## Fatality Accident Victims Identified

**Port Orchard, Wash.** -- The identities of two persons killed in a motor vehicle accident last night have been made available for release. The collision occurred around 11:10 p.m. at the intersection of Bethel Road, SE, and SE Cedar Road, in South Kitsap.

- **Sylvia Marie Adams**, age 23, of Bremerton. Adams was the driver of a maroon-colored 1991 Honda Civic 4-door car that was traveling southbound on Bethel Road. Adams was airlifted to Harborview Medical Center, Seattle, where she died as a result of injuries sustained in the collision.
- **Jeremiah David Enderud**, age 25, of South Kitsap, died at the scene of the collision. He was a rear-seat passenger in the Honda Civic, seated directly behind Adams.
- A second passenger in the Honda, a 31 year-old Bremerton man, was also airlifted to Harborview Medical Center with critical injuries. His identity has not been released.

The driver of a blue-colored, 1990 Toyota Corolla 4-door, traveling westbound on Cedar Road, apparently failed to yield at a stop sign at the intersection and struck the Honda Civic on the driver's side.

The driver of the Toyota, a 19 year-old male from South Kitsap, was airlifted to Harborview Medical Center with serious injuries. The two other passengers, both from South Kitsap, were an 18 year-old man and a 16 year-old girl. The man was transported to Harrison Memorial Hospital (ER), Bremerton, for treatment of less serious injuries. The teenage girl was released at the scene to her parents. The identities of the occupants of the Toyota Corolla have not been made public.

All occupants of the two vehicles were wearing seatbelts.

Deputies from the Sheriff's Office Traffic Division continue their investigation, to include whether or not excessive vehicle speed, or the use of alcoholic intoxicants/narcotic substances, were factors in the cause of the accident.
