.

We spoke of the Lead Recovery Program and what the KRRC had accomplished. They have established a log book for lead recovery. Apparently individual members of the KRRC regularly dig in the ranges for lead. The log book is used to note who, the weight, purpose, where from, and date of the recovery. Also some lead will be recovered during work parties on the weekends. The data from that recovery will be recorded in the log book also. I checked the book and noted about 10 entries for individuals with recovery amounts ranging from 5 lbs to 45 lbs. There is a scale in the office for weighing the lead. The dates range back to September (?) of 2009. In most cases reloading ammunition was to be the use of the recovered lead.

Mr. Carter noted that they had been in contact with several firms that do whole range lead removal and are discussing having one of these firms come out to the KCCR and do the entire site. I asked the KRRC to write out a procedure for the lead recovery program. I reminded them that there was a sample program in the back of the EPA BMP manual.

I recommended that the KRRC consider soil testing for lead. I stated that as far as I knew there was no requirement for it but that if they knew what was going on with their soil they would be better off. We discussed where samples would be taken. We talked about several in the ranges at about 2 feet deep and of the sediment at the inflow and outflow areas for stormwater at the property.

On June 24, 2009, I visited the Kitsap Rifle & Revolver Club (KRRC) to conduct an Initial Investigation inspection. I had made an appointment. I arrived on site at 10 am and met with Marcus Carter, Brad Smith, Dan ?? and two other gentlemen that were officers of the club. I explained that I had received a complaint from Ecology on lead contamination at the range and I was investigating that concern. I also explained that the EPA BMP Guidance for ranges discusses range contamination issues. I asked if they were familiar with the document and they said Yes. Dan stated that he had a copy. I asked about lead recovery programs. I was told that KRRC has been doing lead recovery for at least 16 years (1993) . I asked about documentation. They said that they were starting to document as they just got title to the property but, that they could show that they have had lead recovery working parties through the club newsletter for many years.

We walked across all of the ranges. In general the areas of the property that we walked over were clean and well maintained. There is one large rifle range (200 yards), one large pistol range (50 yards), and about 10 small pistol ranges for competition shooting. All of the small ranges are backed by 8' to 10' high berms. Some trap and skeet shooting takes place on the rifle range. No shooting is allowed above the berms (except for some trap and skeet). Any rifle or pistol shooting above the berms immediately disqualifies the shooter. The impact zones of the ranges are all 95% or more sand. The pistol range is backed by a 10' to 12' high berm that has wetlands on the other side. There were no or little sign of rounds going over the berms on any of the ranges.

We spoke further after the walkthrough. I told the group that what I had seen of the KRRC looked good. I also said that the key points that I had gotten out of the EPA guidance manual was that the lead on the site must be kept within the boundaries of the ranges, a lead recovery program must be in place, and that they must document the lead recovery. Based on what I saw and learned while talking to them the first two items were taken care of appropriately. The documentation of the lead recovery needs to be active and ongoing. I told them that I believed that the complaint was without merit, but that I would make a note in my calendar to check back with them in 6 months to look at their documentation.

We discussed MTCA and the II process. We also talked about sampling. Whether or not I would be tasked by Ecology to sample, what I would sample for, what they could sample for, etc. Dan indicated that the club would be looking at sampling portions of the club for their own information. I left the site about 11 am.
