Members are eligible to enter the family living area if they are enrolled in any of the home arts projects (i.e. Adventures in Family Living, juniors only project, Cooking, Sewing, Babysitting and Needle Arts). *Please note that only members enrolled in the Family Living Project as juniors may take a blue ribbon exhibit on to state Fair for still life.

Classroom projects that are not part of 4-H Enrichment program are not eligible for exhibition.

Exhibits are to be entered on Monday of Fair week between 12:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. All exhibits must have a 3"x5" card with the following information:

- a. Age and grade of the exhibitor
- b. 4-H age division
- c. Title of enrolled project (i.e. AFL, Foods of the Northwest, Clothes that Click, etc.)
- d. How item is to be used and where (BE SPECIFIC)
- e. How item was made and years using this technique, again, be specific. Please indicate if this item was made from a kit or if it was your own design. Tell us if you made this as a special gift.
- f. Care instructions for items made with fabric or yarn.

Items entered without above information will be dropped one ribbon placing. All items are to be completed by the 4-H member during the present club year. Exhibits will be entered in the lot number that most closely describes the type of item made. At the discretion of the Judges or Superintendents, exhibits may be changed to different lots and /or premium points adjusted to reflect the degree of difficulty.
