












Folding Instructions

1. Cut out the game along the outer solid lines.
2. With the printed side down, fold each corner to the center point (crease on dotted lines).
3. Turn the folded paper over so the dark squares are facing away from you. Then, once again, fold each corner to the center.
4. Fold the square in half, and then in half again, to make creases.
5. Using two hands, place thumbs and index fingers under the dark flaps.
6. Push toward the center until a pyramid shape forms.

How to Play

- This game is for two players. Put the game on your hands and ask your friend to pick one of the dark squares, for example. "KITSAP." Open and close the game in an alternating direction for each letter of the word: K-I-T-S-A-P.
- Read the question closest to the word your friend chose and let them guess the answer. Lift the flap to find the correct answer. Now give the game to your friend and it's your turn to guess.
- Try to answer all the questions...everyone wins by learning about recycling!
