

# OPEN CLASS LIVESTOCK/ANIMAL ENTRY

## GENERAL RULES

1. All exhibitors in the Kitsap County Fair must comply with all rules and regulations as set forth by the Kitsap County Fair. Violation of any rules or regulations may be cause for disqualification of any exhibitor and may result in such exhibitor being removed from Kitsap County Fairgrounds and forfeit all premiums defined in General Rules.
2. Removal of any exhibit, prior to dismissal time, from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the exhibitor. Further, exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Kitsap County Fair.
3. **EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY:** Any person, regardless of place of residence, may enter all entries for livestock to be exhibited in the Kitsap County Fair. However, entries will be accepted from the Kitsap County area first, Kitsap Peninsula area second, with out-of-County third on a first come, first served basis, subject to space availability. Entry fee will be refunded if exhibit is not accepted due to space availability. If it is ascertained that an animal or exhibit is entered in a division or class in which it does not belong, the Superintendent may, at their discretion, correct the entry and place the animal or exhibit in the classification where it properly belongs and will so notify the entry clerk. No animal from any quarantined premises will be permitted to enter the Fair. Exhibitors are limited to two premiums per lot, however, may enter as many specimens as desired. Animals entered by different persons from the same address will be considered as one flock or herd.
4. **ENTRY FEES:** Except as may be specifically defined in individual department rules, entry fees shall be a minimum fee of \$1.00 or ten percent (10%) of the first premium money offered, whichever is applicable in class and lot that the exhibit is entered for each exhibit. Except as may be specifically defined in each special department rules, all livestock entries must be received by the Kitsap County Fair Office on or before August 1<sup>st</sup>. Entry and exhibitor's pass fees must be paid at the time entries are submitted. All entry fee checks and/or money orders must be made payable to the Kitsap County Fair. 4-H and FFA members may enter registered animals only upon payment of entry fees and be entered by the prescribed times as heretofore set forth. 4-H and FFA exhibitors participating in Open Class competition must comply with all Open Class rules and regulations.
5. **ENTRY TIMES:** All exhibits in livestock departments of the Kitsap County Fair will be entered the following times only:
  - a. Tuesday of Fair week between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. subject, however, to complying with the health requirements and veterinary inspection with such requirements as hereinafter set forth.
  - b. In all cases of livestock exhibits, the exhibits are to be in their assigned places in the livestock barns no later than 10:00 p.m., Tuesday of Fair week.
  - c. **NO ANIMAL IS ALLOWED IN BARNs WITHOUT BEING VET CHECKED.**
6. **WITHDRAWAL TIMES:** No livestock, tack, ribbons or personal belongings may be removed from exhibit area of the Fairgrounds prior to 6:00 p.m., Sunday. All poultry and rabbit (Open Class) exhibits will remain until 6:00 p.m. Those exhibitors who are entered into another Fair on closing day of this Fair may be excused at the discretion of the Livestock Director or Assistant Livestock Director.
7. **GOLF/UTILITY CARTS:** No Golf Carts or Utility Carts are allowed anywhere on the Fairgrounds during Fair **without prior approval from a Fair Board Director or Fair Management.** Approved carts must display approval credentials at all times. Any carts without credentials will be subject to immediately removed from the Fairgrounds.

## HERDSMANSHIP REQUIREMENTS

The following requirements are compulsory for Herdsmanship in the Kitsap County Fair:

1. In all livestock departments of the Kitsap County Fair, all exhibits and stalls shall be kept constantly clean and no trash, rubbish, manure, used bedding or other debris shall be permitted to accumulate in or about any of the livestock area.
2. All livestock and animal exhibitors shall bear the responsibility of cleaning their own exhibit areas and placing all the trash, rubbish, manure, used bedding and other debris in some central place of their exhibit area in order for Fair personnel to pick up and dispose of such trash, rubbish, manure, bedding and any other debris.
3. All Herdsmanship competitors, at the conclusion of the Fair, shall pile all refuse, debris, manure and bedding in one central location of their exhibit area for Fair personnel to pick up and dispose of. The final compliance with this ruling by all competitors must be completed within 48 hours after the closing of the Fair.
4. Failure to comply with Herdsmanship requirements may result in the forfeiture of any premium that may be offered.

5. The Herdsmanship scorecard for beef, dairy cattle, goat, swine and sheep shall be as follows:

Educates and promotes the industry 40 pts

Does the exhibit educate and provide an attractive presentation to draw people into the barn? Is the information displayed or available that will provide the public with facts about the farm and breed(s) of animals on exhibit? Does the display educate the public about the livestock industry? In general, is the information provided informative, creative, and original, with a clearly defined theme?

Demonstrates pride in one's farm 30 pts

Is there a farm sign present and clearly visible so a visitor can identify certain animals as belonging to a particular farm? Is there information displayed or available that will provide the public with facts about the farm and the breed(s) being raised? Are stall cards complete and in place?

General Attractiveness of Area 20 pts

Has the Exhibitor made an effort to make his/her area attractive? Are the public access aisles free of shavings and/or straw? Are pens free of obvious fecal matter; water buckets free of straw and adequately filled; tack and equipment neatly stored; area generally uncluttered? Are the animals clean and well groomed?

Exhibitor Appearance, Attitude, & Availability 10 pts

Is the exhibitor neat, friendly, and available to answer questions? Does the exhibitor respond to the public in a positive manner?

TOTAL AVAILABLE POINTS 100 pts

Cash Award will be awarded only if worthy.

**HEALTH REQUIREMENTS AND VETERINARY INSPECTIONS**

**OPEN CLASS, 4-H AND FFA LIVESTOCK**

- All Fairs are required to provide veterinary personnel for the purpose of examining all health certificates and to give visual inspection to all classes of livestock as is required. Authorized Fair Veterinarians will examine all livestock exhibits only during the hours of 10:00 a.m. – 9 p.m. on Tuesday of Fair week.
- If a Fair veterinarian rules that an animal may not enter the Fair because of disease or any other reason, (s)he shall advise the official Fair Board Livestock Director or his/her assistant or the Fair Managers and, in turn, the Exhibitor shall be so advised and the animal shall be immediately removed from the Kitsap County Fairgrounds and shall not be allowed to return under any circumstances to the Kitsap County Fairgrounds during the current Fair. In all cases, the decisions of the Fair Veterinarian shall be final.

- If any Exhibitor's livestock and/or animal become sick or diseased after they are in their exhibit areas of the Kitsap County Fairgrounds and veterinarian services are required, any veterinarian services that may be required and any monetary remuneration payable for the same shall be solely the responsibility of the Exhibitor and such expenses shall be borne by the Exhibitor.
- Individual or herd health certificates and proof of vaccination are strongly recommended for entry. The Fair veterinarian shall issue a blanket health certificate covering all animal entries to the Fair.
- No animal from quarantined area or premises will be permitted to enter the Fair/show.
- All out-of-state animal entries must comply with State of Washington import regulations.
- All out-of-state horses must have a negative Coggins test within six months.
- Fair veterinarians will inspect all classes of livestock and poultry (including horses, pen animals, rabbits, fur-bearing animals, pigeons, ducks, geese and turkeys) before they are exhibited, to determine that the livestock and poultry show no clinical indications of contagious, infectious disease and ectoparasites.
- Fair veterinarian must and will reject any animal with infectious or contagious disease or ectoparasites. Exhibitors should be aware that ringworm, warts, pinkeye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks, fleas, abscesses and sore mouth fall into these categories.
- Those animals exhibiting disease symptoms during the course of the Fair shall also be rejected by the Fair veterinarian.
- It is strongly recommended that all animals be vaccinated in the current show year. It is recommended these vaccinations be given at least 4 weeks before Fair. The following vaccinations are recommended:
 

Dogs	Distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis yearly and rabies vaccination every two years
Cats/Feline	Distemper vaccination and rabies vaccination yearly
Cattle	A respiratory complex vaccine four weeks prior to Fair
Horses	Tetanus toxoid, influenza, Eastern and Western Encephalomyelitis, a mixed bacterin injection are advised yearly.
- Entry permits are required for all out-of-state animals.

## SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Kitsap County Fair.
2. Substitutes may be made if done so prior to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday before Fair. Superintendent must approve substitutes.
3. All cattle are to be registered or registration applied for.
4. In group classes of the Cattle Department, all animals kept on the same farm and owned by different members of the same family will be considered as one exhibit and the family unit as one Exhibitor. Exhibitor is not required to be breeder of animals shown in-group classes.
5. Entry fee is 10% of the top premium in class.
6. It is recommended that cattle have a respiratory complex vaccine at least four weeks prior to Fair.
7. All Bulls over one (1) year of age must be shown with a nose lead.
8. All Cattle must be double tied while in stalls.
9. Herdsmanship is required.
10. Livestock entries must be received by the Fair office no later than August 1<sup>st</sup>.

## SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES

- In accordance with state law, all goats will be checked for scrapie identification upon entry. No goats will be accepted without I.D.
- Removal of any exhibit, prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the exhibitor. Further, exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Kitsap County Fair.
- All exhibitors must comply with general rules and open class live stock rules and regulations as printed and approved by the Board of Directors and the Managers of the Kitsap County Fair.
- ADGA, NPGA, and IBGA rules shall govern.
- An entry fee of \$1.70 will be charged for each animal entered in this department. Entry forms with payment need to be in the Fair office by August 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Only two (2) entries may be entered in each lot per exhibitor. The farm or family must be the registered owner of the animal being shown.
- Superintendent may accept or limit entries as space permits to make an equally balanced show by breed.
- Only those animals entered and shown in the Open Class division will be allowed in the Open Class area.
- There will be a pre-show milk-out after 6:00 p.m.
- Herdsmanship is required. Cash awards will be as follows:

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2. All exhibitors must comply with general rules and open class livestock rules and regulations as printed and approved by the Board of Directors and the Managers of the Kitsap County Fair.

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2. See General Health Requirements.
3. Entries close August 1<sup>st</sup> or earlier if cages are filled. Entries will be accepted on the basis of first come, first served, and on the basis of space available.
4. Entry fees are:  
\$0.50 singles \$0.50 eggs  
\$0.75 pairs \$1.00 trios (1 Male, 2 Female)
5. Entry forms must be received by the Fair office no later than August 1<sup>st</sup>. Late entries will be assessed a \$1.00 late fee per entry, unless the late fee has been waived by the Open Class Superintendent.
6. Birds must be entered and caged by 9:00 p.m., Tuesday prior to Fair. All exhibitors must sign a waiver that their birds are free from having or being exposed to any disease prior to vet check.
7. Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning their own cages, feeding and watering their birds DAILY before 9:00 a.m. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the exhibitor.
8. During the Fair, each exhibitor will do 1 hour of Barn Duty on 3 different days. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges.
9. Birds may not be removed from the exhibit area until 6:00 p.m., Sunday of Fair, without permission of the Fair Livestock Director. Superintendent(s) must be notified prior to bird removal. Failure to clean up pen area will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the exhibitor.
10. Judging will take place when the Poultry Judge arrives, usually within a couple of days after Fair starts. The decisions of the judge(s) are final and not open for debate.
11. Distribution of ribbons & rosettes are at the discretion of the judge(s) & Superintendent(s) and are based on the number of entries and the quality of the exhibit(s).
12. All birds must have legs bands for identification.
13. Band, division, and lot must be shown on entry forms. Breed and variety must be listed in the description.
14. Birds that are shown must be picked up w/in 2 hours after closing the Poultry Barn(s), Sunday of Fair.
15. The Fair will have feed available for exhibitors.
16. 4-H or FFA exhibit cannot be exhibited in Open Class.

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2. All health requirements will be strictly enforced.
3. Total entries will be limited to 500 rabbits due to space restrictions, as well as State Regulations.
4. Entry deadline for Open show is August 15<sup>th</sup> or earlier. Entries will be accepted on the basis of first come, first served and will be accepted on the basis of space available.
5. All entries must be permanently earmarked.
6. This show will be judged, operated and sanctioned in accordance with ARBA rules and standards.
7. Rabbits will be released following judging on Wednesday for day show entries.
8. Judging will be as near 9:00 a.m. as possible.
9. Where there is no competition, the judge may, in his/her judgment, award 2<sup>nd</sup> premium in place of 1<sup>st</sup>.
10. No doe and litter accepted for entry.

1. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the exhibitor. Further, exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Kitsap County Fair.
2. Fleece entries must be entered on a regular livestock entry form. Send entries and fee to Fair office prior to August 1<sup>st</sup>.
3. Entry fee is \$1.00 per fleece entered.
4. Fleece must be from animal owned by consignor.
5. All entries must be from the current year or fall of the previous year's clip and represent not more than 12 months growth. Lamb fleeces must be so noted on the entry form. (Lamb is seven months or less).
6. Limit of two entries per lot per class.
7. Fleeces may be tied with paper twine or not tied, as desired. Place in a large, clear unmarked plastic bag for transporting.
8. Commercial classes will be judged according to commercial value/yield in the commercial market. White crossbred fleeces may be entered in the commercial classes only and are not eligible for breed type.
9. Breed classes will be judged according to their respective breed standards. Where there is only one exhibitor, the fleece(s) will be entered in Lot 14 or 15 as appropriate. If there is more than one exhibitor for a breed not listed, a Lot will be created.
10. Natural colored fleeces will be entered according to grade. If entered incorrectly, the Superintendent will have the authority to place it in the correct class. All natural colored entries will be judged as hand-spinning fleeces.
11. Where there is no competition, or where there are fewer entries in a class than number of premiums offered, the judge may, at his/her discretion, award premium or premiums of such grade as the exhibit deserves. The decision of the judge will be final.

The purpose of this activity is to promote the sheep industry by presenting an attractively modeled wool garment with a well-groomed sheep in a manner to give spectators the opportunity to see wool in both its beautiful forms, on the hoof, and in the completed garment.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entry forms will be available at the wool display in the Sheep barn and must be returned by 4:00 p.m. on event day.
2. Sheep must be ewe lambs, yearling ewes, or aged ewes and must be conditioned, fitted, and trained to show on a halter. The sheep must have been shown in her appropriate class in the Open Sheep Show, 4-H Show, or FFA Show and may be shown only once in the Lads and Ladies Lead Class. Only the participant will handle the sheep (Exception: Minimum assistance may be provided for participants age 6 and under).
3. Entrants must wear a garment of not less than 70% wool.
4. Entries shall include a description of the garment to be worn, the background of the contestant, and the breed of sheep. This description will be read aloud as written while the contestant and his/her animal promenade the ring.
5. Entrants will be judged on the garment and its appearance, the appearance of the sheep, and the coordination in handling between the two. Remember, you are promoting wool and the sheep industry to the public.
6. A name sign may be attached to the exhibit, no larger than 12 x 18 inches.
7. Fair Staff will do the judging. There will also be a People's Choice award. Vote for your favorite at the Horticulture Department in Presidents' Hall.
8. The Fair Staff reserves the right to disqualify an entry deemed inappropriate for a family fair.
