Discussion Paper: Donor Recognition Plaques

June 13, 2017

The Homes For All Committee has discussed recognizing organizations and individuals who make a major contribution to low income housing projects by creating a plaque that honors the donor/organization. A plaque could be placed on each individual dwelling recognizing one donor or listing all donors on one plaque that is posted in a central location. This paper has been prepared by the League of Women Voters Kitsap (LWVK) to encourage discussion and consensus by Homes For All Committee members. This paper is directed at cottages.

Plaque: For cottages (i.e. tiny houses) we recommend a centrally located plaque (e.g. placed on the modular) that honors all major donors rather than individual plaques placed on a house. A house by house plaque may compromise the resident's sense of belonging and pride in her/his dwelling. In addition, one plaque that lists all donors avoids the logistics of having more major donors than cottages.

Definition of Major Donor: We recommend that donors qualifying for recognition are those who have donated the full cost of a cottage or who have provided a significant in-kind contribution, and others as decided by the Committee.

Plaque Material/Cost: Housing Kitsap gives "sweat equity" home owners a laser cut, laser torched plaque that says "Welcome Home" (sample attached). This plaque is made by the South Kitsap High School welding class students and Housing Kitsap reimburses the school \$10.00 per plaque for the cost of the material. Individual donor plaques will be more involved so the cost per plaque would be higher. Further, it is not known if the local high schools have the capability to make a plaque that the Committee decides to pursue. We have not looked into the cost of a plaque that recognizes all donors of a project. Student and/or local manufacturing are preferred.

Plaque Size: The Committee's decision on individual plaques versus one plaque to recognize all donors will dictate the size. It is recommended that individual size plaques be no larger than 5X7.

Plaque Contents: We recommend the donor's name, logo if any and the Homes For All logo be on the plaque along with the year the housing project is dedicated.

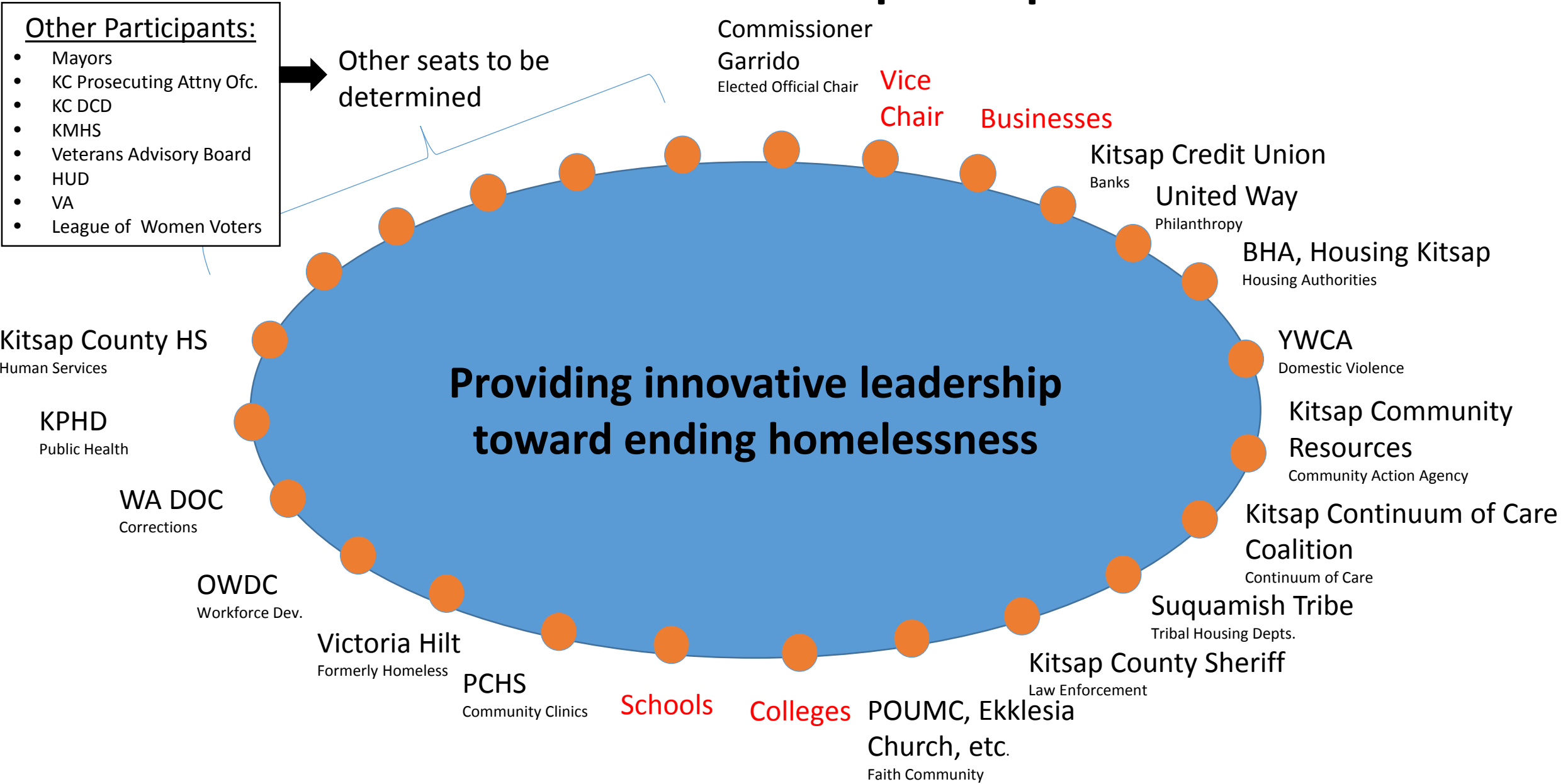
